Stock Car Races on Maui

When you hear someone is going to Hawaii on vacation, you probably think about laying on the beach getting a tan, snorkeling and going to a luau, not going to the races. Most people don't know Maui has a significant classic car population, a classic car club, cruise night at Peggy Sue's Diner, and Paradise Raceway Park, home to a stock car dirt oval track and a very nice quarter-mile drag strip. The last stock car races of the season were happening Saturday night while we were there so we joined the local people of Maui for a night of racing.

We arrived about an hour before racing was to begin and the parking lot was already pretty full. This is a big thing for a lot of folks and they come out to have tailgate parties before the races. We worked our way to the end of the lot, found a place to park and located some prime seating in front of the flagman's stand. We discovered they usually race during the day on Sunday, and this was the first ever night racing on the dirt oval. And, since it was the last race of the season, there were some extra events, two demolition derbies and two backwards races. It was quite windy when we arrived, but the winds seem to die down after sunset. While waiting for the events to start we headed for the food truck where we acquired a "Ho Dog" Combination plates (hot dogs wrapped with bacon served with beans, macaroni salad and rice), a favorite of the locals and a must try dish for visitors. Then we visited the Tee-Shirt guy, who was selling souvenir shirts out of the back of his pickup truck. Of course we had to have one.





As we took our seats, the big water truck made a couple passes around the track spraying water everywhere to control the dust, but corner #1 seemed to be flooded while the #2 corner and most of the back stretch seemed to get missed. Hmm, did they do this on purpose? Apparently, no one cared as the time trials began to determine starting positions. One at a time cars came out and attempted to do their best and fastest lap. Attempted is the key word here, as most of them couldn't get around the first corner before spinning out into the big tires lining the infield portion of the track. Those making it around corner #1 disappeared into a dust storm in corner #2 and weren't seen again until corner #3. Finally, time trials are over and the heat race line-ups are set. There were no more than four cars in each class, and as the first four came onto the track, one quit between turn #3 and #4. We expected the push truck to come to the rescue, but then the announcer said, "Hey guys, its an obstacle, deal with it, let's race!" And so they did! It was hilarious watching them spin out a lot and having more crashes and near misses than completed laps.





Halfway through racing, the water truck made another appearance, repeating the over-watering of corner #1 and missing corner #2 and most of the back stretch, which by this time had a big dip in it.

Okay, time for backwards racing. The first race featured mostly first time drivers who had never driven on a dirt track before and the same compact cars that would later compete in the demolition derby. They were completely stock cars with all glass, light and interiors removed just for this one night of fun. It was hysterical watching them trying to maneuver around the muddy track in reverse. They were spinning out and bumping into each other, but surprisingly, they all finished the race mostly unscathed. The bigger cars raced next, but they were much better at the backwards thing resulting in faster speeds and a whole lot more hooting and hollering from the crowd. It was a blast!



Racing is over and it's almost time for the demolition derbies. But first, there were tire races with kids age 10 and under. There were about sixty kids wanting to play and races were run with about 15 kids at a time and ended with a run-off between the best. Each one had a full size car tire to roll as quickly as possible about 150 feet to the finish line. As you might imagine, this was as much fun to see as the races themselves. The winner was a girl! The boys were not amused. But the crowd was.

Here comes the water truck again and empties the entire tank load on the track in front of the crowd and leaves. Ten minutes later, here he comes again and empties his entire load again. Wow, what a muddy mess! Then the nine compact cars, now unrecognizable by make or model, entered the track, positioning strategically with their backs to each other, ready for battle, each one with hopes of being the last four-wheeled warrior standing. The battle, filled with the sounds of engines revving and metal crushing, lasted over ten minutes, and ended with the sweet smell of hot anti-freeze and engine oil, and only one car able to move on its own power. Victory!

What's next? You guessed it, the water truck again, hosing the entire area again including all the participants of the first derby. All nine cars were left where they fell during the battle, obstacles for the next derby with four midsized cars. They took the field and positioned themselves where they thought they would have the best chance to prevail over the others. This battle, like the first, lasted about ten minutes, with the contenders slipping and sliding, unable to get enough speed to do too much damage on any one hit. The Olds Cutlass was the first to go down, taking a hard hit on the right front by the BMW. A couple minutes later, the General Motors sedan went down leaving only the Olds Station wagon and the BMW. The Olds wagon suddenly quit running and the BMW was declared the winner.



Surprisingly, when you get away from the tourist areas of island and find where the local people go, you'll see it is a whole lot like being anywhere else in America. The people of Maui love their classic cars, car shows and cruises, racing, and all things associated with our hobby. It's a little different than we are used to, but loads of fun just the same. If you ever get to Maui, check out the local car scene. You will be glad you did.






New Years Day Adventure
