



With all the hoopla (a road rally, mini car show, cruise-in, golf event and opening night gala) and showmanship of the circus coming to town, the Barrett-Jackson Collector Car Auction arrived at the Orange County Fair Grounds Friday, June 24, for three days of auto-based action. Last year's inaugural local event was fun, though somewhat anti-climatic for auto auction junkies numbed by years of televised exposure to the "big one" - the auction extravaganza from Scottsdale every January. Higher quality cars and buyers willing to spend more freely let this year's local auction of over 325 cars more than meet expectations.

Racing cars, screeching brakes, and the acrid smell of hot tires met us as we went through the gate Friday morning. Pure excitement as Ford Mustang performance drivers put their cars through high-speed maneuvers. At the Chevrolet area, an obligatory lap in a street car was all it took to earn a hot lap in the passenger's seat of a new ZR1 Corvette with a professional driver, an E-Ticket ride if there ever was one!

















Auction sales started slowly. The first car across the block, a 1974 6 passenger Mercury wagon, featuring orange paint and doors that looked like wood grain adhesive-backed paper, brought only \$1,800 hard fought dollars after much auctioneer effort. Several Friday cars were not California emissions compliant; available only to dealers or out-of-state bidders. And several, seemed to just be used cars. "Collector car" is a loose term open to a great amount of interpretation. First day sales of tri-5's were somewhat lackluster, as were the cars, including \$26,000 for a 1955 150 2-door custom coupe; and \$31,000 for a '56 210 custom hardtop.


Tri-5ers Nancy and Tom (Geiman) joined Harvey and I for Saturday's more spirited auction action featuring 30 non-reserve cars from the collection of David Parker, designer of the waterproof container line known as Pelican Cases. Together these cars brought more than \$2million toward the day's total sales, and included a '56 Bel Air 2 door hardtop sold for \$58,000 and a '57 Bel Air convertible for \$80,000. Bringing even bigger dollars - a '57 Bel Air custom convertible for \$97,000 and an impeccable '55 custom Nomad for \$110,000!

I admittedly get vicarious pleasure watching other people spend their money and it's much more fun when they do it with relatively gay abandon. Thrifty I can handle without any outside assistance. I'm already looking forward to next year's event.


The month of June was very productive working on the "Project". I took a week off from work and with Ava busy with her recitals I was able to get alot done.



The positive battery cable was routed along the frame rail and securely clamped at intervals to the starter.



The fuel line and brake line were routed over the rear axel...



The battery has been permanently mounted and a master disconnect switch installed.



An electric fuel pump was mounted on the rear cross member of the frame near the fuel cell. A canister type fuel filter is mounted on the frame rail.



and clamped to the frame to the front.



The master cylinder/booster has been bolted to the firewall as well as a Hurst line lock.




The brake lines have been plumbed and now the car can STOP.



The fuel lines have been connected to the engine mounted fuel pump and to the carburator through a pressure regulator.




An extruded aluminum dual pass transmission cooler has been mounted between the front frame horns and will be tucked behind the front bumper.





The fuse block portion of the wiring harness received my signature zip tie treatment. The mounting bracket was bolted in place on the firewall underneath the dash and the fuse block intalled.








WOW!!! WHAT A LITTLE GEM THE CUCUMBER IS. I WILL LOOK AT IT DIFFERENTLY NOW.




