

Cruisin' Grand on May 20th.



On Saturday morning, a parade of classics and hotrods made the run to the Navy Hospital to pickup Wounded Warriors and bring those able to attend to the show for the day. This year unfortunately, only a few were able to attend.

OTHG puts on a really big raffle with hundreds of general raffle items, a bunch of big tickets items and a 50/50 pot. Every year, there seems to be competition among the people we know to see who can win the most and coolest prizes. Last year, we won none. This year, we won a 12-volt car vacuum and thermos cup case, a Costco Cash card, an Outback cash card, a ladies basket, a drill bit accessory set, Snap-on multi-tool plier tools and a Hemi Charger clock, and one more item we can't seem to remember. After over 10 years of Streaking, we still have no big-ticket item or 50/50 wins, but every year we keep trying.



EVERYDAY TIPS

To rewhiten socks or wash cloths, try boiling a pot of water and adding a sliced, juiced lemon. Soak the items for at least an hour and then pick out the lemon and add the items – water & all – to a load of wash.

Wintergreen oil makes a lovely room freshener. Put two drops on a cotton ball and tuck it into the cushions of your couch or hide it anywhere out of the way. The scent lingers for about a week.



Magic Bars

From the kitchen of Nancy Geiman

1 1/2 cup Graham Cracker crumbs

1/2 cup margarine

1 - 12 oz pkg Nestles' Chocolate Chips

1 - 12 oz pkg Nestles' Butterscotch Chips

1 cup coconut flakes

1 cup chopped nuts

1 can Eagle Brand Condensed Milk

- Melt margarine and put with graham cracker crumbs, mix and spread evenly in 9" x 13" pan.
- Sprinkle chocolate and butterscotch chips evenly over crumbs.
- Then sprinkle coconut and nuts over the chips.
- Pour the can of condensed milk evenly over top.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Watch carefully, so they don't brown too much on the edges.
- Let cool and cut into squares.

Really, really good!



KEY LIME

from the Kitchen of Claudia Gayhart really easy recipe

1 can - 14 oz sweetened condensed milk
34 cup frozen limeade concentrate thawed
1 small container (8 OZ) Cool whip
2 - 3 drops green food coloring
1 graham cracker curst (9 inch)

Combine milk, limeade and frozen topping. Fold until well blended. Add enough food coloring for just a hint of green. Pour mixture into crust. Refrigerate until chilled through or freeze until firm.

Cinnamon Swirl Bread

From the kitchen of Ann Goldberg

Makes 2 loafs
Bakes at 375-degrees

7 to 7-1/2 cups all purpose flour 2 packages active dry yeast

2 cups milk½ cup sugar½ cup shortening2 teaspoons salt

2 eggs

Filling: <u>Icing</u>

½ cup sugar 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted

2 teaspoons cinnamon ¼ teaspoon vanilla

1-1/2 to 2 Tablespoons milk

In large mixing bowl combine $3-\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour and yeast. In saucepan heat milk, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, shortening and salt until warm (115-120 degrees) stirring constantly to melt shortening. Add to dry mixture. Add eggs. Beat a low speed for 30 seconds scraping sides of bowl constantly. Beat 3 minutes at high speed. By hand, stir in enough of the remaining flour to make a moderately soft dough.

Turn out on lightly floured surface and knead until smooth and elastic (5-8 minutes). Shape into ball and place in lightly greased bowl. Cover; let rise in warm place until double, about 1 hour.

Punch down dough; turn out on lightly floured surface. Divide in half; cover; let rise 10 minutes. Roll each half into a 15 x 17-inch rectangle. Brush entire surface with water. Combine filling ingredients. Equally spread on the two rectangles. Roll each as a jelly roll. Seal ends, placing each loaf into a greased 9 x 5 x3-inch pan. Cover; let rise in warm place until almost doubled (35-45 minutes).

Bake 25-45 minutes. If crust browns too quickly, cover with foil last 15 minutes. Remove bread from pans and place on wire rack to cool.

If desired, drizzle with icing. Make icing by mixing all ingredients in a small bowl until well-mixed and semi-runny consistency.

A family favorite for years. Well worth the effort -- this is great buttered as bread or toast and absolutely terrific when you use it to make French Toast!!


