E & M Auto Parts End of an Automotive Era

Cars have always been a big part of my life. I learned to drive at a very young age while growing up on a farm and with that came the tasks of learning how to do maintenance and make repairs on every piece of equipment on the farm. I learned a lot from my dad, and I remember that he had a favorite place to go to get his auto parts to complete a project on his vehicles or make a quick repair to get it back on the road. It seems like most people did a lot of their own maintenance and repairs to their vehicles back then, and I'm sure they all had their favorite parts store too. It was a time before the big-name auto parts stores like NAPA, O'Reilly, Pep Boys and so many more modern-day conglomerates forced the Mom-and-Pop Auto Parts stores out of business. Most have been gone for many years. E & M Auto Parts is probably one of the last family-owned auto parts businesses left in existence, until now. Sadly, E & M is closing their doors for the last time on December 12 of this year.

E & M Auto Parts has been that go-to place for many people in the east county area for as long as I can remember. It's the one place you could always go to get the very best service and the best parts availability. It's the place where you knew Kenny, Richard, Mike or Tony would always be there to help you get the quality parts you needed at a great price. The E & M guys knew their business and they knew their parts. They didn't have to look up every part in a book. Most of the time, you could tell them what you needed, and without hesitation, they would just go get the part from the shelves in the back. In



today's world, you're lucky to find anyone who even knows what any particular part should look like. If they can't look up a part number by year make & model on the computer, they are not able to help you. And if they do identify the part you need, the part is likely not in stock and has to be ordered because most parts for our older cars are just not in stores anymore.

Ever wonder how E & M Auto Parts got started or what E & M stands for? Way back before most of us were ever born, there was a man named Thomas Engle. Mr. Engle opened a wrecking yard and a 24-hour towing business named Engle's Auto Wrecking. It was located on the same El Cajon property as today, sometime before 1946. However, it sure looked a lot different back then. There was no Main Street or Interstate 8 back then, only Highway 80. In fact, it looked like it was way out in the country and really, it was. There were no other businesses anywhere around it. The address then was Route 1, Box 176A, Highway 80, El Cajon, California, and the phone number was H 4-7222. Mr. Engle advertised the sale of new and used auto parts, tires, tubes, batteries and accessories.

In 1946, Mr. Engle went into business with Carmelo and Joan Manuele. They changed the name of the business to E & M Auto Parts, after the last name initials of the two partners. It was the same location, however the address changed to Route 2, Box 671B. Shortly after that, a new building was erected to house the auto parts for sale and later, an addition to that building was added too.




As time went by, more and more businesses popped up in the area and eventually that part of highway 80 became Main Street, El Cajon and the business address changed again to the current 1647 East Main Street. By 1965, Interstate 8 was completed from Mission Bay through El Cajon to Lake Jennings Park Road, running on the south side of the E & M property.



Recently, a few loyal east county E & M customers got together in front of the store with a few classic cars for some photos with Richard and Kenny to help preserve the memory of E & M Auto Parts. It probably won't be too long before the signs, perhaps the building, and any other evidence of the 75-year history of this remarkable

Kenny & Richard are sons of Carmelo and Joan, and they were kind enough to provide me with some of this information. I was able to photograph a couple of receipts, and though they are a bit hard to read, I believe one is from January 25, 1947, and one is from January 29, 1949. The first one is an Engle's Auto Wrecking receipt and the other an E & M Auto Parts receipt. The first receipt is to Mark Motors for two tires size 6.50X16 for \$17.00 each, totaling \$34. The second receipt is to J. R Wood for two V8 carbs, one sender and two water pumps for a whopping \$6.50! Seeing these receipts was sure an interesting blast from the past.


1955 Chevy Bel Air Convertible / Wayne Hartwig, San Diego, California


