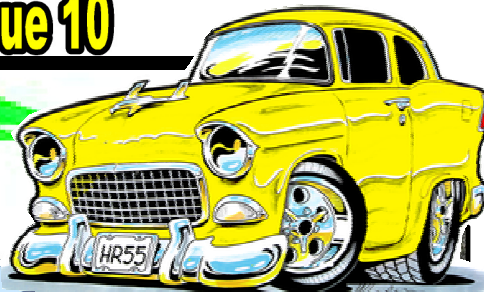

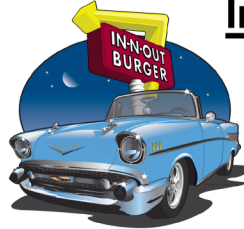

The Kitchen Scoop

about Zucchini



When I was a child, the squash I knew were the winter varieties, Butternut, Hubbard and Acorn. While I'm sure it was popular in a lot of areas, when our Tri-5's were new, I don't recall ever eating a dish with zucchini or even seeing it in either Gerry Woodstock's Red & White grocery or Danny Mahre's independent market in Oakfield.

Years later when I moved into my first home that was an actual house, I planted a vegetable garden - carrots, lettuce, spinach and pumpkins from seed; a few green peppers, lots of tomatoes, and two or three zucchini from small plants. The soil was good, the weather conditions right, and that little garden in Fort Collins, Colorado flourished. Especially the zucchini.

I didn't just harvest zucchini, I harvested lots of zucchini. I served them sautéed; raw in salads and cut into sticks for snacks; added them to my homemade pasta sauce and casseroles; I baked, and froze, zucchini bread, zucchini cake and zucchini cookies. While my family grew very tired of zucchini that summer, my 1978 edition of *Colorado Cache Cookbook*, recipes gathered by The Junior League of Denver, included 14 different ways to prepare them, the most complex Zucchini Roulade where the grated squash are made into a batter with 20 other ingredients, baked, then rolled jelly roll-style and served with Mornay sauce.

Now I purchase just the amount of zucchini I want, when I want it, from the produce aisle. Here's a much less complicated recipe for you to enjoy:

Grilled Zucchini Rolls with Herbs and Cheese

Wash, and dry well on paper towels, baby spinach leaves, fresh basil and parsley sprigs.

Wash zucchini, cut each squash into thirds and core.

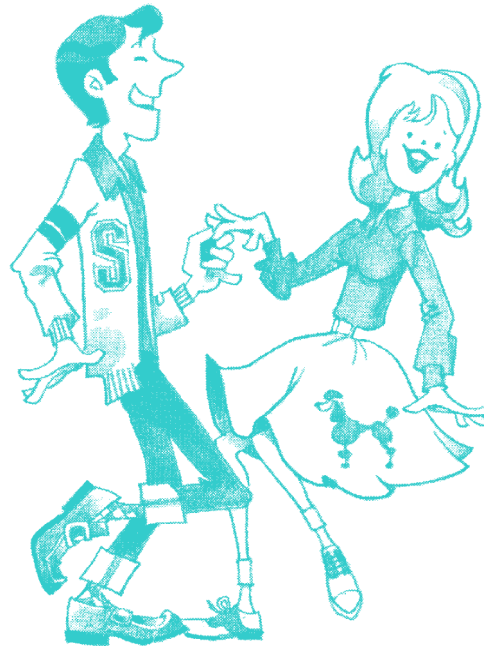
Chop basil and parsley and blend, with a little salt and pepper, into reduced fat goat's cheese you've brought to room temperature.

Lay out a few spinach leaves, drop a line of the cheese mixture down the center. Roll and stuff filling into one of the zucchini pieces.

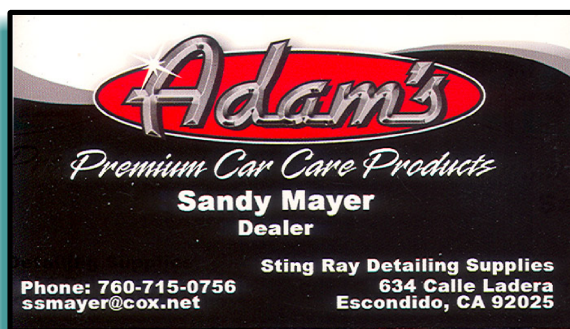
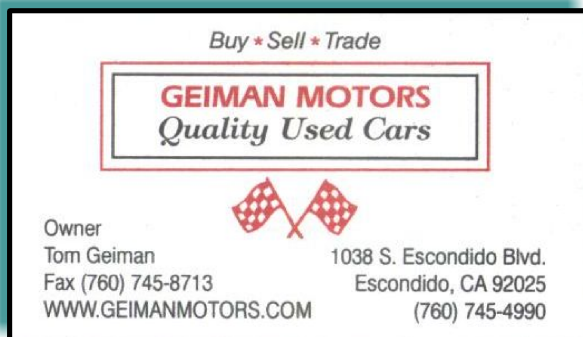
Brush zucchini pieces with olive oil and grill over medium-high heat for a few minutes on each side until you have nice grill marks all around.

If you want to try something a little more adventuresome, or find yourself with an over abundance of zucchini, there's the Paderno Spiralizer (available at Williams-Sonoma) to form the squash into spaghetti-like strands you can serve with sauce. Seems they must still be a prolific crop.
