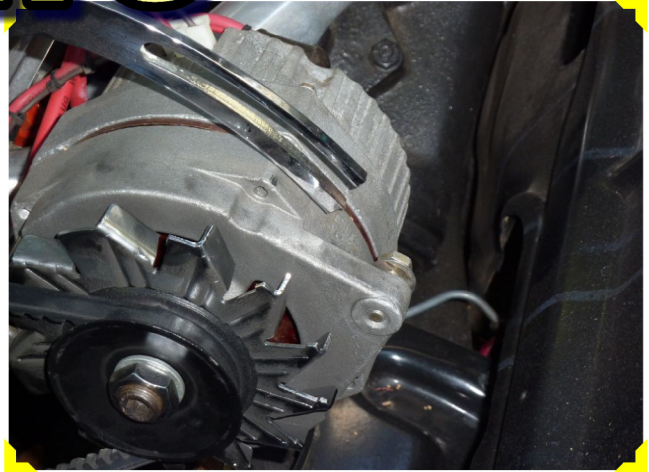

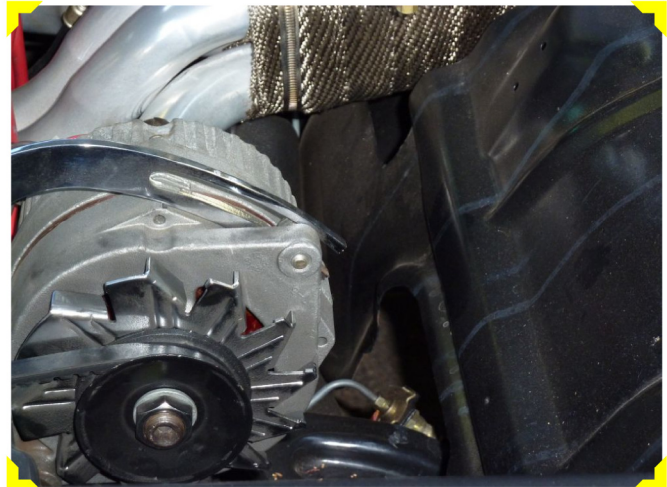
A Mixed Luck Adventure

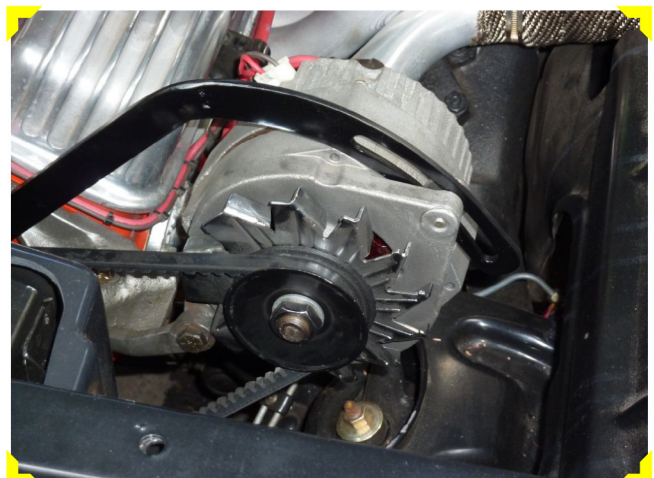

When the time of the practical exam approached, the gynecologist prepared carefully for weeks, and completed the exam with tremendous skill.

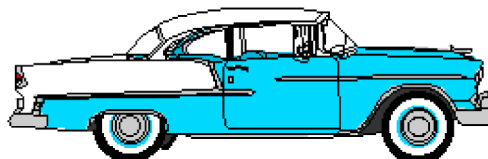
When the results came back, he was surprised to find that he had obtained a score of 150%.

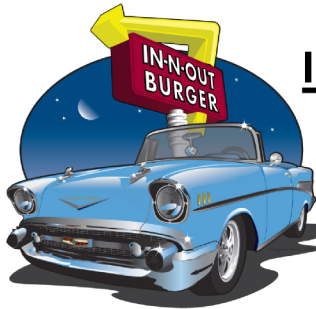

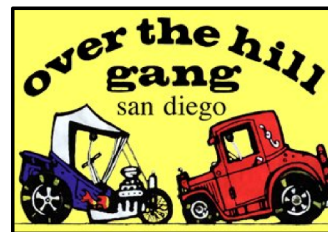

Claudia's Corner

Peroxide VS Bleach:

This was written by Becky Ransey of Indiana (a doctor's wife), and I want to share it with you. "I would like to tell you of the benefits of that plain little ole bottle of 3% peroxide you can get for under \$1.00 at any drug store. What does bleach cost? My husband has been in the medical field for over 36 years and most doctors don't tell you about peroxide. "Have you ever smelled bleach in a doctor's office? NO!!! Why? Because it smells, and it is not healthy! Ask the nurses who work in the doctor's offices, and ask them if they use bleach at home. They are wiser and know better! "Did you also know bleach was invented in the late 40's? It's chlorine, folks! And it was used to kill our troops. "Peroxide was invented during WWI.. It was used to save and help cleanse the needs of our troops and hospitals.. Please think about this:

1. Take one capful (the little white cap that comes with the bottle) and hold in your mouth for 10 minutes daily, then spit it out. (I do it when I bathe.) No more canker sores, and your teeth will be whiter without expensive pastes. Use it instead of mouthwash..
2. Let your toothbrushes soak in a cup of peroxide to keep them free of germs.
3. Clean your counters and table tops with peroxide to kill germs and leave a fresh smell. Simply put a little on your dishrag when you wipe, or spray it on the counters.
4. After rinsing off your wooden cutting board, pour peroxide on it to kill salmonella and other bacteria.
5. I had fungus on my feet for years until I sprayed a 50/50 mixture of peroxide and water on them (especially the toes) every night and let dry.
6. Soak any infections or cuts in 3% peroxide for five to ten minutes several times a day. My husband has seen gangrene that would not heal with any medicine but was healed by soaking in peroxide.
7. Fill a spray bottle with a 50/50 mixture of peroxide and water and keep it in every bathroom to disinfect without harming your septic system like bleach or most other disinfectants will.
8. Tilt your head back and spray into nostrils with your 50/50 mixture whenever you have a cold, plugged sinus. It will bubble and help to kill the bacteria. Hold for a few minutes, and then blow your nose into a tissue.
9. If you have a terrible toothache and cannot get to a dentist right away, put a capful of 3% peroxide into your mouth and hold it for ten minutes several times a day. The pain will lessen greatly..
10. Put half a bottle of peroxide in your bath to help rid boils, fungus or other skin infections.
11. You can also add a cup of peroxide instead of bleach to a load of whites in your laundry to whiten them. If there is blood on clothing, pour it directly on the soiled spot. Let it sit for a minute, then rub it and rinse with cold water. Repeat if necessary.
12. I use peroxide to clean my mirrors. There is no smearing, which is why I love it so much for this.

"I could go on and on. It is a little brown bottle no home should be without! "With prices of most necessities rising, I'm glad there's a way to save tons of money in such a simple, healthy manner!" This information really woke me up. I hope you gain something from it, too.

Chocolate Eclairs

Here's a dessert that will earn you raves - and you never have to let anyone know that it's really extremely quick and easy to make.

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup butter
- 1 cup flour
- 4 eggs



In a heavy sauce pan, bring water and butter to a rolling boil. Turn burner to "low" and vigorously stir in flour, cooking 1 minute or until the dough forms a ball. Remove from heat. Beat in eggs, one at a time, until dough is smooth.

Using ¼ cup dough at a time, form fingers approximately 4-½" by 1-½" on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake 35-40 minutes. Cool thoroughly, leaving pan on a rack.

Carefully cut the top one-half off each "finger" and pull out soft dough filaments.

Fill with your choice of baker's cream, vanilla cream pudding or ice cream. Replace tops and frost with chocolate icing:

- 1 square unsweetened chocolate
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 cup confectioners sugar
- 2 tablespoons hot water

Melt chocolate and butter over low heat. Remove from heat and stir in confectioners sugar and hot water. Beat until smooth.

Refrigerate (or freeze, if using ice cream) éclairs until time to serve.


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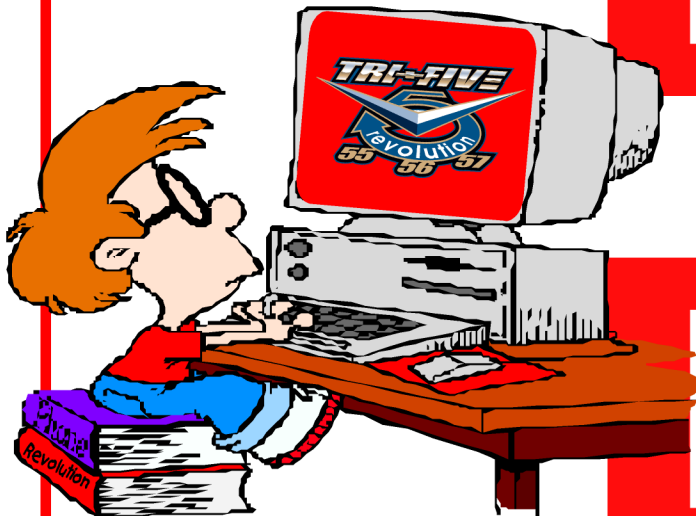
