One of the best things about this show is that it is only three hours long and awards were scheduled to be announced at 11:45. There were twelve awards and they were tall heavy glass mugs with the award information etched on the side and filled with red crinkled paper. There were three winners in our T5R group. 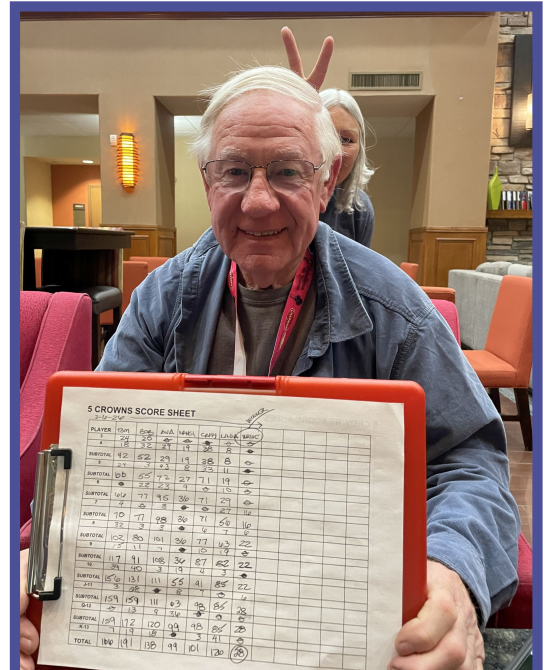

San Marcos High School Motors For Music 2026

San Marcos High School held their eleventh annual "Motors for Music" car show on March 15th this year. This show raises monies in support of their award-winning marching band, Knight Regiment and the SMHS Color Guard. This show is always held in the huge San Marcos High School parking lot under the solar panels. This year, there were only two Tri-Five Revolution cars attending. Jerry & Cappy Taylor came in their orange and silver '56 Belair hardtop and Linda & I came in our black & silver '55 Chevrolet convertible. In previous years, the entries were allowed to drive in and park and then go to the registration booth to get their tee-shirt and window placard. For some reason, this year they decided to check registration and pass out the goody bags on every car as they entered the show. They were so slow letting vehicles enter that there were three lines of cars out to the street. It took almost 40 minutes for us to get from the street to our space. All that and we still had to go to the registration booth to get our tee-shirt and placard. To say people were not happy about this was an understatement. Perhaps they will have a better plan next year.

There was no rain in the forecast this year and it was a beautiful sunny day, perfect for a car show. We set up our chairs and did a little car detailing. By the time we picked up our window placard and got back to the car, the judges were already busy looking at cars. The judge for the Hot Rod/Custom category cars was already eyeing our convertible and appeared to be very interested in it, spending almost 10 minutes on it.

This year's show included 308 cars, 23 corporate donors, 35 Maker Marketplace booths, three food vendors, and three student bands, plus a color guard that drove from their Vegas competition that morning to be there for the checkered flag send-off. Just as we got parked, forty cars from the Shafters/Drifters car clubs came in and parked all around us.

There was a raffle, but there were only three items in the drawing. Raffle drawings were at 9:30, 10:30 & 11:30. In reality, it wasn't much of a raffle. There was a silent auction for several custom made trophies.

The San Diego Padre trophy brought in \$175, while the Dodger trophy only brought in \$110. There were also six Door Prize trophies that were randomly drawn. No one we know won any of those.



Awards were to be announced at 12:10, but as usual, they were a little late. As in the past, all the awards were hand built one of a kind trophies made from metal engine, transmission and other steel parts. Our convertible was awarded the "Best Hot Rod" award which included custom built cars.

This show was very successful, raising over \$22,000 for the Band and Color Guards programs. This is always a nice show, and it supports a very good cause. They have already advised for 2027 there will be a "no-stop" load-in process for all pre-registered vehicles once the gates open. Come join us next year! You'll love it!

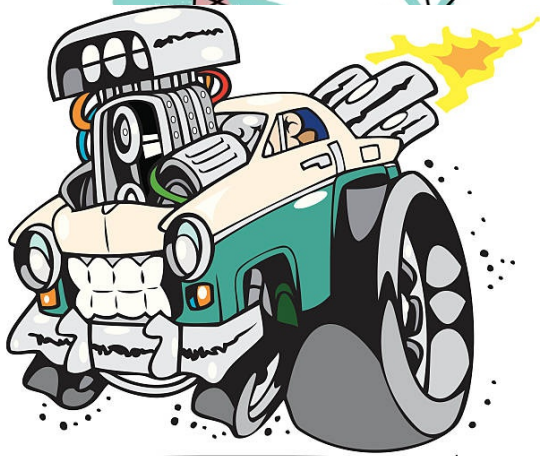

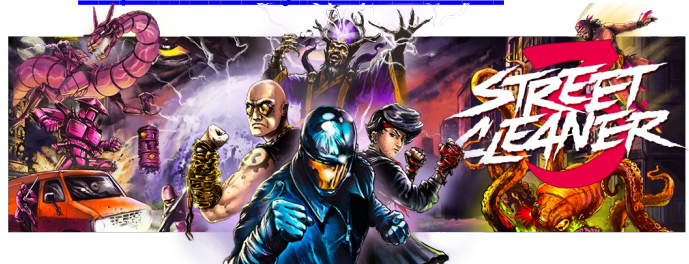
