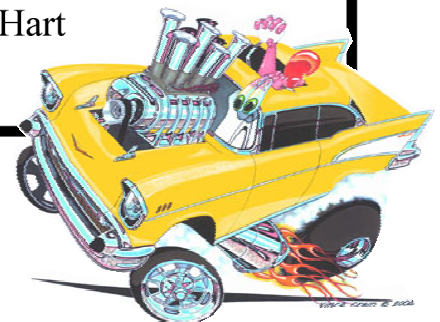
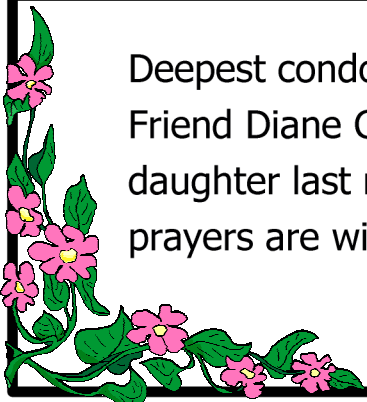

My traction is not as graceful as it once was. I slip and slide and skid and bump into things even in the best of weather.

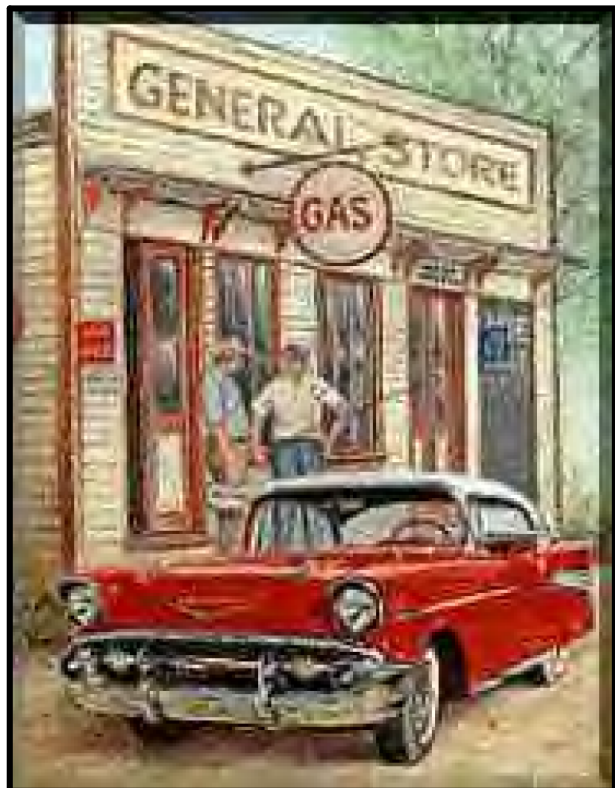
My whitewalls are stained with varicose veins.
