

Sacramento –The California Department of Motor Vehicles announced today it will be taking pre-orders for a new License Plate Program offering vehicle owners the opportunity to purchase replicas of California license plate designs issued in the 1950's, 1960's, and 1970's.

The new program will bring a retro look to modern license plates by offering three classic license plate designs. Legacy License plates can be ordered for any year model automobile, commercial vehicle, motorcycle, or trailer. The styles include black lettering over a yellow background seen in the 1950's, yellow lettering over a black background seen in the 1960's and yellow lettering over a blue background that was available originally in the 1970's. The plates cost \$50 for non-personalized or personalized plates.

Bishops the "PTSNBM"

Since I was good all of 2012 "Santa Baby" gave me a set of Hiedt's Upper Tubular Control arms for Christmas. These arms are designed with an additional 6 degrees of camber which is just what was required to solve the project's alignment problem.



The new arms installed easily and fit perfectly.



The first step was to support the lower control arm with a floor jack and remove the upper a arm.



The next step was to install the new tubular arm. The arms came with urethane bushings and screw-in ball joints installed.



The final step was front end alignment with a spindle mount camber/caster gauge. With the proper alignment the car now steers great.





Sausage Barley Soup

1 large spanish onion diced

6 large garlilc cloves minced

Stuffed Pepper Soup

1 bottle V8 Spicy Hot 1 bottle V8 Low Sodium 2 lbs. ground chuck 3-4 Medium Bell peppers (red) diced 1 small/medium onion diced 1/2 Cup Brown Sugar

not letting it simmer for several hours. If so use regular rice or the minute rice will turn into little pillows in your soup :-)

2 Cups of Rice- brown or white your preference

Combine peppers and onion with ground chuck and cook until the ground chuck is browned. Put pepper mixture in crock pot Add both bottles of V8 or half of each depending on size of crock. Add the Brown Sugar Add Rice then Simmer on low for 2 hours or until rice is soft. Salt or pepper if needed.

Note: Minute Rice works fine as long as you are



Hoppin John Soup

(Original recipe makes 8 servings)

- 1 pound sage pork sausage
- 1 (6 ounce) package uncooked long grain and wild rice mix, with seasoning packet
- 2 (15 ounce) cans black-eyed peas, drained
- 2 (14.5 ounce) cans diced tomatoes, with liquid
- 2 (14 ounce) cans chicken broth
- 2 cups water
- Salt to taste

Directions

- 1. Crumble sausage into a skillet over medium heat and cook until evenly brown.
- 2. In a large pot, mix the cooked sausage, rice mix with seasoning packet, black-eyed peas, tomatoes, broth and water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer 20 minutes, or until rice is tender. Season to taste with salt.

Back when our tri-5's were new, and commercially available cleaning products were fewer and Spic 'n Span, Ajax and other names from the past where on the grocers' shelves, more old-fashioned homemakers like by grandmother Mim got tried and true results with using pantry items like baking soda and white vinegar. Mim, with her tight white curls hair-pinned in place and wearing a housedress (covered by an apron for messy jobs, of course) and her lace-up medium heeled shoes, could make any pane of glass shine with water liberally doused with white vinegar applied with a rag and polished off with waded up newspaper and some elbow grease. (Wouldn't it be ironic if the answer wasn't really the white vinegar and newspaper but the elbow grease?)

The current "wonder product" comes not from the pantry but from under the kitchen sink if the Pinterest crowd is in the know. Apparently the blue colored version of Dawn Dish Washing Liquid is pretty nifty stuff, too.

As a bathroom or kitchen sink cleaner

Clean shower and sink/vanity areas without a leaving a telltale chemical smell by using a mixture of equal parts blue Dawn and white vinegar. As an ice pack




