Our first 57 Nomad was pretty rough when we bought it and we got a tremendous amount of pleasure restoring it, so as we look back over our loss, we now focus on the pleasure we got from restoring it, the fun we had driving it, and not the pain of the loss.

With all that said this article is about our new beginning in the classic car realm. After the fire we were not even thinking about classic cars, we were both in shock, we were going through all of the stages people experience when subjected to this kind of tragedy; denial, anger, fear, etc. when Mike Harvey sent me an email about a Nomad he found on eBay, it was all black and looked really nice. In our state of shock we acted before we thought and we bought the car. Mike was kind enough to use his brand new Chevy truck for the trip to Vegas to pick up my purchase. Hind sight being what it is we were very foolish to buy this car for what we paid for it. We acted with our hearts not our minds.







So we bought the Nomad and shortly after realized it needed some rework and fortunately about the same time my baby sister remarried to a terrific guy who owned an auto glass and upholstery business in Mariposa, CA just outside of Yosemite. We contacted George (Mariposa Auto Trim and Glass) my sister's new husband and asked if he would be willing to take on our project, he graciously agreed. However before we embarked on the journey north we needed to do a few upgragrade ourself. We bought a new BeCool radiator and fans, and new side motor mounts for the car. Sam knew this job would take some assistance so Bob Bishop offered to help.



With Bob's superb assistance the new radiator was installed along with new billet pulleys, new wiring, new air cleaner, new side motor mounts, etc. Bob taught Sam how to properly install wiring and wire ties, precisely spaced wire ties!!!





We rented a trailer and hauled the Nomad to Mariposa shortly thereafter behind our new Chevy diesel truck. Upon arrival at George's shop he did a very thorough inspection of the car and recommended we send it over to Mariposa Auto Restorations for the mechanical work. This included installation of stainless steel transmission replacing the resonating Flowmaster mufflers, new Dakota Digital Dash, fixing leaky brake lines, repairing the AC system, relocation of the battery, installation of a new 700R4 overdrive transmission, fixing the transmission linkage, etc, etc, etc. We want to thank Jim Wilson at Mariposa Restorations for his great work on our car.





Once Jim finished his work our car was taken back to Mariposa Auto Trim and Glass for George to do his work. George immediately pulled all the glass and all of the trim and shipped the trim off for polishing or replating. Next George cut out the old rusted floor and welded in a new one, he fixed all other areas damaged from rust and repainted or powder coated all exposed surfaces. He has since installed sound deadening materials.





- 1 Pkg. Yellow Cake Mix
- 1 Pkg. Vanilla Instant Pudding
- 4 Eggs


3/4 Cup Oil (vegetable, canola, olive -whatever you have on hand!) 3/4 Cup Cream Sherry Wine

1 Teaspoon Nutmeg

Mix all ingredients with mixer for 8 minutes. Pour into greased bundt pan or angel food pan. Bake at 325 for 55-60 minutes. Let cool for 10 minutes and then invert onto serving plate. Sprinkle with powdered sugar, cut and ENJOY!!!






