
Goldie and the Horseless Carriages



SWEET 'CHERRITY' PIE

1 cup flour

1 cup chopped pecans

1/4 cup brown sugar

Mix all of the above and press into a 9" x 13" pan

Bake at 375 degrees for 15 – 20 minutes.

Cool completely.

Filling:

8 oz. cream cheese

1 cup powdered sugar

½ tsp. almond extract

8 oz. cool whip

1 - 21 oz. can cherry pie filling

Mix cheese and sugar and almond extract until blended. Fold in cool whip.

Fold in pie filling. Pour on cooled crust and refrigerate for 2 hours.

The Kitchen Scoop on the Flavor of Curry

Sometimes, I get the urge to just spice things up a little bit, flavor them a little differently than I usually do when preparing something to eat. Reaching for the curry powder on the pantry shelf is an easy way to fulfill that urge.

Curry powder is the combination of all sorts of wonderful spices. Sometimes it includes coriander, turmeric, cumin, fenugreek and chili peppers. Food Network's Alton Brown has a recipe comprised of cumin, cardamom, coriander seeds, tumeric, dry mustard and cayenne in quantities that yield one-half cup of finished product. That's a lot of curry powder. And, a lot of different spices needed to mix it up a batch. I'm just going to continue to satisfy myself purchasing prepaid curry powder from the grocery.

I did not experience the flavor of curry until I was a young adult and enjoyed the complex warm, mellow flavor on veggies and chicken concoctions served over rice. However, curry isn't reserved for things that go over rice. It's versatile. Add it to egg salad for a sandwich that's delicious, especially when made on a good multi-grain bread. You can also add it to a sauce to go over grilled or baked chicken or salmon.

Here are two different versions of peach-curry sauce you may want to try. The first is good year-round, it's made with canned peaches. For the other, you have to wait for fresh peaches to be available...but I think you'll find it's worth the wait.

Canned Peach - Curry Sauce

- 1 Tablespoon oil
- 1 medium onion, peeled and chopped small
- 1-1/2 teaspoons curry powder
- 1 can sliced peaches in extra light syrup (do not drain)
- 1 Tablespoon soy sauce

Cook onion in oil over medium heat until onion is translucent.

Add remaining ingredients. Heat mixture to boiling and boil for one minute stirring constantly.

Fresh Peach - Curry Sauce

2 fresh peaches, peeled and diced1/4 cup honey1 teaspoon curry powdersalt and pepper

Put fruit, honey and curry powder in a small sauce pan over medium heat. Bring to a simmer and cook 10 minutes stirring frequently until peaches have broken up and sauce is thickened. Season to taste with salt and pepper.




