During this visit I was asked for a few recipes for items that I brought on Saturday night so here goes...

MEXICAN SUSHI APPETIZERS

6 – 8 10" Flour Tortillas
12 oz. cream cheese softened
1 sm. Can diced green chilies
1 small can chopped olives
1/4 cup diced green onions
3 to 4 Tbsp. chopped pecans

Combine softened cream cheese with the rest of the ingredients. Then spread thinly and evenly onto each tortilla. Roll and lightly flatten. Refrigerate for 3-4 hours or overnight. Bring out and cut into pinwheel slices (I like them to be about $\frac{3}{4}$ " thick but you can vary according to your preference). Can be served with salsa.

EASY SLAW

1 bag of shredded cabbage slaw ½ cup craisins (dried cranberries)

Marie's slaw dressing – ½ - ¾ cup depending on preference Pepper to taste

Kitchen Scoop on Chicken



Two Easy Recipes from Ann Goldberg

Absolutely without a single idea for this month's column I flipped through my recipe box looking for something I thought you'd enjoy trying. Success! Here are two very easy, and delicious, chicken recipes that were family favorites for years. Chicken Divan is quick to prepare. Made with cooked chicken its just as perfect made with leftover chicken or for turning that cooked bird you just brought home from the market into a delectable casserole.

Baked Chicken al la Russe

Serves 8-10

NOTE: The chicken must marinate overnight. Then, day of baking, must be refrigerator-ated for 1-1/2 hours before baking.

5 whole chicken breasts, skinned, boned and cut into half

- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 Tablespoon worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper sauce
- 1 medium clove garlic, crushed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1-1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1 cup fine, dry bread crumbs

Wipe chicken dry on both sides with paper toweling. Combine sour cream, worcestershire sauce, pepper sauce, garlic, salt and paprika. Mix well. Place chicken is a zip-lock plastic bag, pour sour cream mixture over chicken.

Marinate overnight, turning bag occasionally to assure all of chicken is well covered with sauce. Dip each piece of chicken into crumbs to generously coat on all sides. Leave as much marinade on chicken before dipping into the crumbs as possible. Shape chicken pieces into compact bundles (without folding them).

Place chicken in a single layer in an ungreased baking dish. Cover.

Refrigerate about 1-1/2 hours.

Preheat oven to 325 degrees.

Place chicken in oven directly from refrigerator.

Bake, uncovered, 1 hour 15 minut

es or until done.

Serve with rice to which you've added chopped onions and water chestnuts.

Chicken Divan Serves 6-8



- 2 10-ounce packages frozen chopped broccoli
- 2 cups cubed cooked chicken
- 2 cans cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup mayo
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon curry powder
- 1/2 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs
- 2 Tablespoons melted butter

Cook broccoli, drain, spoon into the bottom of a greased casserole. Top with cubed cooked chicken. Combine soup, mayo, lemon juice and curry powder. Pour over chicken. Sprinkle with cheese. Combine crumbs and butter. Sprinkle over all. Bake for 25-30 minutes at 350 degrees.

Even though Chicken a la Russe must be started the day before it's served and the recipe has several steps, it too is easy to prepare — and equally tasty.
