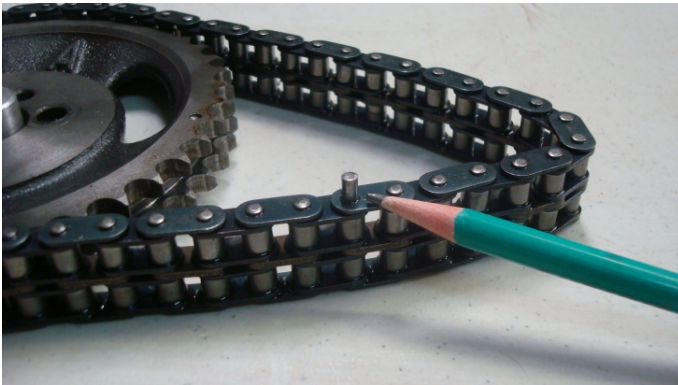
DONATING SURPLUS STUFF

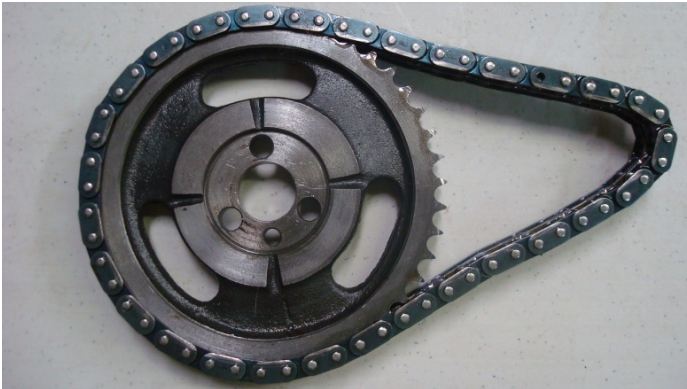


A broken timing chain!

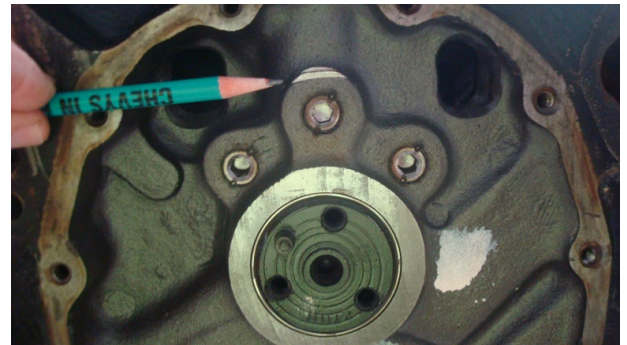
What was it hitting?



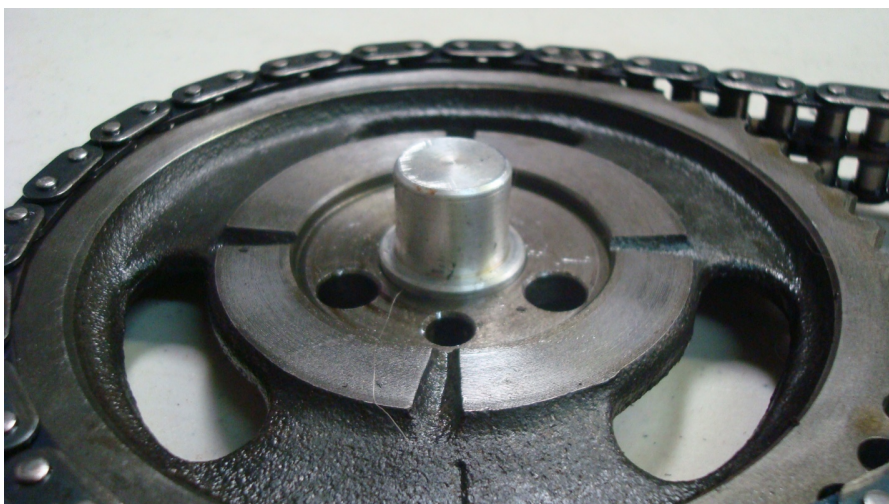
When I checked the other side of the chain, it showed scraping all around the inside of the chain. What?

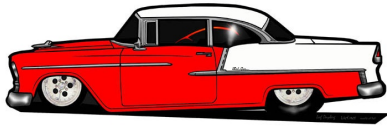

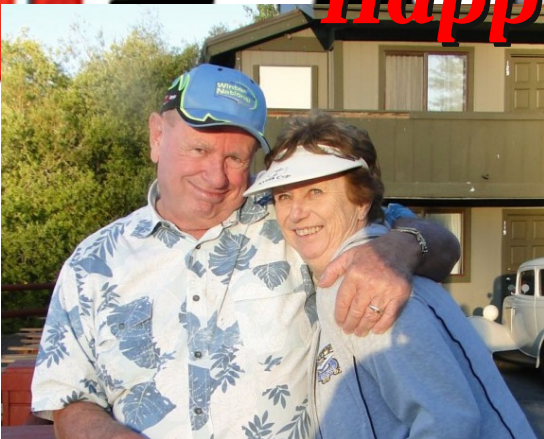
