Donna and I hopped in our 57 Chevy Nomad and drove up to Morro Bay the Wednesday before the Cruisin Morro Bay Car Show. We decided to make it a long weekend and planned on staying until Monday. We've been wanting to go to the Cruisin Morro Bay Car Show forever. Back in the late '60s and early '70s, we were stationed at Vandenberg Air Force Base, and we fell head over heels for the Central California Coast. I spent a lot of

time diving there, collecting red abalone, lobster, crab, Pismo clams, and spearfishing. We ate very well! I even have a special recipe for abalone using cracker crumbs, Anaheim peppers, and jack cheese—just thinking about it makes my mouth water! On weekends, if I wasn't diving, Donna and I would drive up to Pismo Beach, rent horses, and take a leisurely ride along the beach. We absolutely loved spending time in Solvang, Pismo Beach, Avila, and Morro Bay.

We spent Thursday exploring Morro Bay. We had a blast seeing the sea otters in the bay, walking to

the base of and around the famous Morro Bay Rock, and of course, we had to snap a picture with our Nomad and the Rock. We checked out the waterfront shops and restaurants. We had clam chowder (made from locally sourced clams) and fish tacos while being watched by a couple of seagulls.



We also found a saltwater taffy store

with hundreds of flavors; we bought a couple of pieces almost every flavor they had. We had a delicious seafood dinner at Dorn's Restaurant with a view overlooking the fishing fleet, the bay and of course the Rock.



On Friday, we met up with our friend Will in his red 55 Chevy hardtop along with 80 other classics and

hot rods for the drive-up Highway 1 up to Ragged Point. We passed San Simeon and Hearst Castle, and some spectacular coastline. We enjoyed a great lunch at the Ragged Point Restaurant and the breathtaking views from the point. On the way back we stopped to check out the elephant seal viewpoint. Donna spent some time talking with a knowledgeable ranger/volunteer. She got to feel a sample of the elephant seal fur, which is very coarse. There must have been several hundred female elephant seals on the beach, the males are all out to sea this time of year according to the ranger. We loved seeing groups of pelicans fly by just over our heads. Friday night, we did the parade in downtown, the spectators turned out and seemed to really enjoy seeing all the classic cars and hot rods.





Saturday morning, we were up at 4:30 a.m. after a quick shower and some coffee we made the short drive to the show area. We were told by one of the show volunteers you could not park before 6:00 a.m. Well, when we got there the show area at 6:00 a.m. and the streets were already packed. We were fortunate enough to find a decent parking spot on Main Street, near the center of action. Most of the show cars park on Morro Bay Blvd. Almost as soon as we got parked it started drizzling and it was cool, so we sat in the car and sipped our coffee. The drizzle quit around 9:00 a.m. and the clouds began to make way for the sun around 11:00 a.m. making way for a beautiful day. We enjoyed visiting with our



friends Will, Scott and Mary, Dave and several other friends who drove up from our area. We parked next to a couple of folks from Fresno, Merle and Dina and their very clean Nova, and the guy next to



them with a nice 55 Nomad, unfortunately, I have forgotten his name. I also talked with another guy who was restoring a 55 Nomad; he showed me pictures and told me he had cut out a lot of rust around the drip rails and replaced it with new metal. This guy really nailed it! He was driving a 66 Chevelle, and the metalwork under the hood was just stunning. There were so many cool cars there, most of which we hadn't seen before. I've included pictures of a jeep

that was truly unique but incredibly well done. We were surprised and thrilled when our name was called for one of the show awards—it was the perfect ending to a fantastic weekend in Morro Bay.

On Sunday morning, we packed up and drove an hour to the charming Danish town of Solvang. After checking into our hotel, we spent the afternoon exploring the shops and soaking in the Danish-style architecture. We even tried a truly Danish treat called aebleskiver, which are fluffy, sugar-dusted pancake ball with raspberry jam and ice cream—delicious! We picked up a few mementos of our visit and enjoyed a delicious dinner at a local restaurant before calling it a day. Monday morning arrived too soon, and we packed up and headed home. The drive down the coast brought back memories of my days making that drive on weekends from Vandenberg to Orange to visit my bride to be Donna. What an amazing long weekend on the Central California Coast!

The Over the Hill Gang (OTHG) Streak has been one of our favorite shows for 26 years and for us it is another event that is more like a mini vacation than a car show. In reality it is much more than a car show with camping. It's playing Bingo on Thursday night, a giant raffle on Friday and Saturday, a BBQ lunch on Saturday, a morning poker walk on Saturday, a DJ playing great tunes and trivia questions for prizes, and of course a lot of classic cars and classic friends making for a really good time.

This year's Streak at Campland on the Bay officially happened on Friday & Saturday, May 8th & 9th. We like to go a couple days early to camp for several days, so we arrived on Wednesday along with Tom & Nancy Geiman. Rich & Therese Correia came in for camping on Thursday. After setting up camp in our favorite space J20, we went to lunch and did a little grocery shopping. Later we played a couple games of Five Crowns and cooked up some homemade spaghetti with Texas Toast for dinner.



On Thursday, we did a little running around doing errands before getting in a little relaxation at camp and later attending bingo in the big white tent. Suzanne Stephens was calling the numbers for about 30 people competing for prizes. The fun is as much about playing the game of Bingo as it is about winning and there were quite a few happy winners along the way. It was also an opportunity to get early pick up of registration packets.

Friday is the day participants are allowed to park cars on the grass for the event and there are always early birds jockeying for their favorite spots at 6 am. I'm not sure why it is so important for people to get their car on the grass that early as the entire show area is relatively small and there are no real power parking spots. We brought our cars in around 10 am and were parked in a good place next to some of the earlybirds. T5R members joining Linda & me for the Streak were the Tom & Nancy Geiman, Rich & Therese Correia, Rod & Nancy Hildebrand, Don Perkins, Jerry & Cappy Taylor & Suzanne Stevens. Apologies if I missed anyone.



Friday is also when there is an early opportunity to purchase raffle tickets while the odds of winning are better than Saturday when thousands more tickets are in the big yellow drum. We bought early tickets and won a few prizes at the 3 pm & 4 pm drawings. We heard seven different people bought an entire roll of tickets for a mere \$500 each. No wonder why the drum was so full!

Friday and Saturday mornings both started with a bake sale and Paul Palombo playing tunes and giving away small prizes to those who could answer his music trivia questions. Paul also played tunes for the Friday night beach bonfire and street dance from 7 pm to 10 pm,

The poker walk started activities off on Saturday, followed by the Little Miss Streak and Little Mr. Hotrod contest for kids four to eight years old. The Corn Hole Tournament was back, but we didn't play because it started at noon and went well into the afternoon when there are so many other activities going on. Lunch on Saturday was the same as in years past with the usual pulled pork, chicken, beans, coleslaw and rolls.



During the day, OTHG judges made their way around the car show area looking for the Top Ten trophy winners, Lady's Choice and Chairman's Pick. Representatives from the Warrior Foundation were again making presentations about their Wounded Warrior Program.



Awards were announced at 2 pm, beginning with sponsors of the show being recognized individually for their generosity in support of the Streak. Congratulations go out to Rich & Therese Correia for winning one of those Bill Hume one-of-a-kind hand-made coveted awards. After the awards came the last round of raffle ticket draws before getting to the big ticket items. Lots of fun stuff there like a tool box, two \$500 cash in frames, jewelry, a tv and so much more. I'm still waiting for my first win of one of those big prizes.

The Saturday night band was eliminated due to poor attendance over the last couple years. A decision was made to replace the live band with a Saturday night beach party hosted by Paul Palombo playing all disco music on the street by the water. The street was closed off, and a bonfire was lit on the beach. Light sticks with pretty flashing blue, red & yellow lights were handed out to everyone who came out for the dance. It was a lot of fun and a successful change of venue with well over 50 people coming out to enjoy a flashback to the seventies and some of the best Disco music of that era.

As always, we look forward to this show every year and it always comes and goes too fast. As of now, it appears there will be a Streak 54 and a Streak 55. Campland has increased the cost to use this venue, and in fact OTHG has to pay up front for two years in advance to assure the event can take place. They have asked participants to register now or as soon as possible for next year's event to help them cover the costs. We really enjoy this show, so we hope they get the support they need to continue the Streak tradition.

TEMECULA ROD RUN 2026

Temecula grew from just a wide spot in the road to a bustling city over the last few decades and it now has everything you would expect to find in a large city. Temecula also has the annual two-day Temecula Rod Run Classic Car Show and this year the show was held on Friday May 1 & Saturday May 2.

The show is put on by the City of Temecula, and it all starts on a Friday night with a cruise up and down Front Street from 5 pm to 8 pm. Over the years this cruise has become very popular because of



the cars, the numerous restaurants and bars along Front Street, and the electric atmosphere of it all. There were so many participants that it became a gridlock traffic jam with many cars experiencing overheating issues. A couple years ago, they decided to limit the number of vehicles allowed to cruise and they began selling a limited number of cruise tickets for a ten dollar fee, separate from the show & shine on Saturday. Tickets sell out quickly and need to be purchased on-line almost immediately when sales open. This year, we were able to score one of those elusive cruise tickets and we attended the cruise.

Weather was perfect for the event and thousands of people came out to watch the cars cruise. We parked the convertible on Front Street while we went for dinner at Texas Lil's. Then we decided to cruise with the top down, and it was awesome to see the thousands of people enjoying the night's event. As we cruised up and down Front Street, spectators were several rows deep on both sides of the street for several blocks in each direction. Officials estimated 30,000 spectators showed up for the two-day event.

We also had a reserved space for the Saturday Show & Shine on Main Street just a short distance from Front Street. Sam Milazzo as the only other T5R/CCSD member we saw at the show. There were 575 paid entries with only a few no shows. Entries were required to be in their space by 8 am for the 9 am start of the show. We cleaned up the car and made our way around to see as many of the entries as we could. There were a lot of really nice cars and a lot of weird ones too. As the day went by, we were able to see a lot of cool cars and chat with many people we know.



There was a contest where five “Gold Gas Cans” were randomly put in show cars and if you were able to identify the location of all five by space numbers, your name would be put in a drawing for a prize. They were not full size, only a few inches in size and attached on the inside of the windshield with a suction cup device. One was in a Nova SS right across the street from our space. This little game was designed to assure spectators would be looking at every entry until they found them all. We didn’t play, but a lot of people did.



After a couple hours of doing our own spectating, we decided it was time for food. We discovered a breakfast place called Haven Haus and decided to give it a try. On the menu they had what they called a “Breakfast Board” that consisted of bacon, sausage, eggs, fruit, pancakes, waffles and French toast. It was whole lot of really good food for two and we couldn’t eat it all, taking some of it home with us. After we ate, we did more spectating and ultimately found the ice cream vendor for a nice cold cup of swirled ice cream.



At 3:30 pm, it was time for the awards presentation. There were 23 different categories for awards and of course a “Best of Show” award. There was also ten Judge’s picks. With so few awards for so many cars, it is a very difficult show to win an award. We have attended this show several times without a win, but our luck was about to change. This year, our convertible caught the eye of one of the judges and we were awarded a “Judge’s Pick” award. That was cool!

This was a really nice show with a lot of really nice cars and nice people. There are speakers all up and down the street making it easy to hear the announcer and the music, which was also very nice. There is always an abundance of food vendors and restaurants to choose from. But if you want to attend, sign up early if you want a space, it sells out early. Maybe we’ll see you there!

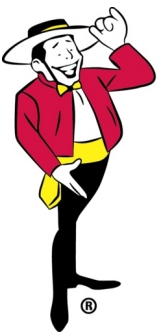

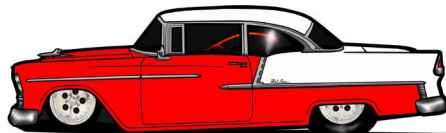

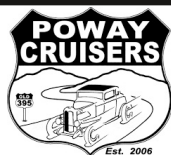

Last year's weather was another one of those "not so good" days, cool with rain showers in the forecast. It was overcast this year for most of the day with no rain, perfect for a car show. I believe there were about 300 entries. There were numerous high-end cars, a huge raffle, a live band and a large number of spectators and as always, a lot of our four-legged furry friends too.

This year's show was pretty much the same as in previous years with goody bags, tee shirts and window placards being handed out from the registration tent as we drove in. The window placard for Linda's truck had the number 310 and was in the Modified Truck Class.

The raffle had around 100 items, mostly provided by Coronado based businesses. Last year we were very lucky to win three nice prizes. First it was a \$50 gift certificate to the Blue Water Grill, then it was a \$50 gift certificate for Miguel's Cocina and finally we won a \$750 gift certificate for a two-night stay at the Glorietta Bay Inn, former mansion of San Diego magnate and sugar company heir John Spreckels, built in 1908 by architect Harrison Albright. We recently took advantage of these winning, spending two days in Coronado. This year, we were lucky again, winning a one night's stay at the Hotel Del Coronado with meals, a \$100 certificate for a San Diego car wash business, and a four-bottle pack of wine.

The show car area is rather large and is spread out along several blocks. At the end of the show, all of the first place winners bring their cars to the front of the show area for display during the award ceremony, where the Mayor and other Coronado officials participated in the awards ceremony. After the awards, tickets were redrawn for the unclaimed raffle prizes. The grand prize, an electric bike was the last bit of business for the day. No, we didn't win that one.

Coronado is a very nice location for a car show, and we always enjoy the cars, the food and the atmosphere that Coronado provides. We just need more of our car club friends to join us next year.
