Brothers 21st Annual Chevy & GMC Truck Show 'N Shine

I know we are a Tri-Five Chevy Club and most of us are not too involved in trucks. However, since Linda has her

'69 Chevrolet C-20 pickup and now that its just about ready to hit the road, we do pay attention to truck events. Brothers Truck Parts in Corona sells replacement parts of all kinds for Chevy & GMC trucks from 1947 through 1987 and has been putting on a truck

show and shine for 21 years and it's open only to 1947 through 1987 Chevrolet and GMC Trucks, Blazers and Suburbans. In the past, this event has drawn over 900 vehicles. However, this year Brothers had to move the event to a new location, Lake Irvine, and the venue had to be limited to 650 entrants, all pre-registered, no day of show entrants. The show was on July 7 this year and we decided to go see the show.



We arrived in our Nissan Altima around 9 am and were directed to the public parking area to pay our \$10 parking fee and then to the parking lot, which was nothing more than a big dirt & gravel field. From there it was a short walk to the entrance gate of the show. Once inside there were classic Chevy & GMC pickups as far as the eye could see.



We did not know the layout, so we decided to just start looking on the first row. We were not sure what we expected to see in the way of vehicles, but for the most part, they looked like daily drivers and work trucks with lots of wear & tear, and dings & dents and well worn paint. Most were not pristine well-restored vehicles you see at most car shows. Many of the ones which were unrestored did have shiny custom wheels and tires and/or late model fuel injected engines. A couple trucks were custom made late '69 to '72 crew cabs on a newer truck chassis. They looked great, like they could have rolled off the assembly line at General Motors and its too bad Chevrolet didn't actually produce them this way back then. Linda wants one.

In the center of the show area by the lake were some vendors, the raffle booth and numerous food trucks from which you could get a variety of foods and drinks. The vendors had a variety of trucks parts and other items you generally see at car shows like hats and t-shirts. The raffle was quite large with approximately 300 prizes up for grabs. We bought 100 tickets and then went on our way to see more trucks. After covering a little more than half the vehicles on display, we went looking for food. We decided on a breakfast sandwich and a breakfast burrito, which was quite good. We listened to a live band while we ate, and then we went on to look at more trucks.

At 11 am, it was time for the first of two raffle draws. We carefully checked our numbers and we each had one winner. Wayne won a hat and a t-shirt and Linda won a custom steering wheel adapter. Interesting, but not too exciting. Well, on to see more trucks. In the back corner there were some bigger Chevy trucks on display that were incredibly well done. Clearly, money was not an issue for the builders of these, as they were nearly perfect in every way. Of all of the vehicles on display, there was about 50 that we would consider good show quality, but it was definitely fun to see so many trucks in one place, regardless of their condition.





NorthWest Deuce Days

Victoria, B.C., Canada 13-25 July

On 13 July I departed for Canada in my 32 deuce coupe. First day of travel was pretty short as I joined up in Ridgecrest with Paul Bundy & his 32 highboy roadster from Peoria, AZ. Ridgecrest, CA, the near epicenter of many recent quakes. In fact, as Paul and I were eating dinner that evening, a 3.5+ tremor hit, or rather just sort of rolled through, literally lifting Paul and I right out of our seats.

Day 2 we joined up with Bob Mohler & his friend Gerry in Bishop. Bob has a 32 Phaeton and hails from Yucca Valley. After join-up, it was a fairly uneventful drive to Susanville except for a major brush fire about 40 miles south of Susanville. They closed Hwy 395 for about an hour so that gave us the opportunity to watch a great air show of numerous dive bombers hitting the fire with huge payloads of fire retardant.



Day 3 was a drive to Madras, OR, with a short detour to Crater Lake for a photo op:





Day 4 was our first snag. Bob Mohler lost his gas cap and needed to go to a custom shop in Portland to find a replacement, so he and Gerry split off to take a short cut to Portland. Paul & I decided to take the more scenic route up to The Dalles on the Columbia River and then follow the Columbia west to Portland. Here's a shot with Mt Hood in the background:

We reformed our group that evening at our hotel in Port Angeles, and the next morning we were pretty much first in line waiting for the ferry across Puget Sound to Victoria. It's hard to make out in the photo, but the cars are covered with our first rain of the trip.



We were in line before 0600 & the ferry's scheduled departure was 0730. The ferry takes about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours to make the 21 miles across the Sound, giving us plenty of time to grab another cup of coffee and a bit of breakfast. The rest of the day was spent checking in to the hotel, checking in at the Deuce Days Registry desk to get our goody bags, and finally, cleaning the cars a bit for the weekend.

Thursday morning was spent watching about 120 32 Fords off-load from the ferry while quenching our thirst. As you can see, there were plenty of folks on hand to welcome them:





Friday morning Paul and I explored the west side of Vancouver Island on a driving tour through Sooke and up to Jordan River while Bob & Gerry did a walking tour of downtown Victoria. Later that evening I hit my first snag in the trip. Back at the hotel garage, I went to pull the key from the ignition and it was hot as blazes. A quick check of all the wiring revealed no probs so it was pretty obvious the ignition switch was toast. After disconnecting the battery, Paul gave me a ride to LordCo, the Canadian FLAPS (Friendly Local Auto Parts Store, i.e., Canada's version of our Autozone/Pep Boys/O'Reillys, etc) and I got an exact replacement switch; same manufacturer, same model number, in fact, it was so exact my old key still fit the new switch. It was a hassle putting in the new switch, but soon all was well again.

Saturday morning was the huge poker run with more than 500 hot rods lined up to do the run:





They started the first cars out at 0900 and my line of cars didn't exit the lot until 1020. It was literally a sea of cars. My poker hand bombed with something like a Chula Vista Straight (you can't do worse!), but all was not lost. At the end of the run we met at this couple's huge ranch for a great BBQ lunch

Sunday was the huge car show with more than 1300 hot rods lining the bay front streets of Victoria, and many other non-registered cars filling the back streets. We rolled in at 0500 and were late! Almost everyone was already parked.







These 3 photos where shot about noon so you can see we had huge crowds visiting the show. I'm sure they numbered in the tens of thousands throughout most of the day.

The show ended at 3:00 pm and we hung around for an hour or so just to watch everyone leave. From this point we lined up for the ferry back to Port Angeles and spent Sunday night back in the States.

There were more than 40 outstanding 32's in this one building. He has another similar building to house his 33/34/and other non 32 cars. Simply outstanding.

That was the end of the tour as far as our little group was concerned. Paul headed off to John's fabrication shop to get a broken tailpipe hanger repaired and I headed south down ugly Hwy 99 and miserable I-5 to battle LA traffic in the heat of the day. I got home shortly after 4:00 pm, and was glad to close the garage door on another road trip.

And an easy appetizer to go with the shots! Because bacon goes with everything!!

SWEET BACON CRACKERS

36 Keebler Club® Crackers

12 slices bacon, cut into thirds

3/4 cup packed light brown sugar

Preheat the oven to 250 degrees F (120 degrees C). Line two rimmed cookie sheets with aluminum foil.

Arrange crackers on the prepared cookie sheets in a single layer. Place a piece of bacon on top of each cracker, then put about a teaspoon of brown sugar on top of the bacon. Bake in the preheated oven until bacon is browned and crackers and bacon are glazed, about 45 minutes. Drain on paper towels before serving.

5 limes


1 (3 ounce) package watermelon-flavored gelatin mix


