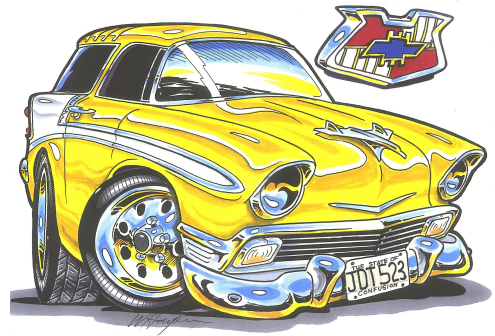

The Kitchen Scoop on Cinnamon Apple Pie Bake

Friends have always enjoyed sharing recipes with one another. My recipe box is filled with handwritten 3x5 cards filled out by friends listing ingredients and preparation instructions for all sorts of tasty baked goods, casseroles and other treats I've enjoyed from their kitchens over the years. Now we all receive recipes on Facebook from friends we have never met. The minor downfall, we also haven't tasted them and try them just based on the results as we imagine they'll be.

The recipe for Apple Pie Bake has been circling the internet for a few weeks now. It seemed like it was a great dessert solution when you really didn't have time to bake. However, reading it my opinion was the original recipe could use some help. It called for what I felt were too few apples, a lack of balance with all the cinnamon in the "crust," and that it could benefit from the addition of just a little nutmeg. Plus, chopped nuts sounded like a good addition, so I tweaked the basic recipe. Here's hoping you enjoy the end result. It was well received when I made it for friends and refrigerated leftovers are even more flavorful.

Cinnamon Roll-Apple Pie Bake

Preheat oven to 375 degrees

2 tubes Refrigerated Cinnamon Rolls cut into 9ths, icing reserved

4 Eggs

1/2 Cup Milk

3 teaspoons Cinnamon, divided use

1 teaspoon Vanilla

2 Tablespoons Butter

4 Granny Smith Apples cored and chopped

1/2 Cup Chopped Walnuts (optional)

1 Cup Brown Sugar

Pinch of Nutmeg

Vanilla Bean Ice Cream or Whipped Cream for serving (optional)



Cut each roll twice in each direction yielding nine small pieces from each roll.

Place pieces in an 8x8 or 9x9 baking pan lightly coated with baking spray.

In a small bowl mix eggs, milk, 2 teaspoons of cinnamon and vanilla. Set aside.

Melt butter in a small skillet, add chopped apples and saute over medium heat. Add brown sugar, remaining teaspoon of cinnamon, pinch of nutmeg and chopped nuts, if using. Cook until bubbly, and slightly thickened stirring constantly.

Pour egg-milk mixture over rolls. Top with apples. Drizzle reserved frosting over all and bake for 25-30 minutes in 375 degree preheated oven.

Serve warm. We like it with a scoop of good vanilla bean ice cream on top. I'm sure whipped cream would be yummy, too.

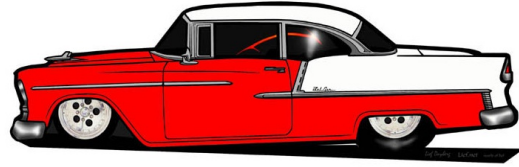


Claudia's Corner

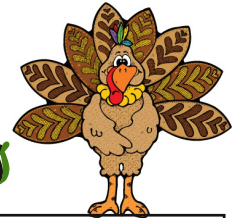



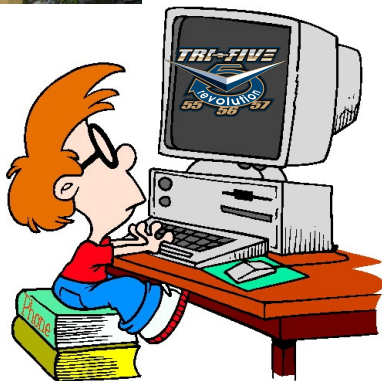
