"The Grand Daddy of Them All!"

GRAND NATIONAL ROADSTER SHOW

72nd Annual Grand National Roadster Show

awards inside the seven Pomona Fairplex buildings.

Once known as the Oakland Roadster Show, the Grand National Roadster Show (GNRS) is the longest running indoor car show in the world. This year's show was the 72nd annual show and marked the 17th consecutive year the show was held at the Pomona Fairplex. On January 28, 29 & 30, over 500 show vehicles were on display competing for

A couple hundred other vehicles were on display outside the buildings for the 16th annual Grand Daddy Drive-In, which is the outdoor portion of the show for those who want to participate in the GNRS but may not want to leave their vehicle indoors for four or five days. The Grand Daddy Drive-In is open to all pre-1973 cars and trucks and all vehicles had to be driven into the event. This year, the Grand Daddy Drive-in celebrated 90 years of the Deuce and there was a designated outside area just for them. Other hot rods, classics and VW's were parked around all of the buildings.

Not only is the GNRS the longest running indoor car show, but it is generally the first big car show of the year and where you can be amongst the first to see the debut of many newly built cars. Since last year's GNRS was cancelled, this year's participants included numerous entries seen at other shows over the last year such as Good Guys Del Mar, including our '55 Bel-Air Convertible.

Of course, there were a lot of vendors, both inside and outside of the buildings. Among them was Armando's

Custom Upholstery, who installed the complete custom red leather interior and black canvas convertible top on the convertible. Armando invited me to put the convertible on display in their vendor space. I made the decision to go for it, and I sent in the application and entry fee along with several photos of the car, which had to be approved to be in the show by the GNRS gods. I was sure it wouldn't be a problem and sure enough, I received an invite to bring our entry to the show.



A couple weeks before the show, I received an envelope full of instructions, rules, and setup day passes for two. Since the car was going into a vendor booth, our setup day was Wednesday between the hours of 6 pm and 8 pm, two days before the show.

The weekend before the setup day, I started having some pain in my face and it rapidly became swollen and painful. Linda was also having some back issues. On Monday afternoon, we both went to Urgent Care to have our issues checked out and got nothing but a prescription for antibiotics and muscle relaxers.

Thinking my pain may be related to a tooth issue, I called my dentist and was able to get an appointment Tuesday at noon. Sure enough, X-rays showed that I had an abscessed tooth, and I needed a root canal. About that time, I was just about ready to cancel out of the GNRS. Fortunately, I was able to get an appointment at 3 pm Tuesday afternoon to get the root canal. By 5 pm, the root canal was accomplished, and I was feeling much better. Linda's back was also much improved. So, Wednesday morning at 11 am, the car was loaded on the trailer, and we were on our way to Pomona. We both survived the next five days without a problem.



Never having ever been to the GNRS, all of this was new to us. We soon discovered no one really cared about or even looked at any of those mailed documents. We arrived in Pomona at 2 pm and entered through gate 17 as instructed where we showed our vaccination cards and got our blue wrist bands. The next guy asked what building we were going to, and then wrote a big number five on our windshield and directed us to the "building five" line of vehicles. Gates would not

open until 4 pm but being there early assured us to get in during the first wave. Those coming later, had to wait for the first wave to unload and get in before the second wave was allowed to go in.

By 5:30, the convertible was securely parked inside building five, which this year was also the building with most of the lowriders. It was time to do a little detail cleaning while we waited for Armando and company to arrive. They were late because of a traffic issue on the 10 freeway that shut it down for a couple hours. They

arrived around 7 pm with a 1939 Ford coupe that was just barely finished in time for the show. The owners, Rick & Kathy were from the Scottsdale, Arizona area and had not seen their car since before the upholstery was completed. It was also 'Rick's birthday, so it was a nice birthday present for them to see the completed car for the first time.

Before the final show credentials could be obtained, each car had to be checked out by an official looking to see if a drip pan was underneath, gas gauge showed less than a quarter tank, and the battery was disconnected, or in our case, the battery shutoff switch was turned off. Once approved, a blue dot was put on the headlight and an



approval slip was signed and stamped. Then it was a trip to the participants window to trade the approval slip for the show placard and goody bag. The show placard had to be on display on or near the car in order to be judged for a trophy. Then sometime Friday or early Saturday, officials came around with flashlights and mirrors to assign the trophy class the entry would be assigned to. The convertible was placed into class 214, Custom Convertible. Actual judging was done later at night or during the day on Friday or Saturday. At 8 pm, the buildings closed for the night, and it was time to head out to the Hampton Inn.

We thought Thursday would be sort of a free day to do whatever we wanted, but it didn't work out that way.

When we arrived back at the Fairplex, there was a big flurry of activity everywhere and more and more entries were arriving all day. Many of the cars were raised up on custom display stands setup on fancy carpets and wood floors with mirrors and lights to let spectators get an awesome view of the bottom side of the car. Armando offered to have his detail guy go over the convertible with his polisher and favorite waxes to make it look its absolute best, and in fact, it did. Armando also encouraged us to get some mirrors and lights to highlight the underside of the convertible. We agreed and a-shopping we would go. By the time we acquired the necessary items and had lunch, it was late afternoon.





We spent the rest of the day going through four of the other six buildings before the spectators showed up on Friday. Building four is the biggest building and where most of the show activities take place. In the middle of the room, there was a trophy display with four life-size Oscar style statues and a huge trophy in the middle that had the name of every overall show winner from the very first show to the most recent. Also on display was the trophy for this year's top award, America's Most Beautiful Roadster (AMBR).

Building four is also the building where the most expensive builds and the most lavish displays were located. Buildings six, seven and eight had a lot of really nice entries and a lot of very rare cars. We were able to take all the time we wanted to see everything without the crowd getting in the way. Before we could get to the last two buildings, they were closing up for the day. Time to head back to the Hampton.

Friday was the first show day, and all participants and spectators were required to enter through gate 9 off White Avenue. However, the gates weren't opened until 10 am, two hours before the show opened. Once in the parking lot, we had to wait until 11 am, one hour before the show, to get through the gates, giving us very little time to take care of last-minute details. One rule was that once the show started, no one was allowed to clean or do anything with their entry.



At noon, the crowds started to arrive and before long, the show was in full swing. Vendors were all showcasing their products and lines of spectators formed in front of beer and food stands. A hot dog was a mere \$17. Armando brought in his own hot dog roller grille with all of the fixings so we could have our own little hot dog stand. We decided to work our way through the last two buildings before the crowds got too big. Building nine was all Hot VW's of all variations. Building ten was the Suede Palace where a lot of vehicles built in the 40's and 50's were on display. Outdoors we saw a whole lot of Deuces a bunch of other cars that were driven in that morning for the day. There were some vendors outdoors, but it seemed like very few for a show of this size. By the end of the day, we were once again ready for that trip back to the Hampton.






Saturday is the biggest show day. We decided to stop at The Hat in Upland on our way in to pick up some hot pastrami sandwiches for lunch that day. When we arrived, the line of cars to get into the

parking lot was three lanes wide and over a half-mile long. It took us over an hour to get in and parked. It took another 30 minutes to get through the gates. It's the day with the most events happening and of course the most spectators. In fact, it got so crowded that people on scooters were having great difficulty trying to maneuver through the buildings. There were so many spectators that the cars were barely visible unless you were close to them. We heard Chip Foose was there, but we never saw him. Although masks were required, less than 10% were actually wearing one. After all, you know it's hard to drink a beer or eat a hot dog while wearing a mask.

As the day wore on, we met and talked to a lot of people. Some we met were also at the Western Invasion and recognized the convertible. Others, seeing the car for the first time, just wanted to talk about it. Leroy and Marcia Amundson were the only people from San Diego that we saw. As the sun went down, the crowds were dispersing through the tunnel to the blue parking lot and soon the show was over for the day. Back to the Hampton.

Sunday was day five for us, and the last day of the show. Crowds were much smaller and had the fewest spectators of the three days. It was a much slower paced day and we mostly sat around by the car waiting for the awards presentation starting a 4 pm. Tim Beall, Leon Smythe and Mike Clark came by to visit for a few minutes before moving on to see the rest of the show cars.

At 3:30, we made our way to building four to find seats for the awards. There was an auction prior to the awards, and we discovered we needed to bring our own chairs because of the large crowd. A photo of each winning car was displayed on a white screen as the name of each winning entry was called. When they announced the winners in our class, I was



surprised to see they had awarded us the First-Place trophy in the custom convertible class. I was further surprised to see the trophy was 40 inches tall! I was even more surprised to see Tim Beall was still there and he seemed to be more excited about the win than we were.





After the awards presentation, it was time to pack up and get ready to take the convertible home. It took three days to get all the entries in, and they all had to be out within three hours. People everywhere were working at a furious pace to disassemble their displays and get them ready to load up. All we needed to do was put up the top, close the windows, and load up a few belongings. Doors to the buildings were manned by officials and they only let a few vehicles out at a time. By the time we were ready to go, the first wave of cars had already left the building. We waited in line for 20 minutes before the second wave was allowed to leave. Once out of


the building, we had to drive the car off the Fairplex property and back in through gate 17 where our trailer was parked, along with several hundred others. By 7:15, we had the car securely strapped on the trailer, and we were on our way home. We arrived at the shop around 9:30 pm, much earlier than we had anticipated. Within minutes, the car was safely back inside the shop, and we were on our way to the house.

The GNRS is truly a big event, and it requires a lot of planning and work to enter a car into this show. There were more super impressive builds on display than we have ever seen at one show, and it was mind boggling to see so many awesome high-end cars on display. It was a new experience for us, and it was certainly quite an adventure. Big thanks to the entire Armando Torres family for inviting us to be with them and making this event a genuinely great experience. We had a really great time, and It was definitely worth doing. I'm not sure if we would enter a car again, but we would definitely go back to see the show again and maybe even enter the car to attend the Grand Daddy Drive-In for a day. It's time to enjoy this award a bit and then start thinking about our next car show adventure. Anyone want to join us?






