In fact, he was very sure that we would be a trophy winner if we decided to go. I thought Tim was just telling us that so we would sign up for the show, and we know better than to ever think we are going to be a trophy winner at any car show. We discovered later that his custom 1917 Center Door Model T was Best of Show at this event last year. We looked at the calendar and saw that we had no plans for that day, and we knew a lot of our Drifter friends would be attending, so we signed up. We also thought since we are into November, the weather would be a bit milder. That proved not to be the case, as the midday temperature was 92 degrees.

The Elks website states that their mission is to inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to recognize a belief in God; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its Members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; to cultivate good fellowship; to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization, and to provide for its government, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America will serve the people and communities through benevolent programs, demonstrating that Elks Care and Elks Share.



This Elks Lodge organizes an annual car show event to raise monies in support of their annual Christmas toy drive and attendees were asked to bring a new unwrapped toy to the show or make a money donation. Funds raised from the show will be used to purchase bicycles for older kids.

Sam & Donna Rindskopf were at this show with their black '57 Nomad and Tom & Nancy Geiman

came in their blue flamed '55 Belair hardtop. The gates opened at 7:00 am, however we didn't arrive until shortly after 8:00 am. The lot was nearly full, but

fortunately, Tom & Nancy were able to save us a nice space between them and a red '55 Chevy sedan.

Registration for this show came with an event tee-shirt and a ticket for one pancake breakfast served by the elks inside the lodge. A second ticket needed to be purchased for any additional pancake breakfasts. The VFW, which is just next door was offering breakfast burritos for \$6.00 starting at 9:00 am and we opted for burritos over pancakes. It became obvious the VFW wasn't very well



prepared for the number of people wanting a burrito. Burritos were pre-made and although we were in line early, they said they only had one egg and bacon burrito left. We decided to get the last one and split it, but we soon discovered it was actually a bean burrito. Oh well, we were hungry and we ate it anyway.



There were 69 pre-registered cars with only two no-shows and five day-of-show registrations for a total of 72 entries. Opening ceremonies were at 9:00 am with the Pledge of Allegiance and the National Anthem. A DJ was playing fabulous tunes from the 60's and

70's throughout the show. Inside the Elks Club were raffle prizes and a 50/50 raffle too. The raffle had a separate ticket jar in front of each item, so ticket

buyers could choose what they wanted and wouldn't get stuck with an unwanted item. The items were mostly typical car show raffle items like car cleaning products, kitchen items, and other trinkets. The weirdest raffle item was a huge unrestored trunk that was originally from an



early Ford. There were several Ford guys there that eagerly dropped tickets into the jar for this trunk. The winner seemed to be really happy, but I have no idea how he was going to get it home.



We did make our way around the lot to see the entries, and it was a diverse collection of vehicles. There were quite a few of the usual cars we see at many other shows, some nice drivers, but also numerous really nice high-end cars and trucks too.

It was quite warm, even under our Wonder Shade umbrellas. There was a stiff breeze occasionally and hang gliders were taking advantage of the flying conditions most of the day. It didn't help that a brush fire broke out just across the road. Fire crews were

on the scene quickly, but it still took a couple hours to get it totally under control. Fortunately, it didn't impact the car show activities.

Trophies were scheduled to be awarded at 1:30 pm and there was a table next to the DJ with nine trophies including a "Best of Show" award. All winners were picked by members of the Elks Club. We saw several judges walking by the cars making notes and we couldn't help but notice that some of the judges were also Drifters. As the awards were being presented, I was in agreement with their picks, which is very rare for me. The last award of course was "Best of Show," and it was chosen by the Counselor of the Elks Lodge. Apparently the Counselor was quite intrigued with our convertible, and he chose it for the "Best of Show" award. So, I guess Tim was right, I was destined to be a winner at this show.

Michelle's Place 2nd Annual Cars for Hope Car Show

It's late October and time for Michelle's "Walk of Hope" in Temecula in the Promenade Mall parking lot. This show

honors Michelle Watson's wish of creating a place of comfort and support for people fighting cancer. Michelle's Place Cancer Resource Center was established in 2001 and has been sponsoring the "Walk of Hope" in the Promenade parking lot for the last nine years raising funds in support of cancer patients because "No One Should Face Cancer Alone"!

With this year's "Walk of Hope" came the second annual "Cars For Hope" Car Show. Linda and I attended last year with our '55 Chevrolet Belair Convertible and decided to attend again this year. Last year, about 80 cars showed up, making for a nice first annual show. The organizers anticipated up to 200 entries this year, but something went wrong and they only had 37 entries. I think the low turnout was partially because flyers and advertising weren't out soon enough and not distributed enough at other cars shows.



It also didn't help that all entries had to be in the parking lot by 6:45 am. When we arrived around 6:20, it was still dark, very foggy and quite chilly. No one was attempting to detail their car until after daylight thinking the fog would let up a bit. But it didn't. The fog actually got worse for a while, and it stayed foggy and cool all morning and we were glad we had a warm jacket. We picked up our registration placard and tee shirt, got a cup of hot chocolate, and bought some raffle tickets while waiting for the fog to lift enough to clean up the car.

This year's event was much like last year with a DJ, a live band, food trucks, about 30 vendors, and a nice raffle, but the whole event was a smaller turnout than last, about half as big. A second raffle was added this year

The opening ceremony started at 9:00 am with the Boy Scouts presentation of the flags, the National Anthem and talks about the organization. They filled the stage with cancer survivors honoring them for their courage to take on cancer and defeat it. Then the walk began and hundreds of walkers made their way under the huge ballon arch on their way to complete the 1.6 mile walk.



While the walkers were walking the walk, Linda and I made our way through the vendor booths before the crowd arrived back making it easier for us to see everything. Winning numbers for both raffles were drawn at 10:30 and posted on a big white board, waiting for each winner to claim possession of their win. We didn't win a thing this year, however our friend Tina won two of the twelve prizes. The car awards were announced at 11:00 am. There were ten trophies, including a "Best of Show" award. The "Best Interior" trophy went to our convertible.

The Walk of Hope has been very successful, and last year's car show was good for a first show. But this year's show was not so successful, as everything was about half the size. I don't know why that is other than I don't think it was promoted well enough.

Ingredients


8 oz cream cheese, softened

- 1 cup butter
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 4 eggs
- 2 1/4 cups flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 cups fresh cranberries
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

A dusting of confectioners' sugar

Directions Thoroughly cream together cream cheese, butter, sugar and vanilla. Add eggs one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Gradually add 2 cups flour and baking powder. Combine remaining 1/4 cup flour with cranberries and nuts and fold into batter. Pour into greased and floured tube pan and bake at 350 degrees F for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Let stand for 5 minutes before removing from pan. Dust with confectioners' sugar.
