alia's Con

Its that time of year when the citrus is beginning to produce and we are in a quandary as to what to do with our lemons. Here are a few different ideas for you.

VINTAGE LEMONADE

1 1/4 cups white sugar

1 1/4 quarts water

- 1. Peel the rinds from the 5 lemons and cut them into 1/2 inch slices. Set the lemons aside.
- Place the rinds in a bowl and sprinkle the sugar over them. Let this stand for about one hour, so that the sugar begins to soak up the oils from the lemons.
- Bring water to a boil in a covered saucepan and then pour the hot water over the sugared lemon rinds. Allow this mixture to cool for 20 minutes and then remove the rinds.
- Squeeze the lemons into another bowl. Pour the juice through a strainer into the sugar mixture. Stir well, pour into pitcher and pop it in the fridge! Serve with ice cubes.

LEMON CURD

3 oz. (6 Tbs.) unsalted butter, softened at room temperature

1 cup sugar

2 large eggs

2 large egg yolks

2/3 cup fresh lemon juice

1 tsp. grated lemon zest

5 lemons

Step 1:

20 lemons (unwaxed)

Limoncello

1.75 liter vodka - Kettle One is best but any brand will do A) Remove only the yellow part of the lemon rinds (no pith, creating slivers of the lemon rind), add vodka and let stand for 4 weeks in a large glass jar/bottle.

Step 2:

1 liter water (35.2 oz.)

3 ½ cups sugar

B) Boil sugar and water for 5 – 7 minutes to make a simple syrup. Cool completely.

Add to alcohol mix let stand 4 more weeks.

(I use a potato peeler to shave off the rind)

Step 3:

C) Strain and bottle. Discard the lemon rinds or remove and freeze to use in baking etc.

D) Store the finished limoncello in the freezer. Don't worry, it won't freeze!

> E) Enjoy on the rocks, over ice cream or mixed in a favorite drink.

In a large bowl, beat the butter and sugar with an electric mixer, about 2 min. Slowly add the eggs and yolks. Beat for 1 min. Mix in the lemon juice. The mixture will look curdled, but it will smooth out as it cooks.

In a medium, heavy-based saucepan, cook the mixture over low heat until it looks smooth. (The curdled appearance disappears as the butter in the mixture melts.) Increase the heat to medium and cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture thickens, about 15 min. It should leave a path on the back of a spoon and will read 170°F on a thermometer. Don't let the mixture boil.

Remove the curd from the heat; stir in the lemon zest. Transfer the curd to a bowl. Press plastic wrap on the surface of the lemon curd to keep a skin from forming and chill the curd in the refrigerator. The curd will thicken further as it cools. Covered tightly, it will keep in the refrigerator for a week and in the freezer for 2 months.

Now that the last Christmas cookie crumb is a mere memory, those of us who make New Year's resolutions are grappling with our goal of a healthier 2014. It's a good time to think about something other than desserts. Here's a recipe for slow cooker white chili that's packed with all kinds of good-for-you stuff hidden behind the warmth of some chilies.

Slow Cooked White Chili

3/4 lb. chicken breast or thighs, cubed, or substitute vegetarian chicken-flavored strips

- 1 T canola oil
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 medium onion, plus more for garnish (optional)
- 4-5 cups chicken or vegetable broth
- 1-15 oz. can cannelloni (white kidney) beans, rinsed and drained
- 1-15 oz. can garbanzo beans (chickpeas), rinsed and drained
- 1-11 oz. can white corn, drained
- 1-2 4-oz. can(s) green chilies, drained
- 1 t ground cumin
- 1-2 t ground chili powder
- 1 jalapeño or serrano pepper, seeded and diced (optional)

shredded monterey jack cheese, for garnish (optional)

Saute chicken and onion in oil until chicken is cooked and onion translucent. Add garlic and cook for 1 more minute. Pour all into slow cooker, top with broth, both kinds of beans, corn and green chilies. Add ground cumin and chili powder; stir. Cover and cook on low heat for 5-6 hours. Prior to serving, add jalapeño or serrano pepper to taste. Serve with additional chopped onion and/or shredded cheese if desired.


