Mecum Auction Kissimmee, FL by Ann Goldberg

Ten days, three thousand cars across the auction block. Labeled by Mecum Auctions as 'the world's largest collector car auction.' All in Kissimmee, just outside Orlando, January 05 through the 14th. A lot of hype. A lot of great cars. A lot of fun.



This Reserve auction provided an interesting variety of immaculate automobiles, some beautiful Tri-5's and some interesting collections including a conga line of retractable roof Fords and five IROC racers. Good solid cars with paint jobs and engines appearing perfect. The Dodge Hellcat Experience was the thrill ride of the event. A short high speed run with hard braking, fish tailing and drifting around corners like I hadn't experienced since the '80's and my

SCCA driving days. One of those rides everybody leaves with a big Christmas morning smile.

Our beloved Tri-5 Chevy's were not a big part of the event. On the two days we attended, Thursday and Friday, days seven and eight of the sale, only thirteen made it to the auction block and they did not bring the largest bids. Bidders. A 1955 Nomad didn't sell — the \$81,000 bid not meeting the seller's Reserve. Earlier that day a 1957 Pontiac Safari Wagon Resto Mod sold for \$101,000. Bidders here were interested in young power machines. Go fast cars.

Site of the auction, Osceola Heritage Park is a compact venue easy to navigate: close in parking fields; transportation to the gate readily available; tents and buildings of cars, the midway stage, and vendor exhibits close together. You easily got in your 10,000 steps without enduring an exhausting hike to cover the whole event. Lots of good car fun at a budget price. Daily general admission just \$20 on line. For \$100 you could purchase a buyers's badge and accompanying 'guest' credential good for the duration of the auction on line. Seated in the arena I'd originally thought there were more buyers than spectators in the hall, then realized many attendees had simply upgraded to 'buyer' status for the better seating, closer access to the cars and related perks.

Not a bad idea. Perhaps we'll give that a try next year.



Claudia's Corner

LEMON PECAN CRANBERRY BISCOTTI

3 cups flour

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. baking powder

1/4 tsp. baking soda

1 ¼ stick unsalted butter at room temp.

1 1/3 cup sugar

1 ½ Tbsp. finely grated lemon peel

2 large eggs

3 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice

1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup dried cranberries

1 large egg – beaten – for glaze

Raw sugar



Sift flour, salt, baking powder and soda in a medium bowl. Beat butter, sugar, lemon peel in an electric mixer. Add 2 eggs, one at a time beating just to blend. Add lemon juice and mix till blended. Add flour mixture alternately with pecans and cranberries.

Lightly flour work surface and divide into 3 equal portions. With lightly floured hands, form each portion into an 8 inch log. Place on a piece of plastic wrap and press slightly flattening into a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 10 inch log. Wrap in plastic wrap and chill at least 3 hours to 3 days. Position rack in upper $\frac{1}{2}$ of oven preheated to 325 degrees F. Line a heavy, large rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper. Unwrap logs. Brush logs with egg glaze and sprinkle with raw sugar. Lift logs from plastic wrap and transfer to lined baking sheet. Bake until golden brown – about 45 to 50 minutes. Transfer to a cooling rack and cool completely. Reduce heat to 300. Line a baking sheet with parchment. Cut logs on the diagonal and arrange biscotti on cookie sheet. Bake another 20 minutes.
