The Kitchen Scoop on Beer

Back in the '70's, when we were all younger and my metabolism was my friend, not my nemesis, weekends often included a pancake breakfast, I started regularly using beer as the liquid in my pancake batter. The result was a very tender cake with a nice tangy flavor. Today, I came across a recipe that adds beer to yellow cake mix. The end result, an easy-to-make delicious cake topped with a beer-enhanced glaze, cherries and whipped topping. While the recipe seems a little fussy, the finished cake is as tasty as it sounds and worth the effort. You'll have to make the decision for yourself if that's due to the inclusion of beer in the recipe or the cherries and whipped topping on top of the cake. Ann Goldberg

Beer Cake Topped with Cherries

Nonstick baking spray to coat pan

1 15-ounce box yellow cake mix

1/3 C Vegetable Oil

3 Large eggs

1 12-ounce can beer

(Bud, Miller, Coors, or the like — your choice)

1/4 C Granulated sugar

1-1/2C Confectioners' sugar, sifted

1 12-ounce bag frozen cherries, thawed

Whipped topping for serving (optional)



Before starting to prepare the batter, preheat oven to 350 degrees and spray a 10-cup Bundt pan with nonstick baking spray.

In a large bowl, whisk the cake mix, oil, eggs and 1 cup of beer until batter is smooth and well-combined, at least 30-seconds. Pour the batter into the prepared pan, smoothing the top with a rubber spatula, then bake until a toothpick inserted in the cake comes out clean, 45-50 minutes.

While cake is baking, pour 2 tablespoons beer in a heatproof glass or pottery bowl and microwave until hot, about 30 seconds. Stir in 2 tablespoons granulated sugar until sugar is dissolved.

Let the cake cool in the pan for 5 minutes, then invert it onto a cooling rack. Using a toothpick, poke several holes over the top, then drizzle the beer syrup evenly over the cake until it soaks in. Let the cake cool completely.

Stir the confectioners' sugar and 2 tablespoons beer together in a bowl until smooth. Add more beer, 1 teaspoon at a time, as needed to form a thick glaze. Drizzle the glaze evenly over the cake and let stand until set, about 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine the remaining beer and 2 tablespoons granulated sugar with the cherries in a medium saucepan. Bring to a simmer over medium heat and cook, stirring, until the cherries are warmed through and the liquid is reduced to a thick syrup, about 10 minutes. Transfer the cherries into a bowl and let cool completely.

Serve cake with cherries on the side and a dollop of whipped topping, if using, on top of each slice.
