

COSIXCES Howyou can fell find head gasket is leaking or has fulled

The first symptoms of a head gasket that is failing are usually a slow loss of coolant with no visible leaks, engine overheating and/or a check engine light with a cylinder misfire code. The OBDII system should detect any misfires that occur due to loss of compression or spark plug fouled by coolant seeping into combustion chamber. The spark plug for that cylinder should be checked for coolant fouling. A compression or leak down test done to see if the cylinder is losing compression. The parts to replace a head gasket include not only the head gasket, but also all the other gaskets that have to be replaced to disassemble the top of the engine. This include intake & Exhaust manifold gaskets, plus new cylinder head bolts if the application is a late model engine with the non-reusable torque-to-yield head bolts. Additional parts should be replaced at this time. Timing belts, water pump, spark plugs, wires, filters, coolant, and oxygen sensors that may have been fouled by the antifreeze. Torque-to-yield (TTY) head bolts on late model engines are designed to be used just one time because they stretch permanently once they are torqued down. If reused stretching them even further increases the risk of breaking. If your engine has conventional head bolts, it's ok to reuse them, provided they are in good condition and not stretched. Just clean them lightly oil them and reuse.





EVERYDAY LIVING TIPS

Pureed cottage cheese can stand in for mayonnaise in a recipe. You can even try it on your sandwich, if you're up for an adventure. Cottage cheese has fewer calories, less fat and more protein than mayo.

Sew through a piece of fine sandpaper to sharpen a needle. You can also use it to sharpen scissors.

Butter wrappers are terrific pan greasers. Save your wrappers in a plastic baggie in the freezer and they will always be on hand, ready to use almost as soon as they come out of the freezer.

Make your own reusable fabric softener. Fill a spray bottle with fabric softener and use an old washcloth as your fabric softener sheet. Use by dampening the washcloth with fabric softener and adding it to the clothes in the dryer. Its reusable indefinitely. If it feels too gummed up, just toss it in the next load of your laundry.

Place a piece of clear tape over the labels of prescriptions as soon as you get them and verify all information. This will protect the dosing and medication name if the label gets wet or just handled too much.

If you need to tighten up the screw on a drawer pull or knob, paint it with clear nail polish first. Quickly insert it back in and screw tightly. It will hold in the wood better.

Copy and disperse historical photos, documents and records so that if something happens to the originals, at least someone will have copies.

CORN BREAD PUDDING

1 (17 oz.) can whole kernel corn

1 (17 oz.) can cream style corn

1 stick butter, melted and cooled

1 (8 oz.) pkg. sour cream

2 eggs, beaten

1 pkg. Jiffy corn muffin mix

Beat eggs. Add melted, cooled butter, add sour cream, corn, and Jiffy mix. Put into 2 1/2 quart casserole.

Bake about 1 hour at 350 degrees.

LOW - CAL SUGAR FREE PUMPKIN PUDDING

1 lg. pkg. sugar-free vanilla pudding, prepared Sweetener to taste (usually 6 pkgs.)

2 c. pumpkin

3/4 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

Combine and let chill overnight.

THE BEST PUMPKIN PUDDING

1 cup pumpkin (canned) 2/3 milk

1 package vanilla instant pudding

- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 2 cups Cool Whip

graham crackers (to crumble on top)

Combine pumpkin, milk, vanilla, and instant

pudding together in a bowl.

Add the nutmeg, cinnamon, and fold in the Cool Whip. Sprinkle the crumbled graham crackers on top. Serves 6.

Thank you Harvey and Ann for hosting the October Meeting. The Goldbergs always put on a great party, sorry for those who missed it.



Flagstaff 2010




