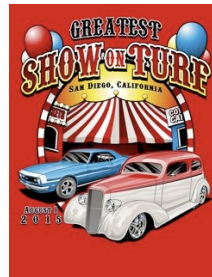

The Kitchen Scoop on Corn Relish

One of my favorite summer cookout condiments was at it's height of popularity in the '50s. A lot of retro foods are showing up again on our tables. And, whether it's a "hot" item or not, I remain a fan of corn relish, sweet, tangy and tasty. It's a nice change from ordinary pickle relish; equally delicious on either hamburgers or hot dogs, and whether you're using fresh corn or frozen, it's equally easy to whip up a batch.

The recipe below makes a sufficient quantity for canning six half-pint jars if you want to keep some on hand. Prefer only a single jar? Just get out your calculator and divide each ingredient amount by six. With it's tangy brine, this corn relish will store for at least a couple of weeks in the refrigerator, if it isn't eaten sooner.



1950's Sweet Corn Relish

This recipe makes 6 1/2-pint jars of relish.

- 1 Tablespoon canola oil
- 3-1/2 Cups diced red pepper (3-4 peppers)
- 1 Tablespoon Kosher salt
- 3-1/2 Cups fresh or thawed frozen corn kernels
- 1-3/4 Cups diced red onion (1 large onion)
- 1-1/2 Cups apple cider vinegar
- 1 Cup sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon ground tumeric

If you are canning the relish, start by sterilizing your jars in a hot water bath canner.

Heat the oil in a large, heavy pot over medium heat. Add peppers and salt and saute 12 minutes until peppers carmelize, stirring from time to time. Peppers will soften and take on a bit of a brownish color.

Add the corn, stir well, cook for an additional 3-4 minutes until the corn is heated through. Add the onion, stir thoroughly, turn off the heat and cover the pot.

For the brine, heat remaining ingredients in a medium pot over medium heat until the mixture boils stirring occasionally.

If canning, process as usual. If not, put vegetable mixture in a jar, add brine to cover, cool, cover and store in the refrigerator.



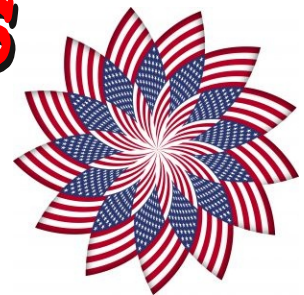
These two project trucks were found in Trapper Creek, AK — the man they belong to has a yard and shop filled with old treasures...

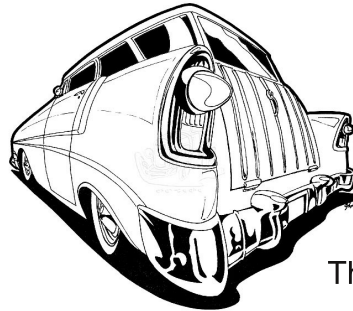
