Like prudent desert maneuvers through the years, the Tri-5 Revolution's recent advance to Yuma, Arizona was preceded by a well thought-out plan. In ones and twos, with a total of six classic Chevy's, they would converge at the I-8 view point just south of Alpine on Thursday morning, March 1. In a caravan they would head out for El Cajon to be joined by more of their force, strengthen their resolve with lunch, and continue on to Midnight at the Oasis where they'd await reinforcements. Two additional cars, bringing four more revolutionaries, would join the desert encampment late that evening. By morning they would total 17 revolutionaries and 9 classic vehicles.

Linda and Wayne, Lynn and Sandy, Nancy and Rod, Ava and Bob, Bob Brown and Ann and Harvey met under threatening skies that Thursday morning to begin the trek to Yuma, not quite with military precision, but a good looking group. Luck was with them, weather and classics cooperated: rain was limited to a few sprinkles; the only snow was in shaded pockets by the side of the road; a dramatic fog bank near Crestwood Summit broke to brilliant sun; wind gusts, though strong, were at the expected places; Wayne was able to avoid the stray dog crossing his path on the freeway; Rod was able to avoid the truck that tried to cut him off, and none of our cars experienced mechanical problems.

With twenty years experience, Caballeros de Yuma hosts an exceptionally well organized event: car show; poker/fun run; cruise/parade; a total of three meals over three days; Friday and Saturday night concerts; a variety of vendors -- including a popular favorite, the Boy Scouts delicious cooked-in-a-cast-iron-Dutch oven-over-an-open-fire peach cobbler, perfectly complimented by the ice cream sold at the neighboring booth. Additionally, they benefit from strong community support, reinforced by Caballero's unique profit sharing plan. Volunteer hours are tracked and monies, an estimated \$50,000 in 2012, distributed accordingly.

Even with 934 pre-registered vehicles, picking up our show documents was relatively quick, in part due to our taking advantage of the special Group Registration line for the first time. Strong desert winds provided an interesting challenge. Cars clean the night before were dirty, inside and out, by morning, and the layer of dust got progressively worse throughout the day. Registration sheets stapled to our stakes marking our spots, needed to be further. Scrounging found a few rubber bands supplemented, thanks to Ava's dentist, with dental floss securing the sheets from the wind.

All car shows come down to one big day. At MATO is all about Saturday, the day of Show 'N Shine, judging, lots of spectators, and, another evening concert, this year bringing Grassroots and Paul Revere and the Raiders to Yuma. Each of our vehicles got one last dust off; the easy-up was put in place; the T5R banner hoisted; chairs unfolded and we hunkered in for a very enjoyable day.

Though the judging powers-that-be did not shine upon any of our classics this year, we still had our victories. Our little revolutionary band once again scored two "wins" announced at Sunday's brunch and awards ceremony. The Geiman's full house scored second highest hand in the poker run letting Nancy take possession of five additional raffle tickets for the very appealing red Mustang. And, Linda won \$100 in the raffle as the first ticket drawn. Previously, the first raffle ticket drawn won the car. Unfortunately, this year the Caballeros changed the order of prizes. Linda sure would have looked cute in that red Mustang!

Back home, we're already anticipating MATO 2013. Looking forward to seeing you at the Oasis again next year!






