Cibola/Quartzite RV Trip

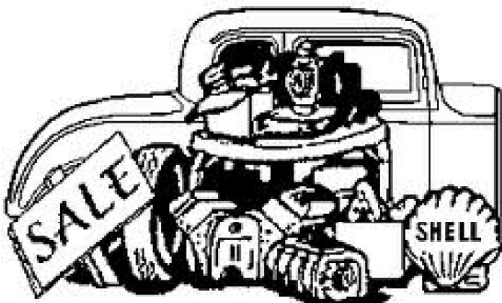


Friday, January 17 to

The Kitchen Scoop

on Several Things Egg Nog *by Ann Goldberg*



Rich, smooth, creamy, delicious. It's hard to beat the tasty satisfaction of egg nog. When I was a child and our Tri-5's were new it was a winter treat Mim whipped up for her grandchildren -- beaten egg and vanilla stirred into a cold glass of milk; enjoyed long before worry about possible illness from uncooked egg consumption. Years later, full of eggs and cream, spiked to ward off winter's chill, I made large batches to fill my punch bowl for holiday parties.

It's no longer necessary to prepare egg nog at home, market refrigerated cases are full on the yummy stuff before the Halloween candy is even all eaten. Unfortunately for me, I'm the only egg nog lover in the house. After a while I cave, give in to temptation, and make the purchase with the plan of sipping only a small bit of it's alarmingly caloric goodness at a time.

After a couple of servings, the guilt becomes almost too great to bear and I realize I need to make the egg nog "go away". A stronger woman would pour it down the sink drain and be done with it. I'm more likely to make the situation worse by adding calories and fat grams to other calories and fat grams. Egg nog is great substituted for milk, and a great excuse to make, French toast, pancakes or even poured on top of a warming bowl of oatmeal.

If there's a good amount left in the carton, egg nog cheese cake with a gingersnap crust is yummy:

Egg Nog Cheese Cake with Gingersnap Crust

Preheat oven to 325 degrees

Crust:

48 gingersnap cookies finely ground
1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup melted butter

Mix ingredients together and press into the bottom and up the sides of a 10-inch springform pan sprayed with cooking spray.

Topping:

1 cup whipping cream
1/2 cup egg nog

Beat cream into stiff peaks. Fold in egg nog. Spread over the top of the chilled cheesecake.



Filling:

32 oz 1/3 less fat cream cheese
4 large eggs
1-1/2 cup egg nog
2 cups powdered sugar
2 T flour

Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add eggs one at a time, beating after each. Pour in egg nog and blend. Add powdered sugar and flour. Stir until all ingredients are incorporated.

Pour over crust and bake for 1 hour. Turn oven off leave the cake in the oven for another hour without opening the door.

Cool cake completely, cover and chill in the refrigerator for at least 8 hours.



Claudia's Corner

CRANBERRY ORANGE COOKIES

1 cup butter, softened
1 cup white sugar
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
1 egg
1 teaspoon grated orange zest
2 tablespoons orange juice
2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt
2 cups chopped cranberries
1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

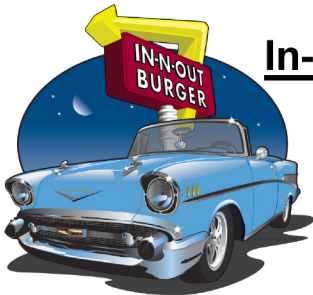
1/2 teaspoon grated orange zest
3 tablespoons orange juice
1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar

1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).
2. In a large bowl, cream together the butter, white sugar and brown sugar until smooth. Beat in the egg until well blended. Mix in 1 teaspoon orange zest and 2 tablespoons orange juice. Combine the flour, baking soda and salt; stir into the orange mixture. Mix in cranberries and if using, walnuts, until evenly distributed. Drop dough by rounded tablespoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets. Cookies should be spaced at least 2 inches apart.
3. Bake for 12 to 14 minutes in the preheated oven, until the edges are golden. Remove from cookie sheets to cool on wire racks.
4. In a small bowl, mix together 1/2 teaspoon orange zest, 3 tablespoons orange juice and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Spread over the tops of cooled cookies. Let stand until set.

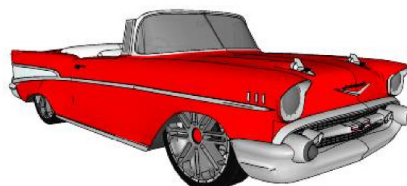

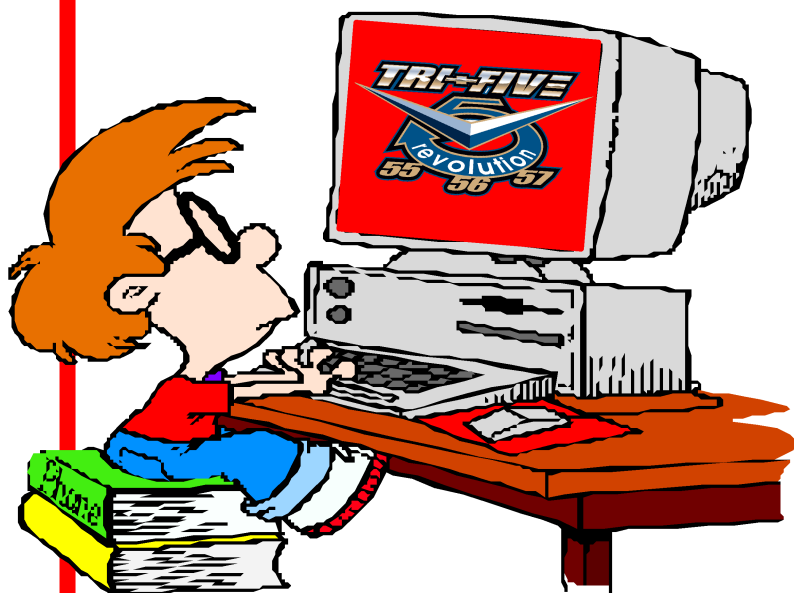
