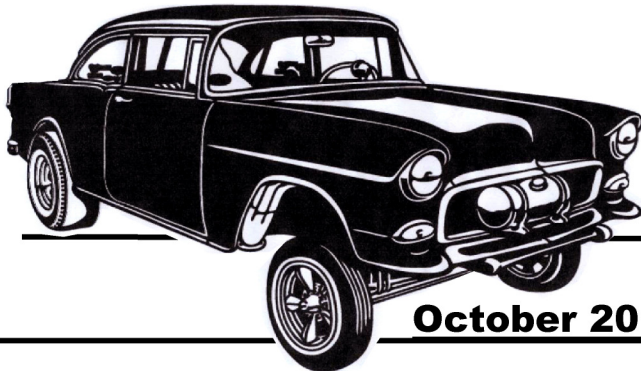

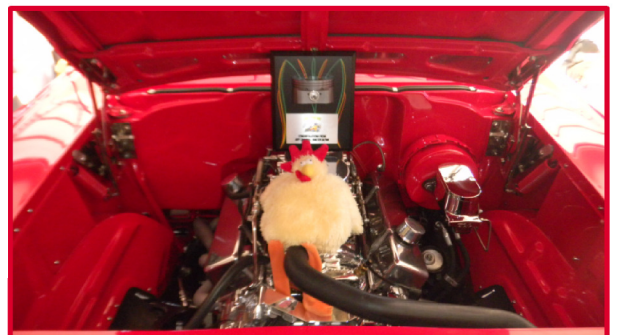

The Kitchen Scoop on Pumpkins

October is definitely the month when pumpkins, the classic symbol of harvest and Halloween, have their day. Go for a country drive and you may see the orange fruit on withering vines in fields awaiting harvest. Grocery stores and farmers' markets display many different varieties including thick rind pumpkins bred for stability to be carved into jack-o-lanterns, smaller pie pumpkins, and exotic looking Cinderella pumpkins. Magazines feature recipes for pumpkin cookies, cakes and soups. Making them even more versatile, pumpkins can be used in lieu of squash as an ingredient in just about any recipe. Kept out of the sun, they'll keep for months. Display them uncut as long as you choose, then enjoy something homemade and delicious to eat.

A Face Book posting for pumpkin muffins made with only two ingredients -- yellow cake mix and a can of pumpkin -- caught my attention. I do realize muffins from scratch are easy and quick enough to make, but I felt compelled to give these a try. Not willing to leave well enough alone, I did add a teaspoon of cinnamon, one-half of ginger and one-quarter of cloves to the batter, just as I would if making a pumpkin pie and before baking topped each muffin with a mixture of chopped walnuts, brown sugar, butter, flour and cinnamon. The results, delicious.

Easy Pumpkin Muffins

One box classic yellow cake mix
One can solid pumpkin (small can, single pie size)

Mix ingredients well. Drop batter into lined muffin cups.
Bake at 350-degrees for 20-25 minutes.

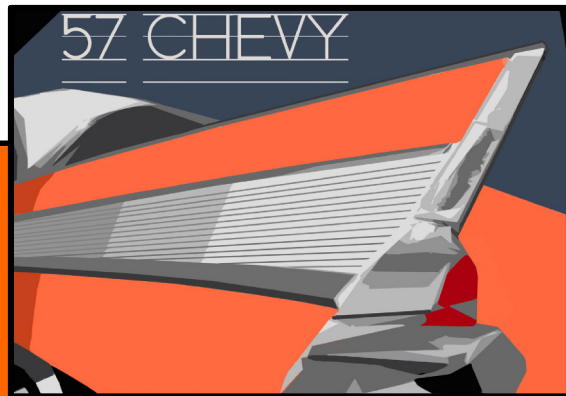

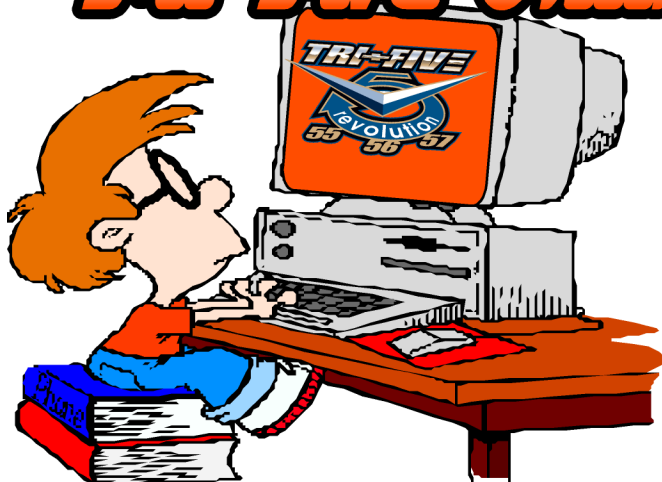
