## 12th Annual Gary Sinise Invincible Spirit Festival

Where did January go? It flew by really fast this year and we're already into February. We were able to get to a couple of smaller events in January before the 12th Annual Invincible Spirit Festival with Gary Sinise and the Lt. Dan Band on January 31. The event was held in the parking lot at the Naval Medical Center in Balboa Park. The show was free and so was all of the food and drinks. Celebrity Chef Robert Irvine is the man who provided the top notch food.

This show serves our nation by honoring our defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need. They do this by creating and supporting unique programs designed to entertain, educate, inspire, strengthen and build communities. This show celebrates the courage of our wounded heroes, their families, and their caregivers and offers a reminder of hope and positivity on their road to recovery.

Active & retired military members and veterans with Navy Base access were able to enter the base to attend this show with a vetted Military ID. However, new rules this year required all passengers and all drivers without vetted base access to complete a SECNAV5512/1 form and submit it for a background check and approval of a one day pass in order to attend the show and it had to be requested at least three weeks in advance. One more detail, once approved and notified, everyone attending the event has to make a trip to the Naval Base Visitor Center at 31st Street and East Harbor Drive in San Diego in person to pick up the pass. I know this sounds like a bit of a hassle, but it really is quite easy and well worth the effort.



On the morning of the show, Linda and I left home at 8:00 am in our 55 Belair convertible with Tom & Nancy Geiman in their 55 Belair convertible. We made our way to the Naval Medical Center arriving at 8:20 am. Last year, there was around 130 entries filling only part of the car show lot. The word must have gotten out as this year the entire lot was full with somewhere around 350 entries. We took two of the last spots on the far south end of the lot. We were joined by friends from numerous car clubs in the San Diego area. Mike Clark came with Harold Poyner and his wife in Harold's 55 Sedan. George & Sherri Lee were there with their GTO, Dave & Margie Vincent came in their 55 Sedan, Mike Pelloth in his 55 sedan, Robert Feliciano in his recently acquired 69 El Camino, Robert's friend Ken Heilman who bought Robert's 57 sedan, and Bob Brown was there in his 57 hardtop along with his Corvette friend Fred. We also met a new couple, Jeff & Karen, who just a week prior to this show bought Will Hammonds black 55 Chevy from Carla. The Low Rider clubs came with about 40 cars, and the Corvette Club had quite a few entries too. We also saw people we know from Over the Hill Gang, South Bay Cruisers, Poway Cruisers, Drifters and a few lone wolves too. It was the first time in quite a while we had a nice turnout of Tri-Five Revolution and CCSD members at an event!



It quickly became a sunny and warm day with temps getting up into the low 80's. Entries were to arrive between 7:00 am and 10:00 am, however festivities didn't officially start until 11:00 am. Volunteer workers were everywhere setting up popups, tables & chairs, and some were already busy cooking hamburgers, hot dogs and chicken. We began making our way around the car show area and every few steps, we ran into someone we know. We did finally make our way around to see all of the show entries.



By 11:00 am, things got underway. The opening band, "Stolen Silver" was playing on stage. Bounce houses, face painters, balloon artists and a rock climbing wall were all busy with hundreds of people who came to enjoy the day. Simple Green was back this year handing out bags of sample products. The food lines opened a bit early, and everyone was making their way through filling their plates with hamburgers, hot dogs, chicken, potato salad, macaroni salad, watermelon, and cookies for dessert. We were looking for a shady

place to eat while listening to the band. There were a lot of tables under popups, and we were able to score one for our group. While we were eating, there was a hot dog eating contest with ten participants to see who could eat the most hot dogs during a timed event. Robert Feliciano decided he wanted to participate, even though he had already eaten one hot dog. Robert came in second, eating four hot dogs. He thinks he may have won if he hadn't eaten one before the contest.

While we never saw a schedule of events, announcements were made that the car show awards would be presented at 12:40. I believe there were about 20 awards for the large number of entries and there were a lot of really nice award worthy cars. Each winner was called up to the stage to get a photo taken with their award and a large box of Simple Green products. Harold Poyner scored an award for his 55 Chevy sedan. They were down to the last two awards when they called entry 89, which was our number and I now have one more award to hang on my wall.

After the awards presentation, Gary Sinise and the Lt. Dan Band took the stage. This was again the very best part of the whole festival. The band played for over an hour and a half performing some of the very best concert music, finishing up with their version of Lee Greenwood's God Bless the USA. They were fabulous! By 3:00 pm, everyone was making their way to the exit. It was a beautiful day shared with a lot of friends attending a great concert with a lot of free food and drinks. # 2026 Annual Dr George Charity Car Show



February 14 was Valentines Day, and it was also the 23rd annual showing of the Dr. George Charity Car Show hosted by the Palm Springs Cruisin' Association (PSCA). This was our fourth time attending this show at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, a beautiful eight acres of flat neatly manicured grass surrounded by gorgeous palm trees and views of the mountains. This year, Linda and I made the trip in our 55 Chevy convertible with Tom & Nancy Geiman in their 55 Chevy wagon and Jerry & Cappy Taylor with their 56 Chevy hardtop.

Because it is a long drive, we always make the drive to Palm Springs on Friday before the show, and we stay at a nearby Hampton Inn so we can relax and enjoy our time away from home. We were fortunate to be between rain storms this year and had near perfect weather for the entire trip. We met at the big flag in Temecula at 10 am where we ate a quick breakfast at Jack In The Box before for heading east on Highway 79. There is a six mile stretch of road work where Hwy 79 is being widened and traffic alternated east and west in a single lane, but it created minimal delay. Our next stop was in Anza at the Dairy Queen for a restroom break and an ice cream before getting back on the road.



From there we had a nice drive to the Palm Desert/Santa Rosa Mountain overlook on Highway 74 (Palms to Pines Scenic Byway) where we saw sweeping panoramic views of the Coachella Valley and surrounding mountains. It is a popular 4,000 ft high elevation spot with vista views, particularly at dusk. After enjoying the view for a bit and taking a few photos, we drove the last leg of the trip, arriving at the Hampton Inn around 2:00 pm. We played a few games of Five Crowns before heading across the parking lot to Tony's Burgers where they have numerous specialty burgers on the menu.

Saturday morning came with beautiful Chamber of Commerce weather, perfect for a car show. We loaded our baggage and ate breakfast at the hotel before we made the trip to the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, arriving around 8:20 am. In previous years, the line of cars entering the show was short, and it took very little time to get through the gate. This year was a totally different story. Show entries were lined up for about a mile, all waiting to get into the show area. It took a little over half an hour before we were able to make our way through the entrance and to our spaces on 8th Avenue. Fortunately, we didn't see any overheated cars along the way. According to show officials, there was well over 1,100 entries, a huge number for a one day car show.

All entries are supposed to be in place by 9:00 am when the spectator gates open, but because of the long line, some vehicles didn't make it in by then, and the spectators were being let in early. It quickly became very congested.

Once we were parked in our spaces, we set up our popups and chairs. I did a little detailing on the car before filling out our window placard, picking up our goody bag and taking the bottom tear-off section to the tee-shirt booth to trade it in for the event tee-shirt. There was a prize raffle, silent auction and a 50/50 raffle. As always, there was a bunch of food vendors and a lot of miscellaneous vendors around the outside perimeter of the Tennis Garden.

The presentation of the American flag and the National Anthem were performed at 10:00 am. We made it around to all of the vendors, but we didn't go up and down all of the rows of cars. When we finished with the vendors, we decided on an ice cream and went back to the car to visit with friends.



Time flew by and before we knew it, it was 2:00 pm and time for the trophy presentation. Chip Foose was among the celebrities on the stage. The winner of the 50/50 was announced first and one lucky man went home with over \$3,400! The winning vehicles were identified with red, white and blue ribbons and they were lined up to be paraded in front of the stage on the concourse. There were no award categories and there weren't very many awards for a show of this size. Award winners were chosen by the people who sponsored the awards and Judges picked the "Top Ten" entries. Apparently, there were no sponsored awards specifically for Tri-Five Chevys again this year, although there was a 57 chevy and a 55 Nomad chosen for sponsors awards.

After the awards, everyone is always eager to leave, and lines of cars begin making their way through the exit. The Taylors headed home with friends who live in east county while Linda and I went with the Geiman's, Mike & Darla Galvin from Classic Chevys and friends Richard & Julisa to the Old Spaghetti Factory for a Valentines dinner before heading home, arriving at 9 pm.

This is a really nice show set in a fabulous location. It showcases a huge number of unique and extremely high end cars, It is one of the largest one day car shows around. If you have never been to this show and you decide to take it in, you won't be disappointed.



# Merryfield Apple Cake

*This cake goes together easily using just one bowl and the results are delicious.*

*Enjoy with a cup of coffee or tea as a snack, dessert or decadent addition to breakfast. Ann Goldberg*

3 cups all purpose flour  
2 cups sugar  
1 cup cooking oil  
3 eggs  
1 t baking soda  
1 t salt  
2 t vanilla  
3 cups peeled and diced Granny Smith apples  
(3 medium apples)  
1 cup chopped walnuts  
1/2 cup seedless raisins

Preheat oven to 325 degrees.

Grease and flour a 13" x 9" pan.

Into large mixer bowl, measure flour and the next 6 ingredients; with at low speed, beat until well. Mixed, constantly scrapping bowl with rubber spatula. Beat 3 minutes more, occasionally scraping bowl. Stir in apples, nuts and raisins.

Dough will be quite heavy/thick. Spread batter evenly into pan.

Bake 1 hour or until cake is golden and a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool on a rack.

To store, wrap cake in plastic wrap and foil. then refrigerate.

Makes 18 servings


