Kitchen Scoop for St. Patrick's Day

When I was a girl, and our Tri-5's were new, each St. Patrick's Day meant a new green hair ribbon from Grandpa Bert, by father's father; a ribbon he had picked out himself. He was of Irish descent, and wanted his all three of his grand daughters to remember it. It was about as traditional as we were as a family when it came to celebrating St. Patrick's Day. There was no corned beef and cabbage for dinner. In Oakfield, New York where I grew up, the only corned beef I knew came in a rectangular tin that opened with a key;. And, boiled cabbage was a foul smelling part of the weight loss plan Dr. Warren prescribed for my pudgy father.

Here are two alternative Irish dishes I think you'll enjoy: an entree of fish and a wonderful dessert. The flavors are authentic, an opportunity to try something different this Saint Patrick's Day.

Irish Roasted Salmon

Serves 4

2 Tablespoons honey
1/4 cup cider vinegar
1/4 cup Irish whiskey
2 teaspoons chopped fresh thyme
1-1/2 teaspoons grated lemon zest
2 Tablespoons vegetable oil
salt & freshly ground pepper
4 (6 ounce) salmon fillets



Mix honey, vinegar, whiskey, thyme, lemon zest, oil, salt and pepper. Pour over salmon and marinate 1 hour at room temperature or 4 hours refrigerated.

Preheat oven to 450 degrees.

Remove salmon from marinade and place on a rack in a roasting pan.

Bake for 10-12 minutes until golden and white juices are just beginning to appear, basting once with the marinade.

More Kitchen Scoop

Ultimate Irish Apple Cake

Serves 10-12

- 4 Tablespoons butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg
- 4 Granny Smith apples, cored, peeled and diced (2 cups)
- 1/4 cup chopped walnuts
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 cup all purpose flour

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Generously grease an 8-inch square cake pan

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy.

Add egg, apples nuts and vanilla. Stir well. Pour batter into prepared pan and bake about 45 minutes, until cake is lightly browned and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.

Remove from oven and let cake cook in pan 5 minutes, then remove from pan.

Serve warm or at room temperature with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.



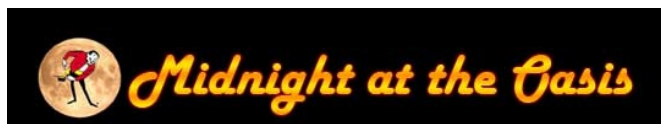
