TECH TIME My Differential Dilemma

The convertible is painted, and the body is back on the frame. The front suspension is completely done and now it's time for me to get busy with the rear suspension and differential. One of the first items I needed to get done was to remove the whole rear axle and disassemble everything, prepare the parts for powder coating and to replace the existing 3.07 ratio gear set with a 3.54 ratio gear set. It sounded pretty simple at the time, but that soon proved to not be so simple at all. I discovered some things about C4 Corvette rear axle assemblies that few other people seemed to know. Chevrolet Corvettes from 1985 through 1996 equipped with automatic shift transmissions came with a Dana 36 differential and those with stick shift transmissions came with a Dana 44 differential. The difference between the two is similar to the difference between 10 bolt and 12 bolt differentials in Camaros, Chevelles and other full-size Chevrolets.

The differential in the convertible is a Dana 36, which is okay with me, but Dana Spicer no longer makes gear sets for it. Apparently, Nitro and Sierra make the gears I need, but they told me up front that they are prone to being noisy. That is not something I felt like taking a chance with. So, I started exploring other options. I was told by some so-called experts on the subject that Spicer 3.54 gears are available for a Dana 44, and that I would need to change everything associated with it. After spending some time with Dave Meyers at Corvette Specialties, I discovered that both of those statements proved to be false. Spicer only makes the 3.07 and the 3.73 gear set ratios for the Dana 44 that work in a C4 Corvette. Dave said to give him a few days and he would see if he could find a Dana 44 with a 3.36 or 3.54 ratio that was in good condition. He called me a few days later and he had found a Dana 44 from a 1992 stick shift car with a 3.45 ratio, but it included only the differential housing and the batwing cover, no axles hubs, or anything else.

That sounded good to me, but I needed to know how many other things needed to be changed to make this Dana 44 work in the convertible. So, Dave set up a Dana 36 and a Dana 44 side by side and we did some measuring and checked some part numbers. Turns out not much has to be done to install it in the car. The side to side yoke measurements are exactly the same and the part numbers for axles and u-joints are exactly the same for both the Dana 36 and Dana 44 differentials. The location and measurements of the spring mounting, camber rods and tie-rods are also exactly the same. The only difference we could find is

that the nose of the Dana 44 is 15/16" longer which will require shortening the driveshaft that much, and the upper nose mounting is different by approximately the same amount, which just means an easy modification to the existing nose mount. It appears all the other parts will work with the Dana 44 just fine.

At this point, purchasing this Dana 44 with 3.45 gears seemed like a no-brainer, so I made the purchase. I have now disassembled everything, smoothed out all the pieces and delivered them to Quality Powder Coating to be done in silver to match the front. The gear set looks like new and I have acquired a new Timkin bearing and seal kit to freshen it up. I am hoping everything will fit and that it will be as quiet as a mouse when it is completed. We will see!




On December 15, 2019

With the onslaught of cooler weather that has hit the west coast, I think its time to make soup. Some of my favorite recipes are shown here. These are good to have now and later because they all freeze very well.

Bacon-Cheddar Cauliflower Chowder

Ingredients (8 1cup servings)

8 slices center-cut bacon, chopped and divided

1/2 small onion, chopped OR 1 tsp. onion powder

1 celery stalk, chopped

2 garlic cloves, minced

salt & pepper

- 4 cups shredded or grated cauliflower
- 2 Tablespoons water
- 2 Tablespoons all purpose flour
- 2 Cups chicken broth, divided
- 2 cups 2% milk
- 3-4 dashes hot sauce (or more or less)
- 2 1/2 cups (12 oz) shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- 2 green onions, chopped (optional)



- 1. Whisk together flour and 1/4 cup chicken broth in a small bowl, then set aside.
- 2. Saute bacon in a large soup pot over medium heat until crisp. Using a slotted spoon, transfer bacon to a paper towel-lined plate, then remove all but 1 Tablespoon drippings from the pot. Add chopped onion (if using), celery and garlic to the pot then season with salt and pepper and saute until vegetables are tender, about 4-5 minutes.
- 3. Add cauliflower and onion powder (if using) to the pot then stir to combine. Add water then place a lid on top and steam cauliflower until tender, stirring a couple times, about 5-7 minutes. Add remaining chicken broth and milk, then turn up heat and bring to boil.
- 4. Slowly whisk in flour/chicken broth mixture while stirring, then turn down heat and simmer for 3-4 minutes, or until chowder has thickened. Turn off heat, then stir in 2 cups cheddar cheese a little at a time until smooth, then stir in half the cooked. Taste and adjust salt, pepper, and/or hot sauce if necessary. Serve topped with remaining shredded cheese, cooked bacon, and green onions, if desired.

Sausage Barley Soup

1 package spicy Italian sausage sautéed in a small amount of olive oil

When sausage starts to brown but is not fully cooked, add the following ingredients in this order:

1 large spanish onion diced

6 large garlilc cloves minced

saute for about 15 minutes on low

3 large fresh carrots diced

4 stalks celery cleaned of leaves and diced

1 Tbsp. Old Bay seasoning

Saute for 20 minutes on medium to brown the veggies

Add: 4-6 diced med red potatoes & sauté for a few more minutes

Add: 1 28 oz canned diced tomatoes

1 cup of barley

Add beef or chicken broth to cover mixture by about 3 inches of liquid

Simmer for about 2 1/2 hours and serve



1/2 pound ground beef

3/4 cup chopped onion

3/4 cup shredded carrots

3/4 cup chopped celery

1 teaspoon dried basil

1 teaspoon dried parsley

4 tablespoons butter

3 cups chicken broth

4 cups cubed potatoes

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

2 cups cubed Cheddar cheese

1 1/2 cups milk

1/4 cup sour cream



- 1. In a large pot, melt 1 tablespoon butter or margarine over medium heat: cook and stir vegetables and beef, until beef is brown.
- 2. Stir in basil and parsley. Add broth and potatoes. Bring to a boil, then simmer until potatoes are tender, about 10-12 minutes.
- 3. Melt the remainder of butter and stir in flour. Add the milk, stirring until smooth.
- 4. Gradually add milk mixture to the soup, stirring constantly. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to simmer. Stir in cheese. When cheese is melted, add sour cream and heat through. Do not boil.




