


day with great friends. Mark your calendar because we will be doing it again on Labor Day, Monday September 5th. Walking, shopping, eating and another T5CTournament.

This year the 72nd Annual Western Days kicks off Wednesday, June 1-4, 2022, the Bee & Butterfly Festival. Friday, June 3, Western days Guns & Hoses Chili Cook-off held at Fire Station #1. Also on Friday/Saturday night, right across the street from the chili-cook off the Western Days Festival will have live bands, dancing, a beer garden, food trucks, games for the kids and vendor booths.

# Fallbrook Vintage Car Show

The 55th annual Fallbrook Vintage Car Show took place on May 29 at the Bates Nut Farm in Valley Center. This Car Show is advertised as the longest running car show west of the Mississippi. Registration was open to all cars, trucks and motorcycles 25 years or older. More than 450 entries paid the \$35 entry fee to pre-register for the show and no day of show entries were accepted. There were awards, posters, show merchandise, swap vendors, food vendors, and a live DJ playing some of our favorite tunes. This year's featured car was the Chevrolet Corvair and there were about thirty of them parked in rows at the top of the grassy area.



This was a new location for this show, which was previously held on a golf Course in Fallbrook. Apparently, the Golf Course has a new owner who does not want to host car

shows, hence the move to Bates Nut Farm. Most people are quite familiar with car shows at Bates Nut Farm and know they advertise it as being on

the grass. In reality, there isn't all that much real grass. It is actually a little bit of grass with a lot of weeds mixed in, gopher holes and plenty of dust. Nevertheless, it is actually a pretty nice location for a car show with an abundance of space for parking cars.





Gates were advertised to open at 7 am and cars had to be parked by 10 am. Linda and I got up early and arrived with our two entries at Bates at 6:40 am. Much to our surprise, there were over 200 cars already there. We were directed to two of the last few spots on the east side next to several vendors. Sam & Donna Rindskopf arrived a few minutes later and we were lucky enough to talk the parking guy into letting them park close to us. The Geiman's and Dana Stevens came a little later and were parked on the west side away from the main activity area.







It was overcast and a bit drizzly early on, but the clouds opened up and made way for partial sunshine by 9 am. We cleaned up the cars, opened up the hoods, and placed fire extinguishers near the left front wheel, which was required to be judged for an award. Then we were off to get some breakfast. There were several food vendors to choose from and we choose a breakfast burrito that was very tasty. Then we went off to visit with all of the vendors and to see all of the entries. There were quite a few cars we had not seen before and some were quite interesting, like the barn find Ford Gran Torino with a life-like cutout of Clint Eastwood behind the wheel and a 1956 Cadillac Fleetwood Sixty Special with a life-like Virginia Ruth Egnor in the backseat who became an overnight sensation as Jeannie Lewis, a sexy dumb blonde on NBC in the early 50's. A Mercedes ambulance, a Subaru minivan, a Ford COE crew cab tractor and some restored early Packards were among many of the entries we see at almost every show.

After grabbing some lunch, getting goodies from the store, and sitting around the cars for a while, it was soon time for the awards. There were forty awards for various categories and as winners were announced, Miss Teen Fallbrook and First Princesses were there to present the awards. Along with the award, each winner received a box of avocados. They were down to the last five awards when they got to "Best Engine Bay." The announcer said it was a difficult choice between two cars. I was totally surprised to hear him call my name for that award. The last award was the Miss Teen Fallbrook choice, and it went to our very own Dana Stevens, who also went away with a box of avocados with the win. Immediately after the awards, cars were leaving like a stampede of buffalo. Within minutes almost everyone was gone. This was a very nice show and except for being a bit dusty, it checked a lot of boxes needed for a successful event. Congratulations to Dana on her win!

Tri-Five Ladies Day



We know there is a lot going on this summer but if your interested in starting the monthly Ladies Day up again, we need your suggestions. Email or text your ideas to Ava.



To remove muffins or rolls from a pan, set it on an old, damp towel for a minute. The steam will loosen the bottoms and they will slide right out.

Use baking soda to scrub away stuck-on food on your grill. Sprinkle it on the metal brush and scrub away. If your grate is beyond the power of fire and baking soda, remove it and lay it on some newspaper spread on the ground. Pray with oven cleaner and let sit. Rinse with a garden hose and replace it on the grill.

Mix a quarter cup of salt in with two tablespoons of bath wash for a sudsy, refreshing, skin-soothing salt scrub.

The sticky residue from price tags can be really annoying. Use WD-40 to get it off.

Sprinkle baby powder in rubber dish gloves to help them slide on in an instant. You can also use corn starch in a pinch.

Need a patch for old woodwork? Mix paint and flour. Make a paste, fill in the holes and let dry. It's hard like cement and can be sanded if necessary before painting.

Painting stairs? Paint every other step to start with. When they are dry, go back and paint the others. This way, you can use the staircase anytime during the project.

These recipes are refreshing summer fruit salads for picnics. (Easy, too!)

### **GRAPE SALAD**

2 lb. green seedless grapes

2 lb. red seedless grapes

In a bowl cream together the following:

8 oz. sour cream

8 oz. cream cheese

½ cup white sugar

1 tsp. almond extract

Pour over grapes and mix .Topping:

• Mix together the following:

1/2 cup coconut flakes

<sup>■</sup> ½ cup brown sugar (light)

½ cup almond pieces

In the bottom of another bowl, put a small amount of coconut flakes and pour in grape mixture. Then sprinkle topping over top.

### WATERMELON SALAD

3 tablespoons lime juice

1 cup sliced red onion, cut lengthwise

15 cups cubed watermelon

Seedless Watermelon

3 cups cubed English cucumber

1 (8 ounce) package feta cheese, crumbled

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro


cracked black pepper

sea salt

In a small bowl, pour lime juice over red onions.

Allow to marinate while assembling the salad.

Gently combine the watermelon, cucumber, feta cheese, and cilantro in a large bowl. Season with black pepper. Toss watermelon salad with marinated onions and season with sea salt just before serving.





# **Brothers 23rd Annual Show 'N Shine**

Brothers Classic Chevy & GMC Truck Parts In Corona advertises as being America's #1 Source for 1947-1987 Chevrolet & GMC classic & custom truck parts. If you are looking for classic Chevy or GMC truck parts, they are a good source, as they have thousands of original and custom truck parts.

Brothers has been sponsoring an all Chevrolet and GMC truck show for over two decades and the show is only open to 1947 to 1987 Chevrolet & GMC trucks. For the last few years, the show has been held at Oak Canyon Park, Silverado, in Orange County and has been limited to 600 entries. They claim it is the Classic Chevy & GMC Truck Event of the year and has some of the best trucks from around the nation. In reality, it is a huge display of daily drivers, work trucks, and a hand full of really nice restored or custom trucks. About half of the entries are modified low rider trucks in various condition. A great majority of the trucks have faded paint, dents, rust and lots of evidence they have been used and abused. Nevertheless, this is where you have a great opportunity to see a lot of cool trucks all in one fun location.

There are several food trucks on site with just about any kind of food you may like, including burgers, hot dogs, Mexican food, an ice cream truck and a funnel cake truck for those with a sweet tooth. There is a huge raffle with lots of great prizes. A live band plays on and off all day playing mostly country music. Numerous vendors are along the edges of the park mostly selling items related to the trucks at the show.

Linda and I left the house with her '69 Chevrolet C20 pickup at 6:15 am and arrived at Oak Canyon Park at 7:45 am. As we followed the narrow-paved road into the park, we saw a line of trucks waiting in line to get parked. Dozens more came up behind us. It took another 30 minutes to worm our way in to our parking space, which by that time was on the far west side of the park, almost in the corner. We set up our chairs and popup, cleaned up the truck, and headed to registration to get our



goody bag. Then it was time for a breakfast burrito before starting our trek around the park to see all the trucks. We had a voting card to write down the numbers of our favorite 20 trucks. Although the flyer said the show was limited to 600 entries, there were nearly 700 on the grounds.



The last time we went to this show, Linda won a bicycle and a couple other items. This time we bought a bunch of raffle tickets and all we won was one ice cream from the Screamin' Ice Cream truck. At 2:00 pm, the awards for the top 20 were announced. Within minutes after that, trucks were leaving and heading home.

Interestingly enough, the host of the show talked at length about the recent sale of the company and seemed to be going a little overboard thanking everyone for being loyal customers

and longtime participants in the show, and saying he hoped to see us all there next year. Later we learned that they are closing the store in Corona and moving their entire operation to Holley's new state-of-the-art 400,000 square-foot facility in Bowling Green Kentucky. So, I think it seems unlikely there will be another Brothers Truck Show here in California. I guess we'll see.


