21st MEGULAR'S DEL MAR NATIONALS

With life getting back to being a bit more normal without masks everywhere, we were getting excited about the Good Guys 21st Meguiar's Del Mar Nationals. Last year, we displayed the 55' Belair convertible inside the O'Brien Building in the Armando's Custom Upholstery vendor space and we went back and forth in Linda's '69 Chevy C20 pickup. This year, we decided to pass on displaying either car indoors. Instead, we parked both vehicles outside.



We normally go Thursday morning to the host Hilton Hotel to pick up our registration packets and then participate in the 10 am cruise. This year, the weather was a bit chilly and breezy, so we passed on the cruise and went in the afternoon to register. Since the indoor cars were mostly parked by then, we took the opportunity to see the indoor vehicles and spend a little time with a few friends we met over the last year. We saw a few people who recognized us from the Western Nationals, Grand National Roadster show and Midnight at the Oasis. We also spent some time with our friends from Armando's Custom Upholstery.



The weather forecast for the weekend was a bit sketchy with heavy marine layer and possible drizzle for the morning hours. We were spared the drizzle on Friday and were back at Del Mar at 9 am, meeting up with Tom & Nancy Geiman.

As we were making our way through the outdoor cars, we happened upon the CCSD 56' Chevy 210 Vision 98/99 raffle car that was won by Frank Ruiz. The car looked almost exactly like it did over twenty years ago when it was raffled. Frank later sold the car to his

friend Eddie Chapman and Eddie's son brought the car to the show. It had a for sale sign in the window and when we stopped to check it out, we saw the photo album containing a whole bunch of memories from when the car was being built. Looking through the photos, we were transported back to a time when we were all a bit younger and without all the gray hair we have now. Sadly, we have lost a few of the people in the photos and a few more have left the club and/or moved away from San Diego. On a happier note, quite a few people in the photos are still active in our local car clubs.





Saturday started out very wet and drizzly, but that didn't deter us from making the trip to Del Mar. By the time we arrived, the drizzle was minimal and within an hour it was staying pretty dry. We parked Linda's truck in the Truck Corral, which was right next to the Tri-Five Chevy row.

Don arrived in his 40' Ford COE and next to Linda's

Perkins parked

C20. Rod & Nancy Hildebrand arrived with Don and parked next to the convertible followed by Tom & Nancy Geiman. We got busy and cleaned up the vehicles from driving up in the rain. It wasn't too long before a Good Guys judge was looking for Don Perkins. Don's COE was being chosen for the "Suede and Chrome" award. A few

minutes later, the same judge picked the 55' convertible for the "Tri-Five Chevy" award.

One of the first things we do every show is fill out the card for the door prizes. I have never won a



prize, until now that is. When we checked the board later in the day, I was surprised to see my name on the board. So, I immediately went up to see what I had won. That's when I learned they have a book of prizes, and I could pick anything I wanted that hadn't already been claimed. As I looked through the book, I saw most prizes were money toward the purchase of something I had no use for. But then I saw a \$250 gift certificate for Golden Star Auto in Texas. They sell a lot of Tri-Five Chevy body panels as well as a few other parts. I was able to order a few parts I could use without having to

spend money to take advantage of the prize. That was awesome!

This show is now open to all 1997 and older Rods, Customs, Classics, Muscle Cars and Trucks. We saw quite a few late 70's and early 80's entries and numbers over 1800, so the turnout must have been pretty good. Auto Cross, Nitro Thunderfest Dragster Exhibition, and a Burn Out Competition was on the schedule as usual, as well as the Swap Meet & Cars for Sale Corral. There was only one entry in the burnout competition, a Pontiac GTO. He put on a pretty good show and was awarded the first-place trophy on the spot.



Soon, the show was winding down, winners had been selected and the weather was turning cold and wet again. We decided to head home before the rain came back, but that didn't work out so well. We ran into some pretty heavy showers on the way back. Knowing we would have to drive the convertible back on Sunday for the awards and rain was likely, I decided to wait on cleaning up the car.





Sure enough, Sunday morning arrived with a lot of rain, and we just accepted it was going to be a wet drive. We arrived around 8:30 and it was quite rainy all the way. We pulled into the winners area and lined up with the winning cars. Then came the task of cleaning up the car after driving in the rain. Soon after that, Don arrived in his COE to line up with the rest of the winners. It continued to drizzle for another hour and a half, but it did eventually dry up enough to finish detailing the car.



At 2:22 pm, the cars were supposed to be paraded past the Good

Tri-Five Chevy Čar Show

We've been attending a lot of car shows in the San Diego area and keep seeing all the same cars that show up to almost all of the local events. We've started looking to attend some different car shows a little further away from home where we can experience vehicles new to us and to meet new people along the way. That's not to say we don't enjoy seeing our

fellow car club members, but rather would like to have them come along on our journeys to experience new things with us.

On April 23, 2022, the Zimmerman Automobile Driving Museum put on an all Tri-Five Chevy Car Show in El Segundo with the help of the Tri-Five Chevy Crew Car Club. The Automobile Driving Museum is an excellent testament to the preservation of history and their mission is to collect, preserve, exhibit and ride in historic vehicles. They use their collection of over 130 cars to present educational opportunities and displays that illustrate the aesthetic, engineering



and cultural evolution of the automobile. They host a lot of car shows and have a Cruise-In on the first Saturday of each month from 9 am to noon. All vintage, classic,







and clubs. They have a 1950s theme ice cream parlor, and you can hop in one of their vintage or classic cars and travel back in time. Entry is free to all, but donations are appreciated.







When we saw the flyer for this show, it seemed like a golden opportunity to not only attend a new car show, but an all Tri-Five Chevy show. We signed up along with the Geiman's and the Rindskopf's. We decided to make the trip to El Segundo on show day, even though we had to get up early in order to get to the show on time. We all met at the rest area on I-5 north of Oceanside at 7 am and headed north. Traffic was actually heavier than I thought it would be early in the morning, but we traveled in the carpool lane and had no slowdowns all the way to El Segundo, arriving around 8:30. Even though the show didn't officially start until 10 am, we were amongst the last cars to arrive.



Tri-Five Chevys were parked on the street in front of the Zimmerman and in the parking lots on both sides of the museum building. Registration was setup in front of the

building and food vendors were there along with a live band. Once we were parked, cleaned up the cars, and set up our chairs, we checked out all 59 of the Tri-Fives at the show. It was surprising to



see that about half of the cars were mostly stock originals. All of the cars were fabulous high-quality original, restored, or custom builds. At registration, we learned cars would be judged as either stock or modified.



After checking out all of the cars, we made our way through the museum. They have a very interesting collection of vehicles, many that are rare and some not so rare. Many are not what you would think of as museum quality and really need a lot of T-L-C. Others were in excellent condition. My favorite was an all-white 1936 Packard Touring car that is big, long and beautiful!

There was a raffle of miscellaneous donated items, nothing too exciting. Winners were able to pick any prize on the table, first come, first served. Linda picked a Peggy Sue's Diner T-Shirt. While checking our raffle numbers, we were able to chat with Jerry Mull. President of Los



Angeles Classic Chevys. We went to an LACC meeting in 2015



when we were in the Los Angeles area. Their club is rather small, and Jerry handles a large majority of the clubs functions, including the newsletter. It was good to see him in person again.



Lunch was next on the list of things to do. We decided on tacos for lunch and one vendor had peach cobbler that was quite good. After that, we had to make a trip inside the ice cream parlor. By then, it was 1 pm and time for the awards. There were two different award presentations, one by the Zimmerman Museum and one by the Tri-Five Crew. Each one judged the Chevys and made their own picks. The high quality of these cars was very impressive, and I was not expecting to be among the winners. However, the Zimmerman judges chose the '55 convertible for second place "55 Chevy Modified" and the Tri-Five Crew judges chose the '55 convertible for "Best 55 Chevy."

In a matter of minutes after the awards had been presented, the cars were clearing out and we were among the last to head home. We checked the freeway traffic and discovered I-5 was a disaster with horrible traffic and we determined the 91 east to the 15 was actually the faster route, although it would ultimately still be a 3-hour drive. But it was a really nice show, we saw a lot of really nice Tri-Fives, and we did indeed make some new friends along the way. Route 66 in
