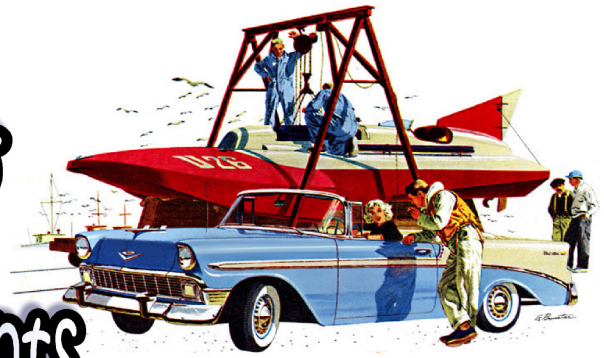


We've started a great tradition and I'm looking forward to many more Rendezvous to come.

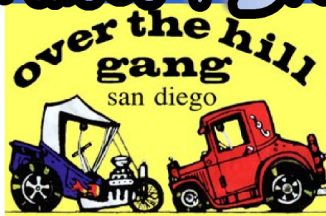

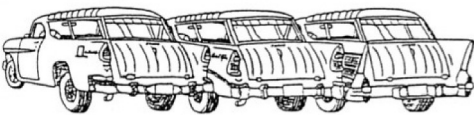

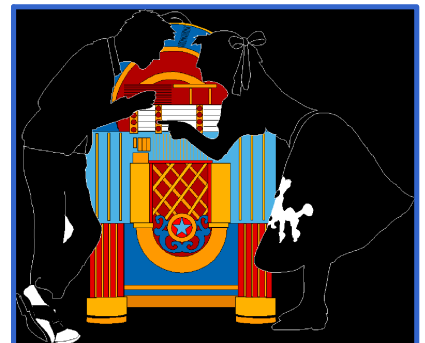

Locally, there's nothing that even comes close to what Goodguys has to offer: a pre-event poker-run-style cruise; three days of indoor/outdoor show'n shine for up to 2,000 rods, customs and classics with birthdates through '72; group parking areas for easy viewing of home-builts, woodies and other classifications; 4-sale corral; swap meet; sock hop; live nostalgic entertainment; hot rod seminars; a wide variety of vendors and exhibitors; and, for those who prefer their cars moving, cruisin' Main Street, and a street challenge autocross, and more.

So many great cars; so little time available in one long weekend! There's no way to experience it all, but it adds up to unbeatable fun, no matter which choices you make from Goodguy's extensive activity menu. Revolutionaries and friends took advantage of a variety of activities. Need information on a 1902 Winton, a 1910 EMF or perhaps a 1914 Buick? Info on these, as well as thousands of other early automobile models, is now available via your computer screen, thanks to the efforts of the members of the of the Horseless Carriage Foundation.

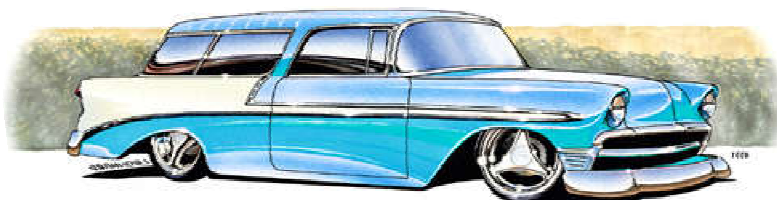
Located in LA Mesa, California, the HCF is a data research organization that can now provide collectors and restorers with a broad variety of information that is not available in any other single location. For the last three years the HCF has scanned nearly 3400,000 pages from early motoring magazines, books and manuals from 1895 to 1924, all of which can now be accessed by HCF members. The foundation's current goal is to expand their digital storage capability to the 1935 model years and eventually to the 1942 models.
