

You'll want a Kitchen Scoop of This Yummy Salsa

I didn't realize when I was growing up in Western New York State, way back when our Tri-5's were new, that my childhood was terribly lacking...there was no Mexican influence to our meals, no Mexican restaurant to try a yummy burrito or even a cheesy quesadilla. Luckily, as an adult I finally learned what I had been missing!

Here's a terrific salsa recipe my son-in-law Gilbert made the other evening. Quantities of each ingredient are up to you and your personal taste, just chop the first six, put them in a bowl, and add the rest.

Gilbert's Salsa

Tomatoes, preferably Roma variety
Chopped peppers - choose any two: green, red, yellow, orange
Jalapeno pepper
Red onion
Pineapple or mango
Cilantro
Lime juice - a lot of lime juice
Salt
White Pepper
Small quantity of chopped garlic



If you stop now, you already have a great fresh salsa. If you want to make it heartier, add raw shrimp, fish or other seafood and give it time to "cook" in the acid.


