With the completion of my '55 Chevy Belair convertible, I was getting anxious to take it to a real show and three others in our classic car group were ready to go with me. On April 15, Rod & Nancy Hildebrand with their red '57 150 sedan, Tom & Nancy Geiman with their blue '55 Belair hardtop, and Rich

We met up in the Alpine Albertson's parking lot at 10 am and headed east. We made a stop at the El Centro In & Out for lunch, then made our way to Yuma for a gas stop. Then it was on to Gila Bend. After gassing up one more time there, we made the last leg of the journey to the La Quinta Inn in Scottsdale, arriving around 5:30.




While I had put a few miles on the '55 Belair convertible around town, this was going to be the first long road trip and while everything seemed to be good, I was not sure how well it would perform on a longer trip with temperatures in the high 80's and low 90's. I was very pleasantly surprised to see the car perform flawlessly, even in traffic in the heat. It ran perfectly and cool all the time, even with the air conditioning on all the time.

Friday morning, we cruised on over to West World and pulled into the registration area, where we picked up our registration packets and goody bags. Then we weaved our way through a maze of cones and parking personnel to the main entrance of the show where we parked our classics on the blacktop near the big tent.

This year's show was on a bit of a smaller scale with entries limited to 2,500 vehicles instead of the usual 3,000. There were fewer vendors inside the big tent and outside too. Face coverings were required inside buildings but were not required outside. Other than that, it was pretty much the same as previous shows. The swap meet area was very much like the last time we were here, and it took a long time to get through it because there was a lot of stuff. There were fewer cars than usual parked on the polo field, but there were plenty to see. The show was over at 5pm, at which time we cruised back to the hotel.

Saturday morning, we arrived around 8 am and parked our four classics in the Tri-Five Chevy area and cleaned them up to look their very best for everyone to see. We registered the cars and received our Tri-Five Chevy Specialty dash plaques. Judging of the cars takes place between 10 am and noon. There were 29 Tri-Five Chevys lined up for one trophy. I would have thought for a big group of popular cars like that, there would have been a trophy for each of the three years or at least a first, second and third. It was not to be.









After the show, we went to dinner at Maggianos, an Italian restaurant, with Danny & Claudia Gayhart, former "San Diegans that moved to Arizona 21 years ago. After dinner, it was back to the hotel for the evening.











Sunday morning, we went to breakfast at IHOP before cruising over to West World for the awards. There were some very nice cars chosen as winners, but like always, there were a few head scratchers. The winner of chopped and dropped was a Willy's straight axle drag car that wasn't chopped or dropped. The best chrome and suede winner was all polished aluminum and had no chrome at all and the upholstery sure didn't look like suede to me. And there was a Chevrolet specialty award attached to a Ford pickup. There was even an award for the best wide whites, which were obviously brand-new tires on an unrestored car that was pretty rough looking. The trophy for best Tri-Five Chevy went to a blue '57 two door hardtop Belair from Arizona. Trophies were supposed to be awarded at 2:22 pm, but they were started early, apparently due to Covid concerns. Not sure how that one hour can make a difference after three days, but what do I know?







We all checked out and headed for home just before 9 am on Monday. Traffic wasn't bad at all, but the temperature got into the low 90's. Even so, the trip home was totally uneventful. No one had any car issues that caused any delays and by late afternoon we were all safely back home. It was really good to finally go to an event like this. I enjoyed it a lot and I am looking forward to when California opens up enough to have some real car shows. Let's turn up the music and cruise!

Viejas Fire Badge Pinning Ceremony

Sometimes things sort of happen in strange ways. Recently, I was working with Steve Spirkoff to make some custom panels to cover the engine wiring and fuel injectors on the convertible. If you've ever taken on such a project, you know it is very time consuming to end up with the desired results. We spent several days designing and creating something that wasn't just a square box, but something special that would truly enhance the look of the car.

One night after a long day of creating these panels, Steve drove his red and white '55 Belair hardtop to the Casino Inn in Alpine. While there, he had the opportunity to meet Viejas Councilman Adrian Brown, who saw his car and of course, a conversation began. Adrian told Steve they were having a badge pinning ceremony at the Viejas Fire Station the next day and asked him if he could bring his car for display at the ceremony. Steve said yes and also showed him a photo of my convertible. Adrian was impressed and wanted to know if it was available too. When Steve called me to ask if I was interested, I just had to say yes.

We arrived at the Viejas Fire Station just before 9 am and the cars were soon staged. We were introduced to Fire Captain Bob Phohl who told us a little about the badge pinning. That day, eleven fire fighters were about to receive the badge they had earned through years of very hard work and not much pay. It is a long process to earn a fire fighter's badge. Before a person can be accepted into the program, they are required to have EMT training at their own cost. Then, once accepted, they receive fire technical training and they embark on a very long journey of at least two years.

Adrian Brown is a very interesting character and he is almost more of a comedian than a councilman. He started things off with some jokes and funny comments before turning the event over to 'Captain Phohl. Several members of the Viejas council were there to participate in the badge pinning. One by one, Captain Phohl called each of the eleven fire fighters down front, while the badge was passed from one council member to the next until it ultimately was passed to the badge pinner. Each recipient was able to choose the person who they wanted to do the pinning, their wife, girlfriend, parent or friend. It was exciting to see how proud each and every recipient was to get their badge. It is also really good to know there are people willing to put their lives on the line to help protect people like us from harm when fires threaten our homes and our lives. The next time you have an opportunity to say thank you to these very special first responders, please let them know how much we appreciate them and the work they do.



Well, our hands are officially tied, The State of California has given us no choice but to once again postpone the Inaugural American Tri-Five Association Western Invasion, Presented by Danchuk. There is simply no path currently that will allow us to have the event at Famoso Dragstrip near Bakersfield, California. Currently Kern County (home of the event location) California is under the Red Tier of California's color-coded

system of reopening. Below are the current guidelines as set forth by the State of California for outdoor venues such as Famoso Dragstrip.

Red tier ("substantial" risk of infection)

Attendance at outdoor venues is limited to 20% capacity.

All attendees must be California residents.

Advance ticket reservations are required for all events.

Workers must be tested weekly.

Food and drink concessions must be delivered to guests in their seats or delivered to designated quest pickup areas.

Indoor concessions remain closed.

Orange tier ("moderate" risk of infection)

Venues must limit capacity to 33%. But if all guests show a negative test result within the 72 hours prior to attendance or show proof of full vaccination, venues can increase attendance capacity to 67%.

All attendees must be California residents with advance ticket reservations.

Workers must be tested weekly.

Food and drink concessions must be delivered to guests in their seats or delivered to designated guest pickup areas.

Indoor concessions remain closed, except for designated seating areas that can operate at 25% capacity.

Even in a best-case scenario our event will not be able to take place April 30- May 2. We have been working with the track, the county and the hotels and we have rescheduled the event for October 15-17, 2021. We are all saddened by these unfortunate and unavoidable postponements, but it is simply out of our hands. The State currently will not let us have this event as it is planned.

All pre-registered show cars, drag racers, commercial vendors and swap meet vendors will have their spaces and payments transferred to the rescheduled Inaugural ATFA Western Invasion, October 15-17, 2021.

There is nothing that we would rather be doing than being out there enjoying our classic Chevys with you all in California, but currently our hands are tied. We do look forward to seeing as many of you as possible in Bowling Green, August 12-14 for the 6th Danchuk Tri-Five Nationals. The great state of Kentucky and the fine folks in Bowling Green are welcoming us with open arms and we look very forward to getting back to the greatest Tri-Five Chevy event on the planet.

Claudia's Corner

I just discovered 2 simple and delicious recipes for a group. Easy to prepare in advance and everyone loved it at my last party. Hope you will like it too! Serve with asparagus and a Caesar Salad and you are good to go!

PARMESEAN RANCH CHICKEN

3/4 cup crushed Frenches Onion Rings

3/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1 (1 ounce) envelope ranch salad dressing mix

8 (4 ounce) skinless, boneless chicken breast halves pounded into 1/4" thin pieces

1/2 cup butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish. Combine onioins, Parmesan cheese, and ranch dressing mix in a bowl. Dip chicken in melted butter; roll each chicken breast in dry mixture until evenly coated. Place coated chicken in the prepared baking dish. Bake in the preheated oven until chicken is no longer pink in the center and the juices run clear, about 45 minutes. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C).

BAKED POTATOES AU GRATIN

6 slices bacon

1/2 cup diced onion

3 garlic cloves, minced

1/2 tsp salt

4 ounces Harvarti cheese, shredded

4 ounces Cheddar cheese, shredded

2 pounds potatoes, peeled and thinly sliced



Heat oven to 375-degrees F. Spray a 1 1/2-quart casserole with cooking spray.


Fry bacon in a large skillet or sauce pan. Transfer to paper towel lined plate. Leave bacon fat in skillet. Over medium heat, cook diced onion in bacon fat for 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add grated garlic, salt, pepper, thyme and paprika, cook, stirring for 1 minute. Sprinkle in flour and cook stirring constantly for 1 minute. Whisk in milk; while stirring constantly, bring to a steady simmer. Simmer for 1 minute. Remove from heat. Crumble bacon. Mix shredded cheeses together. Stir in bacon and only 1 1/2 cups of cheese until melted. Add potato slices to mixture and stir to coat. Pour potatoes with cheese sauce into prepared casserole dish. Bake uncovered at 375-degrees F for 1 hour until potatoes are tender. Spread remaining shredded cheese over potatoes along with a dusting of paprika. Bake uncovered for an additional 15 or until top is browned. Bacon Potatoes au Gratin can easily be made a day ahead, cover and refrigerated, then rewarmed in the oven before serving.
