# 5150 Rat Rods Car Club Happening Car Show

The Happening Car show at Bates Nut Farm in Valley Center has been going on for a lot of years, however the Heartbeat Classics Car Club is no longer putting it on. The 5150 Rat Rods Car Club has taken it over and their first event happened on April 27th. Sam & Donna Rindskopf, Dana Stevens, and Linda & I decided to take in this show, and we all paid our \$30 entry fee to sign up.

The weather in April was sometimes good and sometimes not so much. This day was one of those "not so much" days. It had been raining the day before and it continued to rain on & off on the morning of the show. We encountered a bit of heavy rain on the trip to Valley Center, but upon arrival, there was no more rain, it was just very cool and breezy. Despite the less than great weather conditions, the turnout was quite good.

While the weather wasn't ideal, it was tolerable and one of the highlights of the show was the valve cover races. Racers had to be made from an automotive engine valve cover, no more than 30 inches long and not wider than ten inches. There must be four wheels no larger than six inches and they cannot extend beyond the front of the racer. They cannot be more than ten pounds and can only be propelled by gravity. There were at least thirty entries. Each contest was the best of three races. It was really fun to see the different designs and the lengths people go to in order to win. No, I'm not going to build one.

As always at Bates for this show, there were a bunch of vendors on the grassy area up by the store selling their handmade wares. Food trucks were on hand to feed the hungry, and a DJ was playing really nice tunes from the 50's & 60's. We split a breakfast burrito, visited all the vendors, did a little shopping at the store, and then saw all the entries and watched the valve cover races for a while.

By 2:00 pm when it was award time, we had on & off sun, and it was a bit warmer. Everyone came to the stage area where the awards were to be announced. Awards were all handmade with different automotive parts and used tools by members of the 5150 Rat Rods members. All three T5R attendees were winners and took home one of those unique awards.





Despite the rainy forecast, we only had a couple very short sprinkles during the day that required wiping down the car down. When we checked the raffle board, we saw that we had finally won our very first ever raffle prize at this show. Later, we made our second win, a \$50 gift certificate for the Bluewater grill just down the street from the show.
