My paternal grandmother Mim, Wilhemina Brumstead Powell, made a killer lemon meringue pie. It was her trademark, much in demand by family members and friends. Unfortunately, she took the recipe for this pie that was perfection to her grave. It was beautiful to look at -- golden tipped peaks of meringue; it was delicious -- flakey crust with a rich, full bodied, and boldly colored lemon filling. And, it was not in her collection of hand-written recipes, the one thing I asked for when she passed.

So started my quest to find another "perfect" lemon pie. Matching the crust was relatively easy. As long as I was willing to ingest lard, I could replicate it with no problem. The lemon filling remained more elusive. I've tried numerous recipes; none could match my memories. Instead, I now use lemon curd as a replacement. My favorite recipe makes a huge batch. Luckily leftover curd has a long storage life. And, it's versatile. Besides pie filling, lemon curd can be used for tarts or as a sauce over angel food cake, pound cake or gingerbread (then top with fruit and/or whipped cream for near-total decadence), or, used as a spread on English muffins or scones. Should you feel like sharing, a jar of lemon curd also makes a welcome hostess gift.

Lemon Curd

(Makes 5-1/2 cups)

Zest of 5 lemons (the colored part of the peel only; the white pith is bitter and you do not want to include it)

1 cup plus 2 Tablespoons lemon juice (from 5-7 lemons)

1-1/2 cups white sugar

½ teaspoon salt

6 whole eggs

12 egg volks

1 cup plus 2 Tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into small pieces

Add zest, lemon juice, sugar, salt, eggs and yolks to the top of a double boiler. Whisk over medium heat being careful not to let the water in the lower pot touch the insert (the pot you're working in) or to let the water in the lower pot boil. Heat slowly to 160-165 degrees on an instant read thermometer inserted 2-inches deep into the mixture.

Whisk for approximately 15 minutes, until the curd thickens. Continue whisking as you add the butter, one piece at a time. Strain completed curd into another bowl or serving dish, it will continue to thicken as it cools. Store it the refrigerator for up to 3 weeks, or freeze for later enjoyment.




