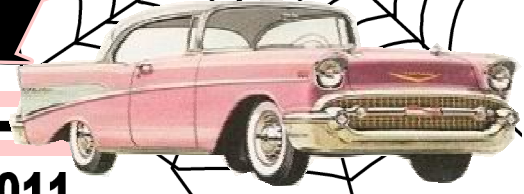

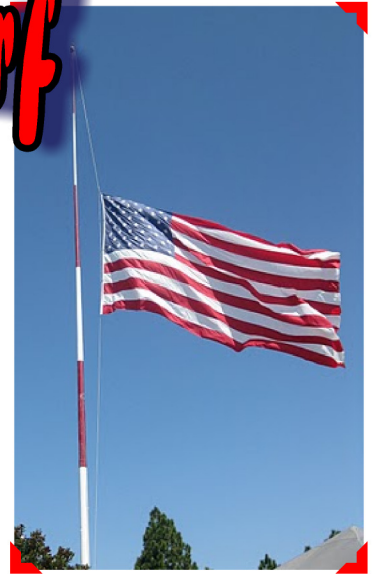

Drive-In Date Night

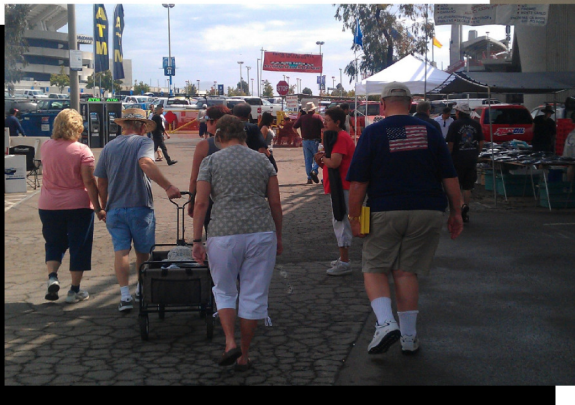

THE "PTSNBM" Is Exhausted (and so am I)



It's been a few months since there has been a project update in the newsletter. Progress has been slow but constant. Primary attention has been on the dash. All the components have been installed and all the wiring is complete and everything appears to be working correctly. More recently I've been working in the area of the engine. One of the things I was dreading doing was cutting holes in the inner fender panels for the fenderwell headers. The hard part was to figure where the headers would exit with the smallest hole possible. The problem being the exit area was on a compound curve. I solved the problem by making a cardboard target just large enough for the header tubes to fit. I then put masking tape on the inner fender panel in the area the header was expected to exit. I then marked the inner fender panel using the cardboard target as a template.





I cut out the marked area on the fender panel. This allowed me to trial fit the header to see where additional trimming was necessary and to sneak up on the perfect fit. With the fender panels finally cut, the radiator core support was installed followed by the radiator and shroud. Once the headers are back from being ceramic coated they will be permanently installed and an exhaust system fabricated. Then finally the engine can be started and run to properly break in the cam. Being on the road will not be far behind. I can hardly wait. Come hell or high water this car is going to the Super Chevy Show at the end of this month.

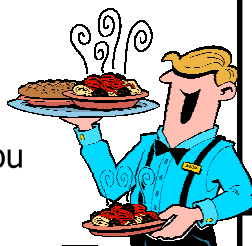

Claudia's Corner

I think I'll just submit a few recipes that I collected this summer. I've tried them and they were terrific. These 3 are light and low in calories.

SOUTHWESTERN SLAW

- 1 PKG (16 OZ) COLESLAW MIX
- ½ CUP THINLY SLICED OR FINELY CHOPPED RED ONION
- ½ CUP RANCH SALAD DRESSING
- 1 TSP. GROUND CUMIN
- 1 RIPE AVOCADO, PEELED AND CUBED (ABOUT 1 CUP)
- Creole seasoning or salt
- Black pepper
- 2 Tbsp. chopped fresh cilantro

Place coleslaw mix and onion in a serving bowl and stir to combine. Stir cumin into the salad dressing. Pour the dressing over the slaw, tossing to coat it well. Fold in the avocado cubes and season with Creole seasoning and pepper to taste. Wipe the rim of the bowl clean with a paper towel and sprinkle cilantro on top of the slaw. Serve the slaw at once or cover the bowl with plastic wrap and refrigerate up to 24 hours.

Makes 6 – 8 servings. 168 calories, 9 grams carbs per serving

BLACK BEAN & CORN SALSA



- 1 can black beans - drained & rinsed
- 2 cans corn - drained
- 2-3 tomatoes - diced
- ½ bunch cilantro - chopped
- ½ purple onion - diced
- 3 jalapeno's - seeded & diced
- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- Juice from 1 lime
- Sea salt to taste

Serve with chips or a favorite cracker or use as a salad topping.

ORANGE - ANGEL FOOD CAKE

- 1 pkg. Angel Food Cake Mix
- ¾ cup frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
- 1 container frozen light whipped topping, thawed
- ½ cup plain lowfat yogurt

Prepare Angel Food cake as directed on package, substituting 1/3 cup of thawed orange juice concentrate in a 2 cup measure and add enough water to the mixture to equal the amount of water called for in package directions. Continue to prepare cake as directed, baking the batter in a 10-inch ungreased tube pan. Immediately invert tube pan, leaving in pan. Cool completely.

Loosen sides of cake from pan; remove cake to plate. To make the topping: in a medium bowl, gently stir together the thawed topping and yogurt. Fold in remaining orange juice concentrate. Spread topping mixture over top and sides of cake. Refrigerate.

NOTE: if you do not have room to refrigerate cake, use a glaze of 1 cup confectioners sugar, 1 Tbsp. butter or margarine and 1 - 2 Tbsp. orange juice (not concentrate) combined until thin enough to drizzle over cake.

Per serving: Approximately 173 cal, 3 g protein, 3 g fat, 16% cal from fat, 1 mg cholesterol and 200 mg sodium

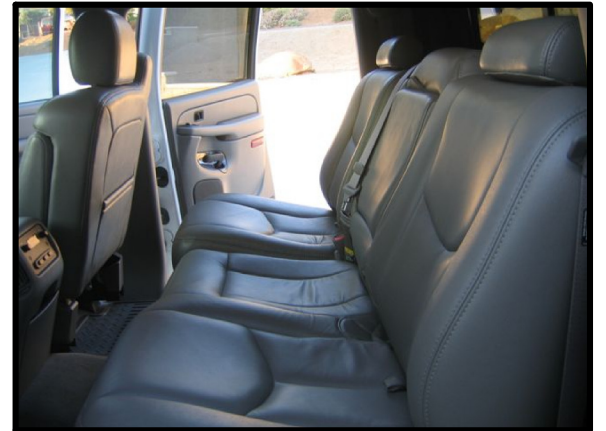
