He removed the gas filler door from the left rear fender and welded in a patch panel to make it look like the door was never there, and he is currently working on making the gaps between doors and fenders perfect.






### IRISH SODA BREAD

from the Kitchen of Claudia Gayhart


- 4 cups flour
- 1 ½ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 1 ½ cups buttermilk
- 1 cup raisins (optional)

Preheat oven to 375F degrees. Combine flour, salt, soda, and gradually mix in enough buttermilk to make a soft dough. it is smooth. Form into ball and place on greased and floured baking sheet. Cut a shallow cross through center of loaf. Bake at 375F for 40 - 50 minutes.


