## Michelle's Place 1st Annual Cars for Hope Car Show Submitted

Michelle's Place Cancer Resource Center was established in 2001 to honor Michelle Watson's wish of creating a place of comfort and support for people fighting cancer. Michelle's Place has been sponsoring a "Walk of Hope" in Temecula in the Promenade Mall parking lot for eight years raising funds in support of cancer patients because "No One Should Face Cancer Alone"! This event featured a DJ, a live band, food trucks, dozens of vendors, and a huge raffle in addition to the "Walk of Hope" as part of the event.

This year Michelle's Place added their first annual "Cars For Hope" car show to the event. Since it was their first car show, they contacted the Drifters Car Club for help setting it up. The Drifters gave them some recommendations and asked the club membership to come out in support of the show. Linda and I attended with our '55 Chevrolet Belair Convertible and Tom & Nancy Geiman came with their '55 Chevrolet Belair wagon. Turnout was about 80 cars, not bad for a first time show with little advertising.

Instead of window placards, each entry was assigned to a specific parking space that was identified with a numbered twelve-inch square "Spot" marker taped to the asphalt. The spot number was also the entry number for voting. Each entrant was provided with a cup with their number on it and a token for voting. The idea was for each driver to put their token in the cup of the car they wanted to vote for. There were also slips of paper anyone could fill out to vote for their favorite ride. At the end of the voting period, there was only one token in our cup. Obviously, this was a very weird voting system and I'm not sure how they actually arrived at the "People's Choice" winner. I know sponsors and/or judges made the rest of the picks.

An opening ceremony took place before the walk began and then the walkers all disappeared up the street to make the 1.6 mile journey. We collected our tee-shirts and then made our way to a food truck to get a breakfast burrito before heading to the vendor area. Each vendor, as part of the entry fee, donated a raffle prize making for a very successful raffle. Twenty dollars netted a raffle ticket card with twenty-five tickets to put into buckets for the prizes we wanted to win. We bought two cards of raffle tickets. Each ticket card had twenty-five tickets with the same number, so we only had to remember that one number for each card.













It took quite some time to see all of the vendor booths and before we were done, the walkers arrived back filling the area with so many people it was difficult to move. The raffle drawing started at 10:30 and numbers were being called one by one, waiting for each winner to take possession of their win.

Meanwhile, the car awards that were supposed to be at 1:00 were moved up to 11:00. The problem was that the raffle was not over by then and both were happening at the same time in different locations. Linda and Nancy stayed at the raffle while Tom and I went to observe the awards. Linda won one prize valued at \$45. There were seven trophies, a "Best of Show" award and two "Artist's" awards. Our convertible was chosen for the "Best of Show" award and the Geiman's wagon won an "Artist's" award.

I'm sure the Walk of Hope was very successful, and the car show was good for a first annual show. We were asked for feedback on how to improve for next year and I believe the people in charge will make changes to help smooth out the process for next year.

Cancer is very serious and can change people's lives in a very negative way. This event raises monies in support of cancer patients, helping them to live a more normal and comfortable life and giving them the support they need to fight cancer. sunset tour and spent the night. The following day was a run to Tucson with a quick stop in Anthem, AZ to visit the Veterans Memorial Park.






After an overnight in Tucson, it was time to head home, but first we took a 30 mile detour south on I-19

We received a flyer for the Annual Newport Beach Classic Car & Truck Festival at Balboa Pier in Newport Beach on October 26th. This was the ninth annual show, however it was the first show at this new location. The show was presented by the Knights of Columbus in partnership with the City of Newport Beach and Balboa Village. The weather looked as though it would be a beautiful day, so we decided to attend.

We made the trip up I-5 & I-405 and down Hwy 55 encountering a little fog along the way, but nothing too scary. However, the closer we got to Balboa Pier, the foggier it was. When we arrived at the pier parking lot, it was so foggy, we couldn't see the pier. There was a long line of cars making their way into the show parking lot and it took a while to get in and parked.



This is a family friendly show open to all vehicles, old and new. Proceeds go to Toys for Tots. There were about 230 total entries and about 25 vendors. There was a raffle with numerous items donated by vendors, and most were for businesses in the Newport Beach area. We chose not to buy raffle tickets as we wouldn't be able to use any of the winnings without going back to the area. There was a Beer Garden, a live band and a couple food trucks.

After parking and getting registered, we went out to the end of the pier to Ruby's Diner for a bacon & eggs breakfast. We enjoyed the smell of fresh ocean air and were able to see the large waves crashing onto the sandy beaches. After breakfast we meandered around the show to see all the pretty cars, and there were a lot of them. Car owners had to choose the appropriate judging class at registration, and we had to choose between the "Tri-Five Chevy" class and the "Convertible" class. We chose the "Tri-Five Chevy" class and that turned out to be a wise choice because there were about twenty beautiful convertibles and only five Tri-Fives. Later we discovered one of those Tri-Fives was in the "Muscle Car" class and one was in the "Convertible" class. We still had some time before awards and the fog had lifted making for a perfect Chamber of Commerce day. #### New England Cranberry Cobbler

#### Ingredients:

6T unsalted butter, melted and cooled

1-1/4 cup cranberries

3/4 cup + 2 T sugar, divided

1 cup all purpose flour

1-1/4 t baking powder

1/2 t salt

1/2 cup whole milk

1 large egg

Sweetened whipped cream or Cool Whip (optional)

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter and flour a 10" round pan.

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, salt and 3/4 cup sugar.

In a small bowl, whisk together milk and egg, then whisk in cooled butter.

Whisk milk mixture into flour mixture until combined.

Stir together cranberries and 2 tablespoons sugar to coat berries.

Pour batter into pan and scatter cranberries on top. Sprinkle any sugar remaining in bowl over all.

Bake until center springs back when lightly touched, 25-30 minutes.

Let cool 25 minutes, or let sit at room temperature up to 8 hours.

Sprinkle with confections sugar or serve with a dollop of whipped cream.



There was no People's Choice voting, only judges going around using score sheets to determine winners of trophies in the different categories. It was not clear what all of the categories were, but in the end, our convertible was awarded the "Chevy-Best" award and Dana Stevens went home with the "Best of Show" award. Congratulations Dana!


Like all first time car shows, there were some things done well and some things not done so well, but overall, it was a nice show, and they plan to do it again next year bigger and better.

Yes, it rained late Saturday night and early Sunday morning!! By time I headed out to Bates the roads



and Nancy Geiman came by later in the day to visit fellow club members and


hang out with us.






