A lot of Classic Chevys and Tri-Five Revolution members showed up for this event. I saw Leon Smythe, Mike Clark, Rich Correia, Rod Hildebrand, Sailor Bob, Chet Campbell, Harold Poyner, Jim & Joan Price, Leroy & Marsha Amundson and Paul Palombo. There may have been others, as there were lots and lots of people there.



## Perkins' Projects

The last Perkins' Projects article included a short clip about his '58 Buick wagon and the problems he was having with making it run on a Holly Sniper fuel injection system. After realizing the engine was just too radical for the street, he had to decide what to do next. Since then, that engine has been removed and disassembled, confirming that it was never going to be usable for any kind of use on the street without some major modifications. So, Don purchased a brand-new GM 454 crate motor like the one he put in the COE. With the new engine installed, this time with a Holly carburetor, it was time to see if the change paid off. It did indeed, as it started right up and after setting the timing

and making a couple carburetor adjustments, it ran perfectly. A short test drive revealed a couple of issues that needed attention. The 700R4 transmission was not shifting correctly and the power steering was not working correctly. The transmission issue was quickly corrected by properly adjusting the control cable at the carburetor. The power steering issue was caused by the design of the aftermarket fluid reservoir. The return line was mounted too high on the reservoir and was causing air to get mixed into the fluid. Once a new fitting was installed near the bottom of the reservoir, air was no longer getting mixed into the fluid. The next test drive proved to be a good one with no problems with the engine, transmission or power steering. At some point down the road, Don plans to reinstall the Holley Sniper fuel injection.

With the '58 Buick and '40 Ford COE pretty much completed to the point of reliable drivability, Don's focus was on finishing up the modifications to his Turquoise Pro Street Nomad to include a couple sensors that are needed for the Alky Digger fuel injection to run at its best. To install these sensors, he had to remove the blower and intake manifold. Since he had some annoying oil leaks, the engine was removed to replace gaskets and to clean everything in the engine compartment too. Once the modifications were completed and the engine reinstalled, he still had to make some modifications to the radiator fan and shroud to make it cool better. The distributor and ignition system had to be modified to allow the computer to control ignition timing to achieve optimum performance. With all of that completed, the engine started right up. However, it needs to go back to the Certified Car Clinic to make all of the computer adjustments to optimize performance. By the time you read this article, that part should be completed. I know Don is looking forward to taking this Nomad to the Western Invasion in Bakersfield and the Nomad Convention in Reno in July if these shows don't get cancelled because of the pandemic.

So, what's next? Don's black '55 Chevy Belair convertible had a few issues needing attention. The 700R4 transmission has never shifted correctly despite efforts of Valley Transmission and some others to fix the problem. The problem was with the cable adapter adjustment on the carburetor. It was the right adapter, but it was not even close to being adjusted correctly. Once the adapter adjustment was corrected and the cable properly adjusted, it now shifts pretty nice. The noisy speedometer was probably the next most annoying. It was making lots of screeching noises and the needle was bouncing up and down like a yoyo. It was mostly due to a lack of lubrication. There are also problems with the brakes due to the linkage configuration, the horns are not working and the turn signals are not self-canceling as designed. All of these issues are currently in the process of being resolved. When that is done, it will be on to the next car project in line. Don still has enough projects to keep him busy for quite a while.

## Goldie, the Final Chapter

The story of Goldie has reached its end. Always a rather quiet girl, she surprised everyone, especially Harvey and I, with a very flamboyant showing on the Hemming's auction site. She caught the eyes of two bidders, each with deep pockets. Bidding quickly took her over her Reserve price.

Joe, who has had other classic cars and lives in Knoxville, Tennessee, is thrilled to be her new owner. He has arranged excellent accommodations for her comfort and safety.

Goldie is garaged with other cars in a heated and air conditioned facility where her engine will be run every thirty days. We're hoping Joe will also take her on cruises, and to car shows and runs. As you know, she does love a lot of attention.

Harvey and I are forever grateful to all of you for helping make Goldie the very special car she became. There have never been, or could there be, better car friends. We miss you very much. Thank you for all you did. You are each very, very special.


# 2021 Carne Legada Run

### GOODGUYS ROD & CUSTOM ASSOCIATION RESCHEDULES FIRST DEL MAR EVENT AND CANCELS FIRST TWO PLEASANTON EVENTS

The 20th Meguiar's Del Mar Nationals is rescheduled to October 1–3, 2021, while the 38th All American Get-Together and the 27th Summer Get-Together in Pleasanton, Calif. are canceled. PLEASANTON, Calif. (Feb. 16, 2021) – Goodguys Rod & Custom Association, the organizer of America's premier hot rod and custom car events, has announced a change of schedule for its first three California events.

The 20th Meguiar's Del Mar Nationals have been rescheduled to October 1–3, 2021, replacing the 1st So-Cal Nationals that would have been the second Del Mar event scheduled for this year, and the first two events in Pleasanton, the 38th All American Get-Together and 21st Summer Get-Together are canceled. The 34th West Coast Nationals presented by BASF and 31st Autumn Get-Together respectively scheduled for late August and early November in Pleasanton will proceed as planned.

All vehicle registrations and ticket purchases for the 20th Meguiar's Del Mar Nationals will be automatically transferred to the rescheduled event date. All vehicle registrations and ticket purchases for both the 38th All American Get-Together and 27th Summer Get-Together will be automatically transferred to the 31st Autumn Get-Together, scheduled for November 13 & 14, 2021 in Pleasanton.

The changes to these events are a direct result from California's official use of the event sites for large-scale COVID-19 vaccination drives, scheduled to occur through at least the first half of the year.

"While we faced many disheartening cancellations in 2020, this is the first that we can be optimistic about," said Goodguys Chief Operating Officer Andrew Ebel. "Being displaced by local vaccination efforts only serves to accelerate the pace of our return to a healthy community and events without restrictions. This news is positive for Del Mar, for Pleasanton and Goodguys."

Goodguys' first 2021 event, the LMC Truck Spring Lone Star Nationals, will take place March 12–14 in Fort Worth, Texas.






