The young man shrugs: 'Sir, I believe she's filing her fingernails.'

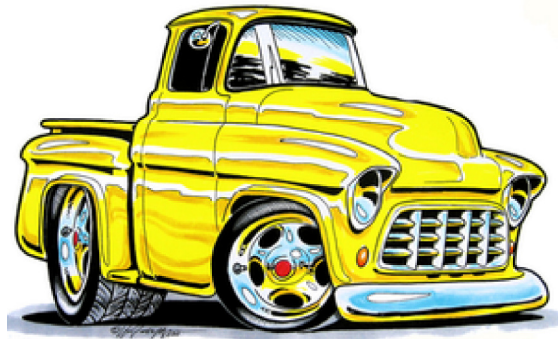
Now, the trooper is totally confused. A young couple, alone, in a car, at night in a lover's lane and nothing obscene is happening!

The young man says: 'I'm 22, sir.'

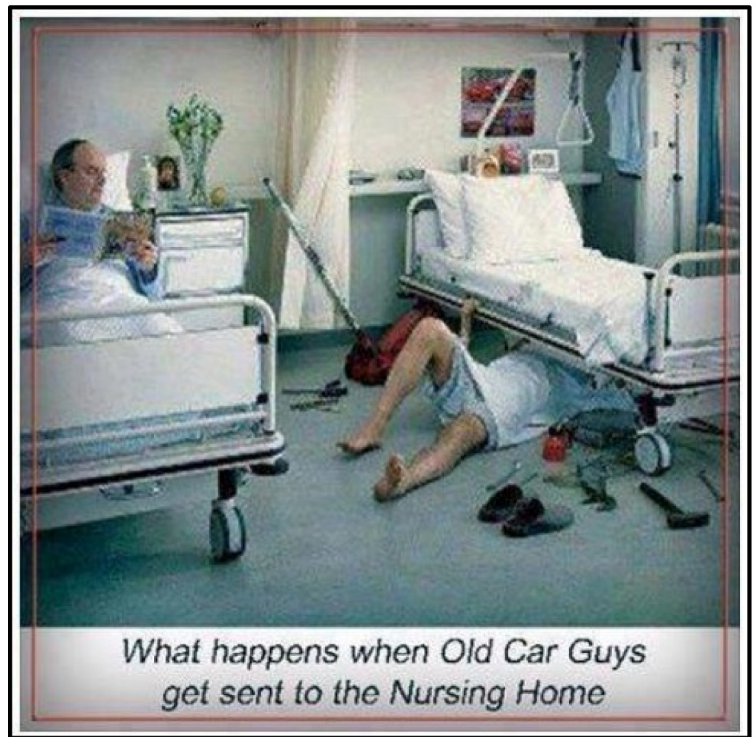
The trooper asks: 'And her, what's her age?'

# The Kitchen Scoop

## on 1955 Food Faves

Wonderfully styled Chevy's weren't the only lasting innovation of the tri-5 years. Things were changing radically on the food stage, too. 1955 brought us the first McDonald's franchise when Ray Kroc purchased a hamburger restaurant from the McDonald brothers in Des Plaines, Illinois. That same year the first Waffle House opened in

the Atlanta suburb of Avondale Estates, Georgia and the Campbell Soup test kitchen published the recipe for Green Bean Bake, still a staple on many holiday tables. In the grocery, the cereal aisle now contained Quaker Oats Instant Oatmeal \ and Kellogg's Special K was touted as a "healthy" breakfast choice as it contained only 4.5% sugar. Prefer a hot breakfast? A magazine ad for Log Cabin Syrup introduced a recipe for soon-to-be forgotten Bread-n-Butter Waffles:

### Bread-n-Butter Waffles

Butter

2 eggs

1 cup milk

1 teaspoon sugar

Dash of salt

6-8 slices bread

Melt butter. Mix butter, eggs, milk, sugar and salt.

Dip bread in mixture and bake on a moderately hot waffle iron until golden.



Entertaining? Favorite "munchies" for party passing included kabobs of skewered canned fruit tidbits, almost anything wrapped in bacon and Chex Party Mix, the make-it-yourself original version, not the stuff we can purchase by the bag today.



### Chex Party Mix

3 cups each Corn, Rice and Wheat Chex

1 cup each mixed nuts and bite-size pretzel pieces

6 Tablespoons butter or margarine

2 Tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce

1-½ teaspoon seasoned salt

¾ teaspoon garlic powder

½ teaspoon onion powder

Mix cereals, nuts, and pretzel pieces. Coat with melted butter in which you've mixed the Worcestershire Sauce and seasonings. Make in a moderate oven 5-6 minutes, stirring every 2 minutes. Cool and drain on paper towels. Store in an airtight container.

When entertaining, mid-'50's homemakers were not beyond putting on airs when it was time for dessert. Suddenly comforting pies and cakes were sometime replaced with a more spectacular option, Baked Alaska!

## **Baked Alaska**

1 package pound cake or layer cake mix  
1 pint strawberry ice cream, slightly softened  
1 pint chocolate or other flavored ice cream, slightly softened  
3 egg whites, room temperature  
1/8 teaspoon cream of tartar  
6 Tablespoons sugar



Prepare cake mix following package directions and bake in 8" or 9" layer pans. Cool cake and set aside, reserving one layer for another use.

Line a bowl the same diameter of the cake pan with sheet of waxed paper. Spread ice creams in two even layer in bowl; freeze until firm.

Place cake layer on sheet of aluminum foil. Unmold frozen ice cream on top of cake; peel off paper. Wrap ice-cream cake in the foil and freeze until needed.

Recipe can be made to this point up to 2 weeks before use.

About 25 minute before serving:

Preheat oven to 500 degrees. For meringue: In small bowl, with mixer on high speed, beat egg whites and cream of tartar until soft peaks form; beating at high speed, gradually sprinkle in sugar, 2 Tablespoons at a time. Beat until sugar is completely dissolved. Whites should stand in stiff peaks.

Unwrap ice-cream cake and place on a chilled cookie sheet. Quickly spread meringue over entire surface being careful to seal meringue to cookie sheet. Bake 3 minutes or until meringue is slightly browned and golden. Slip 2 pancake turners under the dessert and carefully transfer to a chilled platter. Serve immediately, slicing at the table.

Make 8-10 servings

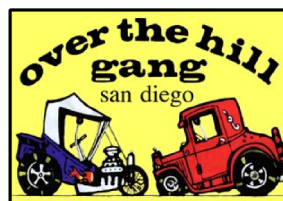

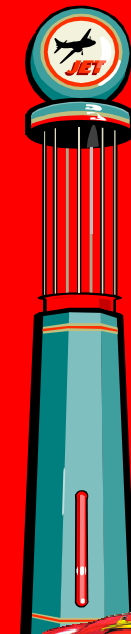

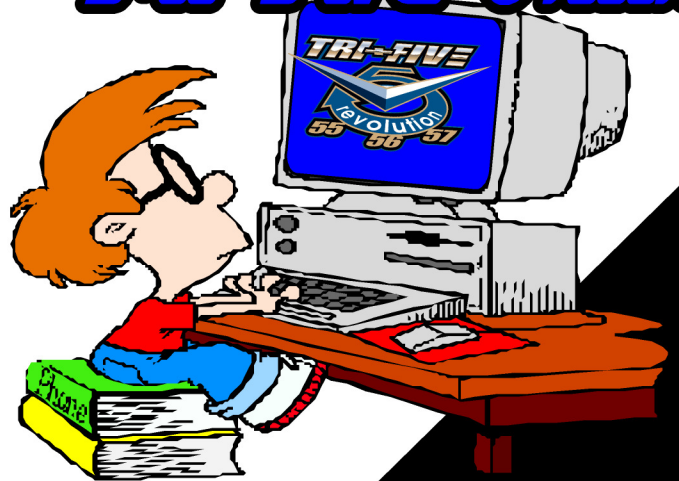
