With the arrival of April comes the annual Good Guys show at Del Mar. This is a fun show for us because we like to visit with the vendors and look at a vast variety of cars we haven't seen before and get ideas of things to incorporate into our own projects.

We started the event on Thursday morning by picking up our registration and goody bag at the hotel across the street from the fairgrounds and then lining up for the poker run sponsored by the Over the Hill Gang. Only this year, there was no poker, just a cruise through some scenic parts of San Diego. Leon Smythe from Classic Chevys was the only person we actually knew participating in the cruise except for Suzanne Stephens who organized the event. We started the cruise by going south on Hwy 101 to Genesee and

south on I-5 to Garnet on our way to the top of Mount Soledad. The weather was a little iffy and sure enough, we started getting some drizzle just as we were ready to climb the hill. By the time we reached the top, visibility was severely impaired and the drizzle was heavy. So we weren't able to enjoy the fabulous view from the top.



The next stop was at the Classic Malt Shop in Point Loma. This year the driving instructions were much better, and everyone was told to phone in their food orders ahead of time. We did not do that and just made sure we were among the first few cars to arrive. We ordered our burgers and fries when we arrived and the food came out quickly, making us happy campers.





Then the cruise continued south on Rosecrans and onto Harbor Drive taking us by the Star of India, the USS Midway and the Kiss statue before looping back around to Balboa Park and the San Diego Automotive Museum where we were provided special parking for our classics. All participants received a snack and water and then were allowed to enter the museum and stay as long as we wanted until it closed. We were among the last to leave.

We arrived at the fairgrounds around 9:00 am on Friday, taking advantage of light traffic and the opportunity to easily see all of the cars parked indoors and all of the vendors. Over the course of the day we saw quite a few members from Classic Chevys and other local clubs. Sam Rindskopf and Rich Correia we were there from our T5R group.



We were disappointed in the indoor vendor turnout this year. There were mattress and hot tub vendors where last year we saw automotive related vendors. This year again, there was a building full of low riders. We aren't into low riders much, but it is fun to see the extremes they go to creating their showpieces with incredible paint, chrome and interiors. The other two large buildings had a wide variety of vehicles on display including some COE trucks, specialty vehicles, and various hot rods and other classics. Some were very nice and very well done, while some were just average making me wonder why they were indoor cars. There was also a building showcasing a local San Diego area car club. The Poway Cruisers were chosen to display about 20 of their vehicles this year.

On Saturday, we arrived around 8:00 am to assure getting a good parking space and we parked close to Rod & Sam. Don Perkins rode in with Rod and hung out with us too. We revisited some of the indoor areas and some of the vendors before cruising through the swap meet area, which was pretty much a bust. Not much going on there. We then spent quite a while looking at cars parked outside. After that, it was lunch and a little bit of sitting around our car for a while. We



also stopped at the photographer's booth to check out the photos they took of our Little Brownie on our way into the show. We passed on that one too.



Sunday is the day you can bring in any American made automobile, even new ones, to compete for an award. Around 2 pm, they hand out around 70 awards. We chose not to go back on Sunday for the awards this
