For many years now, the San Diego County Fair at Del Mar has had a venue to display classic cars from local car clubs for fair-going spectators to see. Each day during the fair, two local car clubs have been provided with the opportunity to display and showcase up to eight classic cars. Classic Chevys of San Diego has been participating in this venue for as long as I can remember. There is no fee to participate and you are provided free entry to the fair for up to four people per car. After the show, you have the option to park your car in the green lot and return the to the fair for the rest of the day.

This year, Classic Chevys participated on two dates and we participated on the second date, Wednesday, June 26 along with six other Classic Chevy members. We met in the parking lot behind McDonald's a little before 9 am with our Little Brownie '55 Chevrolet 210 sedan and





joined Dave & Margie Vincent in their blue and white '55 210 sedan, Emory Bishop in his green & white '56 Bel-Air convertible, Sailor Bob Paschal in his two-tone green '56 Bel-Air hardtop, Tim Beall & Theresa Schneider in their '57 black widow replica, George & Sherry Lee in their turquoise & white '56 210 hardtop and Rod & Nancy Hildebrand in their red '57 150 sedan.



At 9 am sharp, we lined up and cruised across the freeway and through the Solana gate past the guard shack where we staged for entry to the display area. Within minutes, six Corvettes from the North County Corvette Club joined us, the second car club participating this day. It was no surprise Sam Rindskopf was driving the lead

Corvette. At 9:30, we were led down the track to the show car area where the cars were to be displayed. Each car was photographed before being positioned in the display area. Usually, there is enough area to properly display all of the cars for easy viewing, but this day, part of the space was being used to display electric cars from Tesla, BMW, etc. That made things a little tight, but it worked out okay.

The cars were quickly roped off and every participant completed a numbered description of their car to be displayed in front where spectators could see. Throughout the day, everyone was allowed to vote for his or her favorite classic.

Then we had about five hours to check out as much of the fair as possible, eat some questionable foods and just enjoy the day.






All in all it was a fun day!






RON FOOTE'S SERVICE

Claudia's Corner

The garden summer harvest is slowly beginning and the zucchini is plentiful in Arizona (maybe in California, too). Here are a few recipes that I've used recently that everyone seems to like.



BAKED ZUCCHINI SQUARES

1 Cup baking mix

1/2 Cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 Tbsp. minced fresh parsley
1 1/2 tsp. Dried oregano
1 1/2 tsp. Dried basil
1/2 tsp. Salt
4 eggs
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1 small onion, chopped
3 medium zucchini, thinly sliced

Combine biscuit mix, cheese, parsley, oregano, basil and salt. Combine eggs, oil and onion; stir into dry ingredients just until combined. Stir in zucchini. Transfer to a greased 12x9x2" baking dish. Bake at 350 for 30 – 35 minutes or until golden brown and set. Cut into squares.

ZUCCHINI OATMEAL COOKIES

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

1/2 cup butter, softened

2/3 cup packed brown sugar

1 egg

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup quick cooking oats

1 cup shredded zucchini

1/2 cup raisins (I substituted Crasins)

Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease baking sheets.

- 1. Stir together the flour, baking soda, cinnamon, and cloves in a bowl; set aside. Beat the butter and brown sugar with an electric mixer in a large bowl until creamy. Add the egg and the vanilla extract. Mix in the flour mixture and oats until just incorporated.
- 2. Wring the zucchini in a clean towel to remove any excess moisture. Stir the zucchini and raisins into the dough; mixing just enough to evenly combine. Drop batter by rounded teaspoonfuls 2-inches apart onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake for 14 to 16 minutes or until the bottom edges turn golden brown.



ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

1 pound carrots, sliced

3 zucchinis, sliced

1/2 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons grated onion

3/4 teaspoon prepared horseradish

1/2 teaspoon salt


1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/2 cup Italian bread crumbs

1/4 cup butter, melted

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Lightly grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.
- 2. Place carrots into a pot and cover with salted water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer until just tender, about 15 minutes. Strain carrots out of the water with a slotted spoon. Add zucchini slices to the pot and simmer until tender, 2 to 3 minutes. Drain, reserving about 1/4 cup cooking liquid.
- 3. Stir reserved cooking liquid into mayonnaise, onion, horseradish, salt, and black pepper in a large bowl. Mix cooked vegetables into mayonnaise mixture until well blended; pour mixture into prepare baking dish.
- 4. Mix bread crumbs and melted butter in a small bowl; sprinkle over vegetables.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven until bread crumbs are lightly browned, about 15 minutes.
