





The Mopar Club of San Diego held their annual All American Car Show again this year, however the show was in July instead of September. It was held at Embarcadero Park North at Seaport Village instead of the Skyline Church in La Mesa, which is a much more desirable location for a car show. All proceeds still benefit the San Diego military, including Wounded Warrior Homes and Fleet Week San Diego.

We arrived just before 8 am in our convertible along with the Geiman's in their blue flamed '55 Hardtop. It was a very nice cool day with overcast skies until after noon and a nice sea breeze most

of the time. Last year's show attracted around 100 entries. With this location, there were about 330 entries, making for a much better show and I suspect a lot more money for their charities. There were a few vendors, a nice size raffle, a 50/50, a DJ playing tunes all day, and a lot of eye candy, especially if you like muscle cars. I saw a lot of cars that I haven't seen at every other show in the San Diego area. In addition to the Mopar club member cars, there were quite a few other Mopar entries along with a bunch of Chevelles and Camaros. The quality of most of the cars was extremely good and I'm sure that made it difficult for the judges to pick the winners.



There were quite a few general raffle prizes as well as numerous small buckets to put tickets in for specific items, and a 50/50 raffle. It was a lucky day for Linda and me, as we won seven raffle prizes on the first draw and one more on the second draw.

We were also tasked with picking our top ten favorite cars for the people's choice awards, turning our ballots in by noon. There were numerous other awards for specific categories, and an Armed



Forces award for active duty and reserve service members. The awards were scheduled to be announced at 2:30, but they started early at 2 pm, and the show was over just before 3 pm. Quite a few people were taking the opportunity to take photos of their cars with the scenic background offered by the Embarcadero, however, everyone was told they needed to leave as the Port Authority put a strict time limit on the use of the area. The Mopar Club always puts on a really nice show, and

it was certainly well attended this time. It's a great place to spend the day on an otherwise hot summer day.

There was no entry fee, but pre-registration was still required, as the show was limited to 130 cars and trucks. The show was open to all years and makes of vehicles.

Dana Stevens with her '56 Nomad, Tom & Nancy Geiman with their '63 Chevy convertible, and Linda & me with the '55 Chevrolet convertible. Bob Brown arrived a bit later in his '57 hardtop, but his plans for the day required him to leave early. ## Fundraiser for the Garden of Innocence

On June 26th, a car show was held at El Camino Memorial Park in Sorrento Valley to raise funds for the San Diego Garden of Innocence. For many years, the Garden of Innocence has been providing dignified burials for abandon babies. Statistics say that over 7000 children are abandoned yearly in the United States. Abandoned children are placed in the indigent program per individual counties and buried in mass graves in a potter's field. We all want to stop that and to declare abandoned children the dignity of a name on the lawn to let you know that they were once here. Even if for a moment!

The Garden of Innocence is doing their best to help with the burials of these children and to recognize all the children that have not been given a dignified burial. They believe "If no one grieves, no one will remember!" San Diego is their largest garden with room for over 500 babies. Currently they do full burials in San Diego but eventually they will need to switch to cremations. But for now, they use only Caskets in the San Diego Garden of Innocence. This is why it is so important to raise funds in support of the program.

Their annual car show is a really nice event where we can enjoy a wide variety of classic vehicles and it provides for an excellent opportunity to help raise much needed funds. The show is held in the parking lot at El Camino Memorial Park. This year's show included food trucks, lots of raffle prizes, a 50/50 raffle and awards for entrants. Live music was provided by The Hot Rod Trio. Several local Lowrider clubs like "The Crowd", the "Black Lowrider Club" and the "Impala Club" graciously provided personnel to handle registration, parking, the raffle, and the awards to help make this event a success.

When we arrived, other participants were making their way in and a majority of the parking was under huge solar panels erected over the top of the parking, making for great shade. As you may expect, about half or more of the entries were lowriders since their clubs were helping to put on the event.

## Muscles "Off" Main Street

On Saturday, July 9th, the Pride of Vista Lions Club Foundation hosted a car show at Guajome Park Academy in Vista. Their motto is "We Serve." Chartered in 1992, the Pride of Vista Lions Club serves the community through a variety of projects. Their earliest community endeavors included purchasing and installing playground equipment at Olive Elementary and painting at Lifeline Community Center and Girls, Inc. Now, they support many programs to serve the Vista community. Their Sight Program provides eye exams and eyeglasses as needed to Vista students. They also serve adults referred through local nonprofits. Since 2003, they have provided over 700 eye exams to students and adults. In addition, recycled eyeglasses are refurbished and distributed to people who need them.

The Muscles on Main car show was created a couple years ago to raise additional funds for their programs and up until now has been held on Main Street in downtown Vista, hence the name "Muscles on Main Street." It started as a small show with around 40 entries. However, it has been growing, which is why there was a change of location to Guajome Park Academy for this show, dubbed "Muscles off Main Street." For a \$30 entry fee prior to July I, entrants received a goody bag with a T-shirt, and one free pancake breakfast. A raffle with about twenty prizes and a 50/50 drawing were on the schedule too. A DJ played a nice variety of music all day.

This show attracted about 80 entries, and vehicles were parked in every other parking space, making for plenty of room for chairs and pop-up shade. We arrived just after 7:30 am and picked a nice space near the main area to set up. Tom & Nancy Geiman arrived a short while later in their green & white '62 Impala Hardtop. We participated in the pancake breakfast, which was one of the better ones we have ever had at a car show. Then we bought some raffle & 50/50 tickets and eventually made our way around to see the rest of the cars and visited a bit with people we knew or met at the show. My stepbrother Kent arrived around 10 am to see the show and to visit with us for the day. Before long it was lunch time. They offered a hot dog or a hamburger with a bag of chips for a mere five bucks, which was good considering there was no place else around there to get food.

The best part of the show is that they did the raffle and award presentations just after noon, so we didn't have to hang out there all day. Tom won a free car wash, which he gave away to someone who actually wanted it, but the rest of us weren't raffle lucky. However, there was still hope for a 50/50 win.
