## The Road to MATO 2015 The Thursday Morning Caravan By Ann Goldberg



#### THE WONDERS OF THE CUCUMBER

Even as a child I was a fan of Angle Food Cake. This is a rather surprising fact since my family didn't serve it either frosted or glazed. The big attraction, it came topped with a dollop of whipped cream! Heavenly. As an adult, I've continued my adoration.

Not that I've ever made a homemade Angel Food cake. It's always been "from the box" for me. Back when our Tri-5's were new, Angel Food cake mix was still relatively new to the market. In the early 50's the mix came in two different sizes, 14 egg for a large cake, 8 egg for a more modestly sized dessert. Lots of home bakers still used "from scratch" recipes handed down from generations. 12 eggs, just 3/4 cups sugar. Compared to other baked desserts, 1-1/2 cups sugar in carrot cake; 1-1/3 cups sugar plus cream cheese and heavy cream in cheesecake, Angel Food cake seems almost healthy.

Perhaps that "healthy" aspect led me to try versions a bit more decadent. Here are a couple of tricks I think you'll enjoy whether you make the cake yourself, bake it from a mix or use a "store bought" cake as the basis for your dessert.

#### Cherry Cream Angle Food Cake

Once cake is cool, cut a 3/4-inch slice from the top of the cake. Leaving a 3/4-inch shell on the sides and bottom of the cake, carefully remove the interior. This won't be used for the dessert — feel free to nibble on it, serve on another occasion with a scoop of ice cream or come up with your own idea. It would just be a shame to toss it out. It is Angel Food cake after all.

Mix one can 21-ounce can of cherry pie filling with one thawed 8-ounce container of whipped topping. Fill cake with this mixture. Replace top slice. If desired, frost the cake with additional whipped topping.

#### Strawberry Cream Angel Food Cake

Same process. There's a pattern here. Just replace the pie filling with sliced fresh strawberries.



Ice Cream or Gelato Filled Angel Food Cake Same initial steps again. This time fill the cake's cavity with your favorite flavor ice cream or gelato. Wrap cake and freeze for at least a few hours before use. Garnish with whipped cream at serving. I recently made this for a friend's birthday filling with black raspberry chocolate chip gelato. Can you say delicious? Wow! Whichever version you choose, enjoy!






