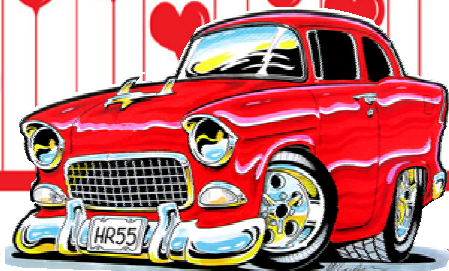


# '55 '56 '57 Revolution Review

## THE KITCHEN SCOOP ON CINNAMON BUTTER

Back in the mid-50's, cereal, juice and milk was my usual school day breakfast eaten at the white enamel topped table in the kitchen. Buttered toast topped with cinnamon sugar was a favorite weekend treat. Now I've discovered something insurmountably better, and much more versatile, - cinnamon butter!

Sweetened with your choice of sugar or honey, cinnamon butter is incredible with a huge variety of foods, and a batch keeps for ages in the refrigerator. Spread it on your breakfast toast, muffin or bagel; stir into hot cereal; replace for the oil in pancake recipes; add to squash, sweet potatoes or steamed carrots.

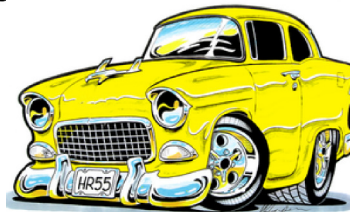
Here are two recipes to try. Whichever one you try first, just thoroughly mix all ingredients. Store in a covered container. And, enjoy! The wonderful, sweet cinnamon-y flavor will make any winter day a lot more fun!

### Cinnamon Sugar Butter

- ¼ pound butter, softened
- 1 Tablespoon granulated sugar
- 1 Tablespoon brown sugar
- 1-2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

### Cinnamon Honey Butter

- ¼ pound butter, softened
- 3 Tablespoons honey
- 1-2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon
