In-N-Out Burger Run

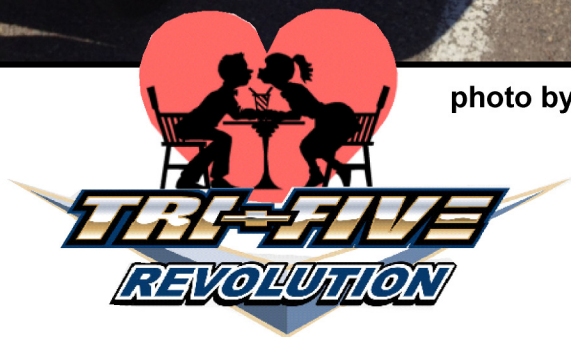

Scottsdale Auto Auctions 2014

As some of you know, for a long time Harvey and I have gotten perverse vicarious pleasure watching people spend a whole lot of money on exceptional classic cars at auction. It started when we attended our first Barrett-Jackson event, a small sports car auction held in conjunction with the vintage races at Laguna Seca one year. The evening we saw a car reach a \$1 million selling price, bringing the whole room on its feet and cheering, we were hooked.

It's reported 15% of all collector cars sold at auction each year are sold in one week in January in the Phoenix-Scottsdale area. Their selling prices are considered a pretty reliable indicator of market pricing for similar vehicles over the next 6 to 12 months.

The Scottsdale auctions were added to Harvey's Bucket List. After talking about it for several years, we made the trip.

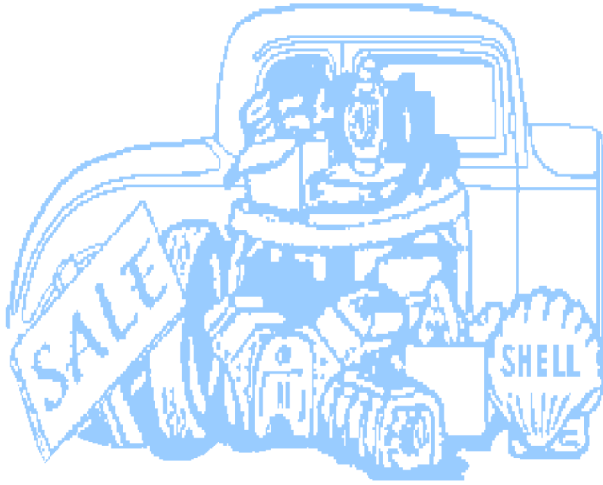
Six auction companies participate: Barrett-Jackson ("The World's Greatest Collector Car Auction"); Gooding & Company (geared to collectors of "rare and exceptional" cars); RM Auctions ("investment grade" collector cars); Russo & Steele (seller of European sports cars, American muscle cars, hot rods and customs); Bonham's Scottsdale Sale (an unusual mix of classic cars, automotive related collectibles and collector books), and Silver Auctions (featuring affordable collector cars). *Hagarety Classic Cars Weekly News* reports that during auction week 2014 sales from the nearly 3,000 cars sold totaled almost \$248.5 million, with prices averaging more than a 7% over 2013 numbers. At Silver and Russo & Steele mainstream buyers spent an average of more than 16% over previous year.

We divided our time between two events, sandwiching Russo & Steele between two visits to Barrett-Jackson. Russo is a low key, almost intimate affair. This year's inventory was comprised almost entirely of cars looking like the ones we see area car shows. They're sold from the floor of a tent bordered on two sides by 3 tiers of bleachers seating both bidders and spectators. By comparison, Barrett-Jackson is the big kid on the block known for its crowded, loud, glitzy, almost carnival-like atmosphere; displays of new 2014 models; "automobilia" collections, and an extensive and varied vendor area. In almost 1 million square feet of auction and display space, over 6-days Barrett-Jackson moved nearly 1,400 vehicles bringing sales just under \$113 million. Included with the array of cars, an antique fire truck, super-large speed boat, a retired Cessna liaison plane, 1922 carousel with 44 animals, and a 1896 calliope.

With hot laps ridden in 2014 Corvettes and our fill, for a while, of auction action, we came away feeling we'd attended a very good party. It was fun and worth the trip. Scottsdale Auctions checked off the Bucket List.

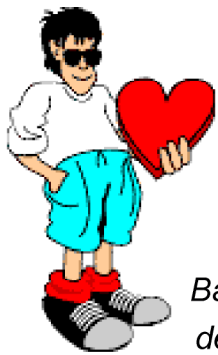

The Kitchen Scoop

on Brownie Treats for Valentine's Day

Back when our Tri-5's were new, Valentine's Day was fun and simple. I made hand decorated cards made for friends crafted from colored paper hearts fastened to lace paper doilies with flour and water paste. Now there's a lot of emphasis on flowers and chocolates.

Here are some easy additions and variations to brownies that will be just as tasty whether you make the base cookie from scratch or use your favorite mix, like do.

Try adding these to your brownies for a quick and different taste treat:

- *Instead of nuts, add raisins*
- *Replace all or one-half of the usual nuts with flaked coconut.*

If you're feeling more adventuresome, these variations make an even sweeter dessert for your Valentine:

Marshmallow Crunch Brownie Bars

- 1 10-1/2 ounce bag mini marshmallows
- 1-1/2 cups milk chocolate chips
- 1 cup smooth peanut butter (not natural)
- 1 Tablespoon butter
- 1-1/2 cups Rice Krispies

As soon as brownies are almost baked to perfection, remove from the oven and spread the marshmallows over the top. Return to the oven for 3 additional minutes. Meanwhile, in a sauce pan over low heat, melt the chips, peanut butter and butter, stirring constantly. Cool mixture 3 minutes and add the cereal. Spread over brownies.



Salted Caramel Brownies

- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 6 Tablespoons butter or margarine, room temperature
- 1 teaspoon fine-grain salt
- 2/3 cups heavy cream, room temperature

In a 3-quart saucepan, heat sugar over medium-high heat, whisking as it melts. Do not be concerned if some sugar clumps, continue whisking and it will melt in time. When sugar reaches a dark amber color, whisk in salt and then the heavy cream. The mixture will foam when the cream is first added, continue to whisk and it will settle down. Allow caramel to cool 10-15 minutes. Spread 1/2 of your brownie batter into the pan, smooth, top with 9 large dollops of caramel mixture; add remaining batter and 9 more large dollops of caramel. Swirl slightly. Bake as usual. Any remaining caramel sauce can be stored in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks. Warm slightly before using to restore original consistency.



Peanut Butter Swirl Brownies

- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1-1/2 cup creamy peanut butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Melt all over low heat, whisking constantly to incorporate ingredients. Place large dollops of mixture on top of unbaked batter. Swirl. Bake brownies as usual.



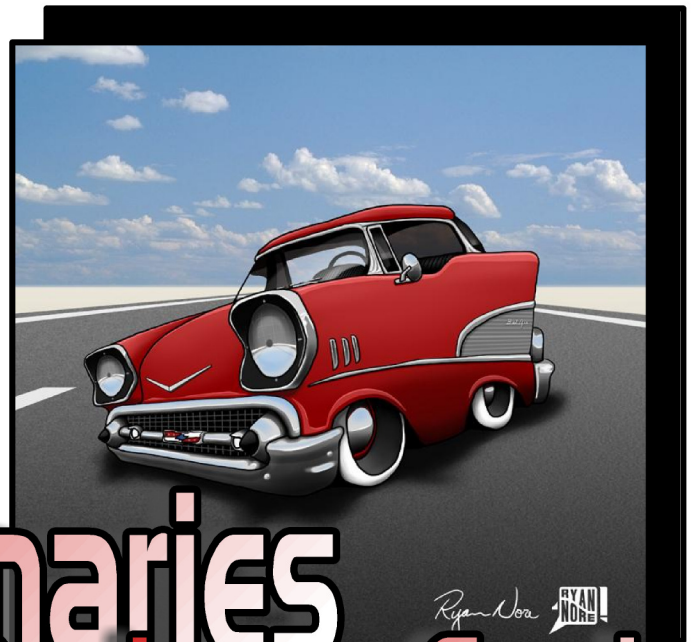
