2025 seems to be going by pretty fast, and it's already time for the Good Guys Meguiar's Del Mar Nationals. It seemed to work out well and some of us are considering staying at the RV park next year.

For three of the last four years, we have had to deal with rain on one or two days of the show, but never on Saturday. This year once again it was raining Thursday morning with some pretty heavy

We decided to do the OTHG cruise, and we did it in our Little Brownie '55 Chevy Delray. When we arrived at the starting point, there was only a handful of cars. The cruise route was going to be the same as in prior years. We cruised south along the ocean by beautiful beaches before going down I-5 to Garnet and making our way up to Mt. Soledad for a brief stop. Then it was back down the hill to I-5 and to Garnet following back streets to the Malt Shop in Point Loma for lunch. The Geiman's arrived at Del Mar a bit too late for the start of the cruise, however, they joined us in their '55 Chevy Belair wagon at the Malt Shop for lunch. After a burger, fries and a chocolate malt it was time for the second half of the run. I think there were only four or five cars continuing with the group. Like so many others, we opted out and went back to Del Mar to get our goody bag. We spent the rest of the afternoon checking out vendors

and indoor cars before playing a couple games of Five Crowns in the Geiman's RV.

Friday weather was beautiful. We arrived at 10 am and before long, we were meeting a lot of friends. Sam & Donna Rindskopf and Dana Stevens were there helping the Over the Hill Gang with parking assignments. Sam Milazzo was there with his '65 Chevelle, Jerry & Cappy Taylor were onsite with their '56 hardtop, Don Perkins showed up with his red '67 Corvette and Dave Ward made an appearance with his yellow '55 Chevy 210 sedan for the first time since we've known him. Dave's '55 had a fresh engine and a few other goodies and sounded pretty good as he cruised the main drag with Tom as his co-pilot. Lots of cars were on hand for a Friday, however it seemed like less outdoor vendors than usual. I was hoping to see Edelbrock and CPP there, but they were noticeably absent. By the end of the day, we had made our way through all the buildings and outdoor vendors, and we joined our RVing friends for a while before heading home.

Saturday weather was beautiful again. There were over 2,100 entries again this year and among them were numerous members of Tri-Five Revolution and Classic Chevys of San Diego, including Sam & Donna Rindskopf in their black '57 Nomad, Dana Stevens in her yellow & white '56 Nomad, Sam Milazzo in his '65 Chevelle, Don Perkins in his red '55 Nomad, Rod Hildebrand in his red '57 150 sedan, Tom & Nancy Geiman in their '55 Belair wagon, Jerry & Cappy Taylor in their orange & silver '56 Belair, Paul Palombo with his black '57 Chevy Hardtop, Marcia Amundson in her black '55 sedan, and of course Linda and me in our black & silver '55 Chevy convertible.











There were around 30 Tri-Fives in the corral, the most I've ever seen at this show. There were another 30 Tri-Fives in different locations around the grounds. You may recall last year when I saw a judge on a golf cart come around the corner into the Tri-Five Chevy row making a stop at a coral and gray '55 Nomad next to me, declaring it the Tri-Five pick without looking at any other car. It happened again this year with the judge stopping at a red & white '57 150 wagon next to me, declaring it as this year's Tri-Five Pick. It certainly wasn't the best choice as his hood wasn't

open and it was not exactly pristine. At least 20 other cars would have been a better pick. Moving on now.

We worked our way through all the buildings and vendor displays again. Then we made a trip around the parking areas to see most of the outdoor entries. Around 2 pm, I got a text from Rod telling I needed to come to the car. When I got there, two Meguiar's representatives were there, and they told me they were picking the convertible for a "Meguiar's Magnificent Masterpiece" award. Since Meguiar's is the big sponsor for this show, I consider that to be a very prestigious award. Of course, that meant having to come back Sunday to display the car in the winner's circle, but we were going to be there anyway.



After looking at all the entries, we watched Autocross for a bit. This year, no Tesla's were allowed to compete. Gasoline powered cars just can't compete with them and a Tesla won "best time" every show over the last three years. I never heard why they eliminated them or why they weren't in a class of their own. Before long, Five o'clock came rolling around and with it, all of the buildings and vendors were closing up for the day. We went to visit our friends in the RV park again before heading home.

On Sunday, we arrived around 9 am and made our way to the winner's circle. We spent our time before the awards looking at all the other winners and making one more trip inside the buildings. This year, the route for the parade of winners didn't go through the tunnel under the grandstands. Instead, Main Street was closed off and the winners were paraded down Main Street for everyone to see before making a left turn into the awards area. One by one, winning cars made their way to the stage area where the announcer described each car, the award was presented, and photos were taken. This year, the previous style wood plaques were replaced with an oversized stamped metal 3D award that hangs on the wall. They are definitely cool! It was a fun day and by 3 pm, the area was emptying out fast. It is a really nice show overall and I'm sure we will be back again next year.

La Verne Cool Cruise Car Show 2025

We recently saw a flyer for the 29th Annual La Verne Cool Cruise Car Show in Downtown La Verne on April 19th and it looked like it might be a nice event. This show was produced by the Flying Deuces Car Club, the same people who brought us the Brea Holiday Car Show last December, which was a really nice venue. This show was also advertised as a salute to Classic Cars, Street Rods, Muscle Cars, Trucks, Exotics, Sport Cars and Antiques. Proceeds benefit the La Verne K-9 Police Foundation. In case

you're not familiar with La Verne, it's like going to the Pomona Fairplex and going about a mile north to Downtown La Verne. We decided to sign up.

This show had no online registration. Registration required entrants to mail a completed registration form with a check and a photo of the car to the event organizer. The entry fee was \$45 for general parking or \$65 for priority parking and included an event tee-shirt. Registration had to be received by April 1st. We decided to go for the priority parking and sent in our registration. The dash placard and show information came in the mail prior to the show.

The weather two days before the show was cold, cloudy, drizzly and windy, but the day of the show arrived with beautiful clear skies and temperatures in the mid 70's. We left home at 6:00 am and met up with Tom & Nancy Geiman, Tim Huizenga, and Jim & Tina Dickerson from the Drifters at I-15 and Clinton Keith Road, and made our way to La Verne, arriving about 8:15. The main show area was at 3rd and D Street and covered numerous blocks in all four directions. The show received more entries than expected and in fact, they oversold the parking, including the priority parking. We had to wait a few minutes while officials were deciding what to do. After a few minutes,



they brought us back around to 3rd and D Street, where they parked us on the corner, which turned out to be the best possible parking spot for the show. The extra \$20 for priority parking was well worth it.

The show attracted over 520 entries, the most they have ever had. There was a DJ playing music, a raffle with a few not so interesting items and a 50/50 too. There were vendors, a donut shop, three restaurants and



an Ice Cream store, all within a block. Just as with the Brea show, Judges from the Flying Deuces were walking around looking at each entry. Again, there were no specific categories, they just picked vehicles they liked. Awards were announced at 3:30 pm, and we were told there were 32 awards, and all 32 awards were labeled as "Best of Show." They announced winners in numerical order of their registration number. Jim & Tina Dickerson won an award for their 1939 Ford COE truck and our convertible was once again selected for one of those "Best of Show" plaques.

This was a nice venue with some very nice cars, but it is a long way from one end to the other to see them all. It's also a long show that would be better if they shortened it up and hour or so.
