Back when our Tri-5's were new, lemonade was a simple pleasure. The best of each summer came from my Grandmother's kitchen, enjoyed by the family gathered in her backyard for our annual picnic and served from a cut glass pitcher crafted by her husband's grandfather.

I clearly remember Mim pushing the back screen door open with her shoulder and coming down the steps, pitcher in hand, silver curls pinned in place, wearing a "good" day dress and her beige canvas "summer" lace-up heeled shoes. We'd all be gathered in the shade of the tall blue spruce, seated at long tables on folding chairs borrowed by Grandpa Bert from the Presbyterian Church downtown and picked up in their 1955 blue 2-door 210.

In those days lemonade was simply freshly squeezed lemon juice, sugar and water mixed in a pitcher with ice cubes added. Today there are numerous variations:

- Dissolve the sugar in hot water then cool the mixture before proceeding (Paul Deen).
- Add grated lemon peel when making a simple syrup as the base of your lemonade (Emeril Lagasse).
- Sweeten your simply syrup with a combination of honey and sugar and steep with the ```seeds scraped from a vanilla bean (Rachel Ray).
- Add a pinch of salt to enhance the flavor.
- Replace still water with carbonated.

Whichever method you choose, don't let the summer pass by without letting yourself enjoy at least one glass of tart-sweet lemonade on a sunny day.
