


We were all deeply saddened by the loss of the Rindskopfs' grandson Blaise.

Tri-5 Thefis Continue to be a Hot Discussion Topic

As the number of Southern California classic car thefts rises, ideas how to safeguard our Tri-5's continue to be a popular topic of conversation whenever enthusiasts get together. Some new information was shared by Darryl of D&P Classic Chevys at the recently completed 2009 Gambler Classic in Laughlin.

According to Darryl, who has written several articles on classic car security for various automotive publications, the car thieves often work in concert with service drivers: cab drivers, low truck drivers and code enforcement workers, whose jobs often take them into residential neighborhoods. A classic car parked outside, even for a short time, or visible through an open garage door, can easily be spotted and noted by these individuals who we so commonly see near our homes that they are practically invisible to us.

For those with pockets deep enough to match their level of concern about security for their classic, the ultimate protection is a combination of an alarm system featuring a satellite tracking device and telephone notification feature teamed with an alarmed security fence surrounding where the vehicle is stored.

A more modest solution, in addition to the battery ground cable disconnect most all of us have installed, is to also disconnect your automatic garage door opener whenever you're going to be away from home overnight.






